#### Let's put Jesus at the Centre of our Lives

Many people baptised as Catholics don't seem to put Jesus at the centre of their lives. They seem to invest their time, talents, money, energy, thoughts, emotions, and enthusiasm to: family, work, study, keeping fit, looking after one's pet, social media, partying, household chores, watching television, eating, holidays, looking after the children/grandchildren, playing sport, commuting, and discipleship. All of these are important aspects of our lives, but there's something radically wrong with this arrangement where discipleship appears to be just one compartment in a very busy life, and something that can be easily discarded. In fact, time with Jesus in prayer can be one of the lesser priorities in one's life.

Jesus in this coming Sunday's Gospel says, "none of you can be my disciple unless you give up all your possessions' (Luke 14:33). This is another way of Jesus saying, "to be my disciple, you need to put me at the centre of your life."

The authentic disciple of Jesus puts Jesus is at the very center of one's life, everything else flows from this relationship with Jesus. Jesus, our Lord, is the one to whom we ascribe ultimate worth. This is why we prioritise our relationship with Jesus through structured prayer (Morning Prayer, Evening Prayer, Meditation, Mass, Prayer before Meals, Bible Study, the Rosary etc.) and non-structured prayer (remembering Jesus' presence and inviting Him into every aspect of our lives - whether that be at home, at work, on the sporting field, at the gym etc.)

As people of faith, we bring Jesus into every aspect of our lives, so our overall lives can be enriched by our relationship with Jesus, and that others can encounter the life and love of Jesus through us. For as Jesus tells us through this coming Sunday's Gospel, unless Jesus becomes the ultimate priority and centre of our lives, then we cannot be Jesus' disciples. On the flip side of this, if we do put Jesus at the very centre of our lives, then people will be drawn into the love, peace, and healing of God through us.


#### St Benedict's Prayer Network - Prayer Requests
