Dedication of the Lateran Basilica (Elizabeth Harrington)

For the second Sunday in a row, the liturgical colour for this coming Sunday is not the green of Ordinary Time. Last week it was violet for the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day). This week it is white/gold because the 32nd Sunday of Ordinary time, which would otherwise be celebrated today, has been 'trumped' by the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica. The latter has precedence because it is regarded as a feast of the Lord.

The Emperor Constantine, who had recently converted from paganism, lifted the ban on Christianity in the year 313. The emperor gave the palace of the Lateran to the Church. A basilica was built beside the palace and Pope Sylvester dedicated it to the Holy Saviour on November 9th 324.

The basilica is often referred to as 'St John Lateran' because the baptistery on the site was dedicated to John the Baptist and St John the Evangelist was also associated with the basilica. The palace of the Lateran served as the residence of the Pope continuously until 1304 when safety concerns forced Benedict XI to move to Avignon. Although the general offices of the Church were transferred to the Vatican in the mid-1400s, the Lateran basilica has always remained the Cathedral church of the Pope, the bishop of Rome and hence is the mother church for the whole world.

All are welcome. Whether you're remembering a recent loss or holding in your heart the memory of someone gone before, we hope you will join us in this beautiful and meaningful celebration of hope, remembrance, and prayer.

November – The Month We Pray for the Souls of Our Loved Ones

In the Catholic Church, the month of **November** is dedicated to **praying for the souls of the faithful departed**. Throughout the month, Catholics are encouraged to remember and pray for deceased loved ones, asking God to grant them eternal rest and peace. This tradition reflects our belief in the **communion of saints** and the power of prayer to assist souls on their journey to eternal life with God.

We have envelopes available at the Welcome Desk, as well as a Memorial Book, to put the names of our loved ones, who will be prayed for at each Mass.

We can pray for our loved ones in November at St Benedict's by:

Memorial Mass: All are invited to celebrate our Memorial Mass on All Souls Day, remembering the souls of our loved ones on **Saturday November 29 at 9am**.

Memorial Book and Candles: Please write the names of your loved ones, who are no longer with us, in our **Memorial Book**, so we can pray for them. Also, you are welcome to light a **candle** (battery operated) for your loved ones and place it on our stand.

Each Mass we celebrate during the month of November will be offered for our loved ones.

Mass Offerings: I will be celebrating Mass everyday throughout November and offering these Masses up for anyone who requests a Mass for their loved ones.

Becoming a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission

As I shared in my homily at all Masses last weekend, we have just witnessed a historic moment in the life of the Church. From 2021 to 2024, Pope Francis has led the global Church in the **Synod on Synodality**. This was the journey of prayer, listening, dialogue, and discernment that culminated in two sessions in Rome.

The logo of the Synod, shown above, beautifully captures the spirit of this process. It portrays a diverse group of people walking together - young and old, clergy and laity - all moving forward under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. It reminds us that **the Church is not a building or an institution alone, but the People of God, journeying together**.

At the heart of the Synod are three key words:

Communion: We belong to one another in Christ. We are united, not by uniformity, but by a shared faith and love that celebrates our diversity.

Participation: Every baptized person has a voice and a role in the Church. We are each called to actively engage, listen, and contribute to the life of our faith community.

Mission: We are sent into the world to be witnesses of Jesus' love, bringing hope, healing, and the Good News of Jesus to all.

May we be a Church where **no one is left out, and no one is left behind**—truly a synodal Church, walking together in the footsteps of Jesus, embraced by God.

* **Will our new church building help us build community, foster meaningful participation, and be equipped for mission in the world?**

* **Is it a place where all feel welcome, included, and spiritually nourished?**

* **Does it allow for listening, prayer, celebration, outreach, and hospitality — the marks of a living and Spirit-filled Church?**

The Synod has reminded us that **the Church is not only a building**, but when we do build, it must reflect our identity and calling as the **People of God on the journey together**.

I invite each of you to take part in this stage of the process. Your reflections, hopes, and insights are vital.

Let's ensure that our new church building is not only beautiful and functional — but that it truly serves our mission as a parish to be a community shaped by **Communion, Participation, and Mission**, guided by the Holy Spirit, and centered always on Christ.

We are once again grateful to have an opportunity to help with the fundraising towards our church building project! We are putting out the call for your help!

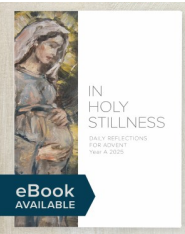

Eligibility to receive the Sacraments:-

Confirmation - children in Grade 3 and above having already received the Sacrament of Baptism are eligible. The Program takes place through out the months of July and August each year.

First Holy Communion (Eucharist) & Reconciliation - children in Grade 4 and above, having already received their Sacrament of Confirmation are eligible. The Program takes place through out the months of May and June each year.

of the parish. (Leases, Wages, Supplies)

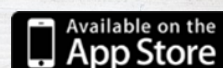
* **The Building (Church) Donation**, which supports our purchasing/
