#### "I Tasted You and Now I Hunger for You." (St Augustine)

In this Sunday's Gospel, we encounter Jesus responding to the hungry crowd, not with irritation or dismissal, but with extraordinary generosity. Though the disciples see only scarcity—five loaves and two fish—Jesus sees an opportunity to give. He blesses, breaks, and distributes, feeding thousands with abundance left over. His desire is always to nourish, to satisfy, to give.

This miracle prefigures the deeper gift He would later give at the Last Supper: Himself. As we hear in this coming Sunday's second reading, St. Paul says that Jesus took bread, gave thanks, broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you." Then He took the cup and said, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood." What began as a meal on a hillside finds fulfillment in the Eucharist—where Jesus gives not just bread, but His very Self as food.

In our first reading from the Book of Genesis, we glimpse another foreshadowing in Melchizedek, the priest-king who offers bread and wine and blesses Abraham. From the earliest pages of Scripture, God has been preparing to give us a priest and a king who would offer bread and wine that becomes life itself.

The Eucharist is the gift of all gifts. In it, Jesus offers His Body and Blood—not symbolically, but truly—because He knows only He can satisfy the deepest hunger of our hearts. His generosity is not limited to a meal in Galilee or a moment in Jerusalem. It continues at every Mass. Every time we receive the Eucharist, we are fed by the One who holds nothing back.

May we never take for granted this astounding gift. And may we, in receiving Jesus, become like Him—generous, self-giving, and ready to feed a hungry world.

#### **Invitation from Archbishop Mark Coleridge**

Dear brothers and sisters,

I write to you and your community to join in the Corpus Christi procession which will begin at the Cathedral of St Stephen on Sunday the 22nd of June 2025, commencing at 2:00 PM. The procession with the Blessed Sacrament will go from the Cathedral through the city streets, and then conclude with Benediction upon returning to the Cathedral.

Processions are an important part of Catholic life in many places around the world they have little pilgrimages which remind us that our life of discipleship it's a pilgrimage into God. The Corpus Christi procession has special meaning this Jubilee Year 2025 as we walked together as Pilgrims of Hope, with the Risen Lord as our companion on the way.

Groups are welcome to process under banners of their patronal or parish saints, as is often done in processions such as this.

On the weekend of the procession this year, there will be a pictorial display of Eucharistic miracles around the world in the Hanley room in the Francis Rush Centre. You are invited to view the display. This year there will also be a night vigil of Exposition and Adoration, commencing after the cathedrals 6:00 PM mass on Saturday evening 21 June and concluding before the Sunday 8:00 AM Mass on the day of the Procession. The feature will take place in Saint Stephens Chapel.

#### **Getting to Know God through Scripture**

In the Book of Genesis, we hear these very significant words: "So God created humankind in His own image, in the image of God He created them; male and female He created them." (Genesis 1:27). This foundational truth reminds us that to know God is, in a real way, to know ourselves—who we are and who we are called to be.

Sacred Scripture is the greatest source we have for deepening our understanding of God. While not the only way we come to know God, Scripture offers us the clearest window into God's heart, God's promises, and God's call in our lives.

To help us journey deeper into this understanding, our Prayer Network is offering a ten-week Scripture study focused on the Book of the Prophet Isaiah. Isaiah is often called the "Fifth Gospel" because of its profound prophecies about the coming of the Messiah and
