Listening to Jesus

Monday was the Feast Day of St Benedict. So, my friends, happy feast day! St Benedict consistently advises us to listen carefully to the voice of God, and love what we hear. This is the message in this coming Sunday's gospel.

In Sunday's gospel Mary and Martha are set up as contrasts. Mary sits at Jesus' feet, listening to Him. While Martha is running around serving Jesus anxiously. Jesus informs Martha that Mary has chosen the better path, and it will not be taken aways from her.

The gospel makes it clear that Martha's serving distracts her from what is truly important. It says, "Martha is distracted with all the serving." Martha's serving of Jesus is distracting her from hearing the only thing that is important, that is, Jesus. Listening to the Word of God. It is only after we have listened to God that we can truly serve God. Sunday's gospel makes it perfectly clear that listening to Jesus is an essential requirement to serving Him.

We need to remember this. For whether we admit it or not, we are totally dependent on the Word of God, that is, on listening to Jesus, who leads us in living life abundantly. We cannot effectively serve God without sitting at Jesus' feet and listening to Him first. We need the grace of God to live a life serving God and each other well. We need help from God. We need to pray. We need to listen to Jesus. We need God's grace.

It is only after listening to Jesus that our good works can flow. These good works will certainly flow if we listen to Jesus and take what He has to say to heart. For in this section of Luke's gospel Jesus calls us to love our neighbour as ourselves.

As we hear in all the gospels, but particularly last week in the parable of the Good Samaritan, our neighbour is everyone. Particularly the poor, the outcasts, the lonely, the wounded, the beaten, and even our enemies. Jesus calls us to love everyone. Hence, good works flowing from prayer, from listening to God, is a key theme in Luke's gospel.

The cross symbolises the relationship between prayer and good works particularly well. The vertical member can be seen as prayer. It provides the foundation and support of the horizontal member, which represents our good works where we love everyone. Without prayer the horizontal beam, our good works, will fall. Without the good works, then we will be without a horizontal beam where Christ stretches out His arms in love for us all, and indeed for the whole of Creation. So, we need to allow Jesus into our lives, under our roof, and allow his Word to penetrate our being to make us whole. It is only then that good works will follow, and we will *serve the Lord with gladness, and come before Him with joyful songs* (Psalm 100:2).
