St Benedict of Norcia – A Life That Transformed the World Through Jesus

Born around 480 AD in Norcia, Italy, St Benedict came into a world in turmoil. The Western Roman Empire had collapsed, and society was crumbling into moral and political chaos. St Benedict, growing up in the midst of this disorder, became disillusioned with the empty pursuits and moral decay of his peers in Rome, for he was a young man who had a deep faith in Jesus Christ.

Frustrated with the increasing selfish pursuits of his peers, St. Benedict did a runner, withdrawing from the noise and corruption of the world. He retreated to a cave in Subiaco, where he lived in solitude and prayer. Like the Good Samaritan in this coming Sunday's Gospel, who was moved with deep compassion on seeing his wounded neighbour, St Benedict allowed Jesus' love to transform his heart. His time in the cave was not an escape, but it was a time to strengthen his relationship with God. There, St Benedict got to know and love Jesus more dearly, placing Him more and more at the centre of his life.

From this deep and beautiful relationship with Jesus, St Benedict emerged not to judge the world, but to heal it. He began forming communities rooted in prayer, work, and mutual care—what we now know as Benedictine monasteries. These became places of refuge, learning, and love. Through the **Rule of St Benedict**, he called men and women to live in humility, obedience, and service, turning away from self-gratification to live for God and others.

In a society bent on selfishness and destruction, St Benedict's vision brought transformation. As St Paul says in this coming Sunday's second reading, Jesus came to "reconcile all things to himself... making peace by the blood of his cross" (Colossians 1:20). St Benedict became an agent of this reconciliation, shaping communities where self-absorption gave way to selfless love—where people no longer passed by on the other side, but stopped, like the Samaritan, to care for their wounded neighbours.

St Benedict's life so profoundly shaped Christian Europe that he became the **Patron Saint of Europe**. In following Jesus, Benedict led not only monks, but entire societies back to a life in relationship with Jesus—one where Jesus lives in our hearts and minds, renewing us, and through us, the world.

May we, like St Benedict, become people who sacrifice our selfish desires for the good of others, especially those harmed by indifference—and in doing so, may Jesus continue to transform our world through us.

We do have very limited access to printing a small amount of the Newsletter most weeks, however our preferred method to share information is via email.




Baptism at St Benedict's.

Prayer requests are always welcomed and can be made in three ways to the Prayer Team.


- 1. Written into the Prayer Request Book located on the timber stand in the Mass Centre entrance.
