My dear friends in St Benedict's Parish

We gathered at our Masses last weekend with great sadness as we grieve the loss of our beautiful sister Mary Butler. We offered our Masses up for Mary, asking God to now take her into His loving eternal embrace.

This coming Sunday's Gospel gives us the much-needed image of Jesus as both shepherd and gate. We must also hold Ken (Mary's husband) and Geni Campbell (Mary's niece) very close in prayer and in our hearts. We offer them our deepest sympathy.

Mary and Ken have been magnificent hosts. So many of us have been blessed by their generous hospitality with wonderful meals, engaging conversation, and the joy of being welcomed into their home. Those moments will remain cherished memories for many in our parish family.

One of the most consoling aspects of this Gospel is the assurance that the sheep know the Shepherd's voice, and the Good Shepherd calls each one of us by name. We know that Jesus, our Good Shepherd, has now called Mary into the green fruitful flourishing pastures in heaven.

I feel the loss of Mary deeply, and my heart fully goes out to Ken, Geni, and the rest of the family. Mary was not only a cherished parishioner, but she was a wonderful friend. In faith, we hold onto the promise that the love she shared, and the life she lived pouring herself for others, is the life lived abundantly in the Lord (John 10:10).

May Mary now rest in the abundant love of the Good Shepherd, and may we continue to hear His voice, giving us all much needed strength and support at this very difficult time.

The Easter Season

The Easter Season is the Church's great fifty-day celebration of the Resurrection, stretching from Easter Sunday to Pentecost. Liturgically, it is marked by joy: the Paschal Candle burns brightly at every Mass, the Scriptures focus on the risen Lord appearing to His disciples, and the Church prays with a renewed sense of victory and hope. The liturgical colour is white - symbolising light, glory, purity, and triumph. It is the colour of Christ risen, no longer bound by death, but radiant with divine life.

During this season, the "Alleluia" returns and is sung with real gusto. Throughout Lent it was set aside, almost like holding one's breath. Now it bursts forth again as the Church's song of joy because Jesus is alive. The word itself expresses great exuberance, for death has been conquered.

To be a person of the Resurrection means to live with that same joy and confidence. It means we are no longer defined by fear, sin, or failure, but by the life of Jesus within us. The risen Jesus is not just a figure of the past; He is alive in us now. His grace lifts us, strengthens us, and quietly transforms our hearts day by day.

Easter invites us to live differently, to carry within us the very life of the risen Lord: alive, joyful, and full of hope.

Our Church Family Has Grown, Alleluia!!

Over the weekends of the Easter season, we have now joyfully celebrated and welcomed ten (10) Infants through Baptism. So, together with the ten (10) beautiful people, who were fully initiated as Catholics at our Easter Vigil, we have grown as God's wonderful family.

The Risen Jesus' life is new in them, as they begin to live the faith that all of us in the Church profess. Their faces radiate the beauty of Jesus' Resurrection for all to see. In them, the Church is new.

I wish all the newly baptised, and those now fully initiated into the Church, a most Blessed and Happy Easter Season. Jesus is Risen! Indeed He is truly risen! Alleluia!!

Pentecost 9 Day Novena - 15th May to 23rd May

"Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of the faithful. And kindle in them the fire of Your love."

Pentecost: Once again as a parish to prepare for this important Feast Day, Pentecost Sunday, the birth of the Church, we are going to pray a 9 Day Novena to the Holy Spirit. All parishioners are encouraged to pray the Novena asking the Holy Spirit for World Peace.

Sacraments at St Benedicts Parish.

Baptism at St Benedict's.

We invite all families wishing to have children (up to 12 years) Baptised into the Catholic Faith at St Benedict's, to please contact the Parish Office for information and available dates for our Baptism Preparation and Baptism in 2026.

Children's Sacramental Programs

We encourage families wishing to enroll children to receive their Sacraments, or for those seeking further information about our Annual Sacramental Programs, to please contact the Parish Office via email.

Eligibility to receive the Sacraments:-

Confirmation - children in Grade 3 and above having already received the Sacrament of Baptism are eligible.

The Program for Confirmation takes place through out the months of July and August each year.

First Holy Communion (Eucharist) & Reconciliation - children in Grade 4 and above, having already received the Sacrament of Confirmation are eligible.

The Program takes place throughout the months of May and June each year.

RCIA and RCIT

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) and The Rite of Christian Initiation of Teens (RCIT, 13-18 years) Programs run annually. The program runs for approx. 12-15 weeks from November through to Easter the following year, with a small break over the Christmas & New Year period.
