National Vocations Week August 3 to 10 God Calls Us to Live Meaningful Lives

Rudyard Kipling gave an address to the graduating medical class of McGill University in which he said: "You'll go out from here, and very likely you'll make a lot of money. One day you'll meet someone for whom that means very little. Then you will know how poor you are." (Leadership, Fall 1995, p. 21.)

Our heart has an infinite capacity to be loved, and the only One who can fill it is God. If we try to satisfy our yearning to be loved with anything else, then we will always left empty. Not only that, it is only the infinite love of God who enables us to love in life-giving ways, and thus live life abundantly.

The fool in the parable, which we hear told by Jesus in this coming Sunday's Gospel, tries to fill his heart with increased material wealth. Even when he had enough material wealth for a very comfortable life, he still wants more. Leaving him unfilled right up until he dies.

The fool was living a selfish, self-centred, and self-absorbed life, which resulted in living a meaningless life. He wasted his life! He was living a life according to his will, which resulted in emptiness and meaninglessness. This, of course, is **not** the life Jesus wants us to live.

Jesus tells us in John's Gospel that He came and lived among us, so that "we can live life, and live it to the full" (John 10:10). Giving us the opportunity to live a meaningful fulfilling life. Where we join Jesus in pouring ourselves out for others. Living a selfless life, where, in relationship with Jesus, we are always seeking the best for others. If we live this life, experiencing the infinite love of Jesus as much as possible, and allowing this selfless, self-giving love of Jesus to flow through us and into our relationships with each other, then, and it is only then, that we will be truly rich.

Answering God's Call with Joy!

Each of us is created by God with a unique purpose and discovering that purpose brings deep joy and peace. Vocations are God's invitation to live our lives loving and serving others in a particular way, and the Church celebrates four beautiful paths: priesthood, religious life, marriage, and the single life.

The call to the priesthood is a powerful way to give One's life completely to Jesus and His Church. Priests bring the sacraments to the faithful, preach the Gospel, and shepherd God's people with compassion. As Pope Francis, and now Pope Leo XIV said, "it is imperative that priests be joyful witnesses of life in Christ, in the hope to inspire countless others to grow in faith and holiness."

Religious life, whether as a sister, brother, or monk, is a radical gift of self to God. Through prayer, community, and service, religious men and women reflect the love of Christ in a world hungry for hope. Their joy is contagious, rooted in a deep relationship with Jesus.

Marriage is a sacred vocation where spouses become a living sign of God's faithful love - in building strong families, raising faith-filled children, and loving one another with generosity. In the Catholic Church, marriage is raised to the dignity of a Sacrament, where married couples reflect Jesus' love for His Church, and they live out this perfect love for each other in communion with Jesus.

Some are called to the single life, choosing to serve God and others with freedom and dedication. Whether temporarily or permanently, the single life is a very meaningful and grace-filled path where one can focus on building the Kingdom in unique and powerful ways. No matter the vocation, we are all called to love—fully, freely, and joyfully. It is only God who

enables us to love in this way. So, as we listen to God's call for us, let us trust that God is with us and will lead us to living life in abundance, being great witnesses to others.

Let us pray for one another to always listen and respond to God's call with courage and a generous heart, always saying, "Here I am, Lord. I come to do your will" (Psalm 40:8).

Our Mission - Building a Place of Worship

Pope Paul VI stated that, "The Church exists to evangelise" (Evangelii Nuntiandi). That is, each one of us who is baptised—we exist to evangelise. That is our mission, our purpose: to spread the Good News of Jesus to others.

Subsequent Popes—St John Paul II, Benedict XVI, Francis, and now our Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV—have all echoed that same truth. They've called us, again and again, to take up this mission. And how do we do that? How do we become evangelisers in our everyday lives?

We start by taking to heart the advice of our patron, St Benedict, who urges us to "listen with the ear of the heart." That means to truly love listening to Jesus—to desire his Word, to let it shape our thoughts, our decisions, and our way of life.

Here in our own parish of St Benedict's, how can we answer that call? How can we spread the Good News, right here, right now?

One tangible way is through contributing to the building of our new church. This is not just about bricks and mortar. It's about mission. Contributing to the building of our church is a way to spread the Gospel in a real, visible, lasting way. It will be a place where generations will come to hear God's Word, to receive the Sacraments, to be spiritually fed, and build


* Maintain good hand hygiene, by using the sanitizer provided. Thank you for your commitment, it is truly appreciated.



Justice Peace & Ecology Noticeboard.

The Holy Spirit blessing the JP&E Group. At the conclusion of the Signs of Our Times (SOOT) workshops many attendees were filled with renewed insights into their relationship with Jesus. In turn, this spilled into renewed examination of how we (JP&E) can relate with fellow SBCP parishioners, our wider community, and our fragile environment. We've felt a need to create better communication within our parish. How do we better engage and encourage participation? We know we need improvement with promotion, and now we are blessed with support from an IT expert, who will not only look at JP&E issues but also give ideas on how to better use technology. We questioned how we can create high interest for our other initiatives by our parishioners Last Saturday, we received the "Archdiocese of Brisbane Synod 24 Action Plans". This document notes the recent Plenary Councils and Synods into 8 decrees and 50 subsidiary, priotorised, action plans.

It now gives us faith that we are moving in the right direction. We can see agreement between our present activities and some of the action plans:

- •Strengthening partnerships between parishes, schools, communities and agencies,
- Developing and implementing a strategic approach to mission in the digital environment,
- Developing an integral ecology formation strategy,
- •Including a framework for measuring and reporting emission reductions in Laudato Si Action Plans
- Developing a roadmap for a mission-focused church
