Dear wonderful Parishioners of St Benedict's Parish

The Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) invites us to pause in wonder, awe, and gratitude before one of the greatest mysteries of our faith: Jesus, Who is God, gives Himself completely to us in the Holy Eucharist. Out of love beyond measure, He not only died for us on the Cross but continues to nourish us with His very Body and Blood so that we may share in His divine life.

In the second reading for this great feast, St Paul reminds us that "the bread that we break is a communion with the Body of Christ." The word communion speaks of an intimate union, a profound sharing of life. Through Baptism we become members of Christ's Body, the Church. Through Holy Communion, that union is deepened in an extraordinary way. The Risen Lord comes to dwell within us, and we are drawn into His glorified life. This is an awesome gift! The Saviour of the world, the King of kings and Lord of lords, chooses to make His home within our hearts.

The Eucharist is therefore far more than just a symbol or a reminder. It is Jesus Himself, truly present, offering us His love, His strength, His mercy, and His life here and now. This is why we, the Church, calls it the Eucharist, a word that means "thanksgiving." Every Mass is an act of profound gratitude for the greatest gift we could ever receive.

In the Gospel, Jesus reveals the purpose of this gift. He says, "Anyone who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I shall raise them up on the last day." Again, He assures us, "Anyone who eats this bread will live forever." Jesus does not merely promise us help for this life, He offers us eternal life. He desires that we share forever in the loving communion that exists between the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, a whirlpool of perfect love.

Notice the beautiful inclusiveness of Jesus' invitation. He says, "Anyone." His love extends to every person. His sacrifice on the Cross was offered for all humanity. The Church firmly teaches that Jesus died for every man and woman without exception. His desire is that all people come to know Him and His saving love.

At Mass we hear the words of consecration over the chalice: "This is the chalice of my Blood... which will be poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins." Some may wonder why we say "for many" rather than "for all." The expression reflects the words recorded in the Gospels and faithfully translates the Latin text of the Mass. Yet it does not mean that Christ died only for some people. Rather, it reminds us that God's gift of salvation, while offered to everyone, must be freely received.

Love never forces itself upon another. God respects our freedom. Jesus extends His invitation to all, but each person must respond in faith. As Jesus says in the Gospel, "If you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you will not have life in you." The Lord offers the gift, we are invited to accept it.

The great feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ reminds us that the Eucharist is the supreme expression of God's love. Every time we come to Mass, Jesus says to us, "I want to share My life with you. I want to strengthen you, heal you, forgive you, and draw you closer to Me." The Eucharist is not simply something we receive; it is Someone we receive.

May this great feast renew our love for the Blessed Sacrament, the Body and Blood of Jesus. May we approach Holy Communion with deeper faith, greater reverence, and overflowing gratitude. And may we never forget that in every Eucharist, Jesus gives Himself entirely to us so that we might live forever in a beautiful life-giving relationship with Him.

Baptism at St Benedict's.

We invite all families wishing to have children (up to 12 years) Baptised into the Catholic Faith at St Benedict's, to please contact the Parish Office for information and available dates for our Baptism Preparation and Baptism in 2026.

Children's Sacramental Programs

We encourage families wishing to enroll children to receive their Sacraments, or for those seeking further information about our Annual Sacramental Programs, to please contact the Parish Office via email.

Eligibility to receive the Sacraments:-

Confirmation - children in Grade 3 and above having already received the Sacrament of Baptism are eligible.

The Program for Confirmation takes place throughout the months of July and August each year.

First Holy Communion (Eucharist) & Reconciliation - children in Grade 4 and above, having already received the Sacrament of Confirmation are eligible.

The Program takes place throughout the months of May and June each year.

RCIA and RCIT

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA, 18yrs and above) and The Rite of Christian Initiation of Teens (RCIT, 13-17 years) Programs run annually.

The program runs for approx. 12-15 weeks from November through to Easter the following year, with a small break over the Christmas & New Year period.

Justice Peace & Ecology Noticeboard.

One purpose of the Justice Peace and Ecology Ministry is to help promulgate to the Parish important words from the Holy Father. Our major challenge is still to "Get the Laudato Si message out." In the extensive 2015 Encyclical of Pope Francis, "On Care for Our Common Home" he exhorted everybody to care for our planet, and told how the real losers in environmental degradation are the marginalised and poor. Each one of us can help make a change, but we must look beyond the four walls of our church.

Emma Beach, Archdiocese Executive Officer, helped us finalise our Parish Laudato Si Action Plan. It is now very simple to follow. We will be presenting the plan to Father and then to the Parish in the next few weeks.

Emma holds regular meetings for all northside parishes at Bracken Ridge. We usually have 3 or 4 participants. Last Saturday's discussions focused on:

- Laudato Si' Week actions and plans for 2027
- Integral Ecology in the Life of the Family document - how to use in the future
- Pope Leo's Magnifica Humanitas
- Catholic participation in encouraging the signing of the Fossil Fuel Treaty.

Afterwards, Emma said, "There was so much we covered and so much we could discuss more. Our next Northside Gathering is on the 1st August. **Please invite others from your communities to mark this time in their calendar.**" Anyone is welcome, contact Ken if you are interested.
