The Cross - The Greatest Sign of God's Love

This coming Sunday we celebrate the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. A feast that invites us to raise our eyes to look to Jesus lifted up in glory on the Cross. Here Jesus turns suffering into life, and defeat into victory.

In the first reading, from the Book of Numbers, the people of Israel are in the wilderness after being freed from slavery in Egypt. In this journey they complain to God and Moses about this arduous journey. During this journey they are confronted with poisonous snakes where many were bitten and died. The people begged Moses to pray for them, which he did, and God instructed Moses to make a bronze serpent and lift it up on a pole. Anyone who was bitten by a snake would look at the bronze serpent and live. This healing did not come from the bronze serpent itself, but from God's mercy and the people's act of faith relying on God's saving power. This story shows us that God can transform even pain and death into new life. Putting our faith in God helps us to find healing, hope, and endurance to continue our journey with peace.

In this coming Sunday's second reading from St Paul to the Philippians, we hear a beautiful hymn that presents the mystery of Jesus' humility and exaltation. It reveals to us that Jesus, thought equal with God, did not cling to His divinity, but instead he emptied Himself taking the form of a servant, and becoming obedient to the point of death on the Cross. This is what the feast of the Exaltation of the Cross is all about.

The Cross was once a symbol of shame and humiliation, but through Christ, has become the sign of victory and salvation. It is through this extremely humiliating death that Jesus reveals the depth of God's love. The Cross, rather than being the end, becomes the throne of glory. The cross leads to Resurrection, humiliation leads to exaltation, and death leads to eternal life. The Cross shows us that true goodness is found, not in power or pride, but in self-giving love and humility.

In this coming Sunday's Gospel, from John, Jesus explains to Nicodemus that just as Moses lifted up the bronze serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up (crucified) for the healing and salvation of all who look to Jesus in faith. We look to Jesus on the Cross to heal us from suffering from the poison of sin and death. The Cross, therefore, is a symbol of hope and healing. The Cross of Jesus is not just a symbol of suffering, but of God's love and victory. Jesus died for all people, even those who crucified Him. The self-giving love of Jesus, who died even for His enemies, empowers us to do the same. But, as Jesus makes abundantly clear in this coming Sunday's Gospel, we need to believe in Jesus and live our lives shaped by Jesus' love. In our relationship with Jesus, we are called to love sacrificially as God loves us. Drawing more and more people in the world to do the same, for our own good, and for the good of the whole world.

The Exaltation of the Holy Cross (Elizabeth Harrington)

At Masses on Sunday 14th September the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, previously called the Triumph of the Cross, will be celebrated in place of the 24th Sunday of Ordinary Time. A feast of the Lord, it celebrates the "lifting up" of the Son of Man on the cross into glory, and the paradox of the cross as a sign of humiliation and death, yet the source of victory and life. Egeria, the nun who made a pilgrimage to the Holy Lands between 383 and 384 and whose travel diary tells us so much about the liturgy in Jerusalem at the time, describes a great feast day celebrating "the day on which the cross of the Lord was discovered". The liturgy to which she refers took place on 14 September.

Devotion to the cross of Christ was in evidence long before this however. Constantine had built a church at Rome dedicated to the cross. According to tradition, Constantine's mother St Helena discovered the cross of Christ during a pilgrimage to Jerusalem. She brought a piece back to Rome and placed it in the new basilica.

"O God, who willed that your Only Begotten Son should undergo the Cross to save the human race, grant, we pray, that we, who have known his mystery on earth, may merit the grace of his redemption in heaven." (Collect).



St Benedict's Prayer Network - Prayer Requests


Prayer requests are always welcomed and can be made in three ways to the Prayer Team.
