Feast of Saints Peter and Paul: Lives Poured Out in Love and Witness

As we celebrate the Feast of Saints Peter and Paul, the readings for today speak powerfully of two men who poured out their lives in service to God and to others. Though very different in background and personality, St Peter and St Paul shared one mission: to proclaim the Gospel of Christ and lead others into the freedom of God's love.

In this coming Sunday's first reading, *Acts 12:1–11*, we see Peter imprisoned for preaching Christ, rescued miraculously by an angel. His life is constantly at risk, yet he continues to lead and guide the early Church. In this coming Sunday's Gospel, *Matthew 16:13–19*, Jesus calls Peter the "rock" upon which He will build His Church. Despite his failures, Peter's deep love for Christ makes him the foundation of a new community grounded in mercy, truth, and faith. In our second reading for this Sunday, St Paul is writing from prison, nearing the end of his life. "I am already being poured out as a libation," he says, knowing his death is near. Yet he is not defeated. St Paul trusts that "the Lord will rescue me from every evil attack and bring me safely to his heavenly kingdom." His life, too, is poured out for the Gospel, especially in his mission to the Gentiles.

Both apostles died as martyrs under the emperor Nero, bearing witness to the love of Christ in the face of cruelty and death. Their courage challenges us today: to live not for ourselves, but for God and for others. In a world where self-centredness damages relationships and isolates hearts, St Peter and St Paul show us another way.

They remind us that true freedom comes not in grasping for control, recognition, or empty pleasure—but in giving, forgiving, and loving sacrificially. This kind of life heals our families and communities, restoring the relationships so often fractured by selfishness and pride.

St Peter, the steadfast rock, and St Paul, the tireless missionary, call us to be courageous in faith and generous in love. May we follow their example, offering our lives in the same spirit of service, for the glory of God and the good of those around us.

Peter's Pence Appeal

Saints Peter and Paul, pray for us.

Catholics around Australia are being encouraged to support the Peter's Pence appeal on the feast of St Peter and St Paul, Sunday June 29.

Donations to the appeal, which goes back to medieval times, support Pope Leo's mission, from the proclamation of the Gospel to the promotion of integral human development, education, and peace.

Peter's Pence also aims to support a range of charities that bring aid and comfort to the poor, children, families, the elderly, the marginalized, victims of war and natural disasters, refugees, and migrants.

The Vatican's Secretariat for the Economy, which publicly reports on donations, describes Peter's Pence as 'the financial support offered by the faithful to the Holy Father as a sign of their shared concern with the Successor of Peter in addressing the necessities of the Universal Church and to help those most in need'.

Please be prepared for the Peter's Pence collection this coming Sunday. We will be having a retiring collection at the end of each of our Masses.

THE APPOINTMENT TO BRISBANE—OF BISHOP SHANE MACKINLAY

For many reasons I welcome the appointment of Bishop Shane Mackinlay as my successor in Brisbane where he will be a distinguished addition to the line of Archbishops.

Bishop Shane has shown himself an unusually gifted man in his years as priest in Ballarat and Melbourne and as bishop in Bendigo and beyond.

He has a fine mind, and he will bring intellectual firepower to his ministry as Archbishop and to public debate in Queensland and Australia. He will be able to dialogue intelligently with a culture which at many points is distant from Christian understandings.

He is also an experienced pastor who knows how to listen and who through his time as Master of Catholic Theological College in Melbourne remained a Parish Priest near Ballarat. As bishop, he has been able both to shepherd the Diocese of Sandhurst and to accept responsibility on the global stage.

He deals well with both the big picture and the nuts and bolts, which is why he is a capable administrator. That will serve him well in a diocese as large and as complex as Brisbane.

Temperamentally, he is not easily flustered, having about him a poise that makes him a good driver in heavy traffic. That too will serve him well as Archbishop at a time when the traffic can be heavy.

At 60 he is also of the right age and maturity to assume greater responsibility not only in Brisbane and Queensland but nationally and internationally.

As we look to the installation on 11 September 2025, I have no doubt Bishop Shane will bring these gifts and fresh energies to the Archdiocese of Brisbane, where he will be creative in pursuing the path of synodality into the future God is preparing. I am grateful to Pope Leo for this wise choice of a new Archbishop, and I commend Bishop Shane to you and your prayers as he prepares for this new mission.

Loving Like God in the Here and Now

Our Justice and Peace Team warmly invites all parishioners and friends to take part in a meaningful and enriching program developed by the Archdiocese of Brisbane, designed to help us learn to love others as God loves us.

This five-week series will begin on Sunday, June 15, following our Sunday Masses, and will explore how we can walk alongside one another—especially our sisters and brothers who are doing it tough—with hearts shaped by Love, Encounter, Accompaniment, Inclusion, and Dialogue (see advertisement in this newsletter).

Each session offers a chance to reflect deeply, share experiences, and grow together in our calling to be Christ's hands and heart in the world.

Let us come together as a community to discover what it means to love more like God, and to be a Church that truly listens, includes, and walks in compassion with others.

Getting to Know God through Scripture

In the Book of Genesis, we hear these very significant words: "So God created humankind in His own image, in the image of God He created them; male and female He created them." (Genesis 1:27). This foundational truth reminds us that to know God is, in a real way, to know ourselves—who we are and who we are called to be.

To help us journey deeper into this understanding, our Prayer Network is offering a ten-week Scripture study focused on the Book of the Prophet Isaiah. Isaiah is often called the "Fifth Gospel" because of its profound prophecies about the coming of the Messiah and its rich theological insights.

We do have very limited access to printing a small amount of the Newsletter most weeks, however our preferred method to share information is via email.




Baptism at St Benedict's.


