#### Zeal for the Kingdom

In this coming Sunday's Gospel, Jesus uses the image of fire for describing the Kingdom of God. Fire in the land is a destructive force, but it also removes dross, cracks open seeds, and leads to regrowth. Jesus is also using the image of fire to speak of passions that drive the heart where we are called to be kindled with the fire of love for God above all things.

Jesus also speaks of division caused by our call to be His disciples. Some will accept Jesus' call, and others will reject it. But disciples are not to be discouraged by those who reject Jesus' call, even if it causes a rift in our relationships with others. For as people of faith, living our lives in the Light of Christ, we see that the more we embrace Jesus in our lives, the more our relationships with others, and the whole of creation, will flourish.

#### NATIONAL VOCATIONS WEEK: August 7-14

The Church of Australia is currently celebrating The National Vocations Awareness Week Aug. 7-14, 2022. It is an annual week-long celebration dedicated to promoting vocations. The First Sunday of this week is dedicated to pray for Single Life and Married life. The Second Sunday focuses on Priesthood and Consecrated Life.

Pope John Paul II, in his letter to the Church of Australia at that time, urged them to pray earnestly so that the Church may have faithful priests and holy religious in accordance with the Will of Christ and the plan of his Eternal Father. He urged the young people of Australia to heed the call of Christ and to not be afraid to say, "Yes!" He reminded them how wonderful it is to be able to communicate Christ's peace, to promote his justice and to spread his truth, to proclaim and to live his love.

Pope Francis also acknowledges that responding to God's call demands the courage to take a risk. "I invite everyone," he said, "to ask the Lord for the gift of good labourers for His Kingdom, with hearts and hands open to His love."

During this week, please ask God how He is calling you to live your vocation. We also pray for more vocations to priesthood and consecrated life and for those discerning their vocation in life.

#### Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary

The Catholic Church teaches us that Mary, the mother of Jesus and our heavenly Mother, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory. Along with the 52 Sundays of the year, the Catholic Church in Australia has named The Assumption (August 15) and Christmas (December 25) as our holy days of obligation.

We will be celebrating two Masses for the Assumption of Our Lady at 9am and 7pm on Friday the 15<sup>th</sup> of August. All are very welcome.

#### 2022 ANNUAL CATHOLIC CAMPAIGN: 20 - 21 August 2022

The Annual Catholic Campaign is all about what Pope Francis calls the 'revolution of tenderness'. All about the coming of God's Kingdom when dark powers seem to reign. Through our gifts to the Annual Catholic Campaign, we focus on what really matters, which means focusing on Jesus. St Paul says to us "Life for me is Christ." For us too, life is Christ - the Christ who says to us "as long as you did this to one of these, the least of my brothers and sisters, you did it to me" (Matthew 25:45).

We focus on them in order to focus on Him who is our life. The Campaign focuses on four different ways of working for God's revolution of tender-

- + The MacKillop Fund which provides Catholic education bursaries to local children whose families are suffering severe hardship.
- + Holy Spirit Seminary which provides formation for our future priests who will need strong preparation for the ministry of leadership that awaits them in changing times.
- + The Priests Foundation which supports the retired, elderly and ailing priests.
- + Centacare which reaches out in compassion through services like domestic violence support, psychiatric counselling, family support, hospital chaplaincy and prison ministry.

#### The Plenary Council WITNESSING TO THE EQUAL DIGNITY OF WOMEN AND MEN

The Plenary Council decrees:

Article 1: That the Plenary Council commits the Church in Australia to ensuring:

a. through formal policies and intentional practice, the experiences and perspectives of women, including women who exercise ministry, are heard, considered and valued at local, diocesan and national levels. This is particularly important for matters which affect them distinctively;

b. that women are appropriately represented in decision-making structures of Church governance at the parish, diocese, and national level, and in Church agencies, entities, and organisations;

c. that dioceses and eparchies recognise and value publicly, and properly remunerate, women who lead and serve in the Church in various ways.

Article 2: That each Australian diocese commits to supporting, with appropriate formation and recognition, new opportunities for women to participate in ministries that engage with the most important aspects of diocesan and parish life.

Article 3: That the Plenary Council commits the Church in Australia to implementing more fully the undertakings made by the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference in their Social Justice Statement, Woman and Man: The Bishops Respond (2000), in response to the research report Woman and Man: One in Christ Jesus (1999).

Article 4: That, should the universal law of the Church be modified to authorize the diaconate for women, the Plenary Council recommends that the Australian Bishops examine how best to implement it.
