#### Jesus is the Source of our Love

The Sunday Gospels from Luke at the moment are set in the context of Jesus travelling with His disciples to Jerusalem (the Cross). On this journey, Jesus gives His disciples lessons in discipleship. The Gospel of the "Good Samaritan" (last Sunday) and of Jesus' encounter with Mary and Martha (this coming Sunday) are very closely linked.

In both Gospels, Jesus makes the very clear point that discipleship is both connecting with Jesus and action, but action must flow from encountering Jesus. The Samaritan's compassion isn't just humanitarian—it echoes the heart of Jesus. And Mary's stillness isn't laziness—it's love.

We cannot pour out what we haven't received. We cannot truly serve Jesus in the poor, the lonely, the wounded, if we are not first nourished by sitting at His feet.

So, these Sundays ask us:

- \* Are we trying to serve Jesus without being with Him?
- \* Are we exhausted in ministry because we've forgotten to return to the Source?

To serve Jesus effectively, we must first connect with Jesus personally. Prayer is not a luxury or an escape; it is the wellspring of all mission. In our busy world, Mary's example might seem impractical, but Jesus says it is essential.

May we find time this week not just to walk the road of the Good Samaritan, but to first sit in the stillness of Mary. Who is loving God with all her heart, with all her soul, with all her strength, and with all her mind. Only then will our hands and feet carry not just effort, but the very love of Jesus into the lives of others, especially those who are doing it tough.

#### Our Mission - Building a Place of Worship

Pope Paul VI stated that, "The Church exists to evangelise" (Evangelii Nuntiandi). That is, each one of us who is baptised—we exist to evangelise. That is our mission, our purpose: to spread the Good News of Jesus to others.

Subsequent Popes—St John Paul II, Benedict XVI, Francis, and now our Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV—have all echoed that same truth. They've called us, again and again, to take up this mission. And how do we do that? How do we become evangelisers in our everyday lives?

We start by taking to heart the advice of our patron, St Benedict, who urges us to "listen with the ear of the heart." That means to truly love listening to Jesus—to desire his Word, to let it shape our thoughts, our decisions, and our way of life.

Here in our own parish of St Benedict's, how can we answer that call? How can we spread the Good News, right here, right now?

One tangible way is through contributing to the building of our new church. This is not just about bricks and mortar. It's about mission. Contributing to the building of our church is a way to spread the Gospel in a real, visible, lasting way. It will be a place where generations will come to hear God's Word, to receive the Sacraments, to be spiritually fed, and build communities of faith. It will be a launchpad for missionary disciples—you and me, and those who will come after us—equipped to go out into the world and bring the love of Jesus to

By contributing to the building of our church, we are answering the call to be people who love God completely, and therefore love our neighbour generously.

The world desperately needs people who live this way. People who listen to Jesus with the ear of the heart. People who love with the heart of Jesus.

It is only when we love like Jesus that the mission of the Church, the reason for our very existence, will be truly fulfilled.

We do have very limited access to printing a small amount of the Newsletter most weeks, however our preferred method to share information is via email.




#### Baptism at St Benedict's.


