Our Call to be Humble

This coming Sunday's readings invite us into one of the most foundational and transformative Christian virtues: humility. In a world often driven by recognition, status, and self-promotion, God calls us to a different path, that is, the path of humility.

In the first reading from the Book of Ecclesiasticus we hear God's profound wisdom:

"My child, conduct your affairs with humility, and you will be loved more than a giver of gifts. Humble yourself the more, the greater you are, and you will find favour with God." (Eccles 3:17-18. 20).

Humility is not self-deprecation or denying our gifts. True humility is recognizing that all we have—our talents, resources, and our very lives—are gifts from God, entrusted to us not for our own glory, but for the good of others.

Our patron saint, St Benedict of Nursia, in his Rule, describes humility as the foundation of the spiritual life: "The first step of humility is that a person keeps God before their eyes and never forgets it." (Rule of St Benedict, Chapter 7: On Humility).

Humility begins with awe, acknowledging that God is the source of everything. It reorients our hearts away from pride and toward gratitude, reverence, and service.

In the Gospel of Luke, Jesus challenges the status-seeking of the Pharisees at a dinner and offers this kingdom truth: "For all who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted." (Luke 14:11).

Jesus goes even further to illustrate humility in action: "But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind." (Luke 14:13).

The invitation is clear: we are not called to serve only those who can return the favour or increase our reputation, but to give generously to those who cannot repay us, those on the margins. This is what discipleship looks like: humble service that mirrors the love of Christ.

St Augustine said: "It was pride that changed angels into devils; it is humility that makes men as angels." (St Augustine, Sermon 293, On the Nativity of St John the Baptist) If pride distances us from God, humility draws us near. When we serve others, especially the poor, the broken, and the forgotten, we are not just helping them; we are meeting Christ in them and allowing God to transform us.

To live humbly is to live with open hands and an open heart, offering what we have for the good of the world. It is to find joy not in recognition, but in communion with God and neighbour.

And the promise is beautiful: "You will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous." (Luke 14:14). But even more than that, in this life we will experience the deep peace and flourishing that comes from living in the love of God, walking humbly with our God, and glorifying Him with our lives.

So let us embrace Jesus this week and always, striving to grow in humility, to recognize our gifts as sacred, and to pour them out in love, especially for those who are doing it tough.






Congratulations and Welcome into the Catholic Family
