Lessons in Discipleship

Since coming back into Ordinary Time, in the Gospel each Sunday we have been journeying with Jesus to Jerusalem, while He has been giving us lessons in discipleship. Given that we are disciples, now would be a good time to reinforce what we have learnt.

Firstly, Jesus sent out the seventy-two to all the towns and places Jesus was to visit. Jesus is making it clear that we are to be missionary. We are called to let people know about Jesus, so that they can let Jesus into their hearts and be transformed.

Then Jesus makes it clear that to be effective missionary disciples, "you must love the Lord your God with all our heart, with all your soul, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbour as yourself" (Luke 10: 27). Jesus then, through the parable of Good Samaritan, explains that our neighbour is everyone, particularly those who are suffering. And we are called to do all we can to help, just like the Good Samaritan helped the Jewish person (Jews and Samaritans were sworn enemies btw) who was beaten up and left to die.

Then we heard the encounter Jesus has with two sisters - Mary and Martha. Mary sits at the feet of Jesus, learning from Jesus, while Martha runs around anxiously serving Jesus and His companions. Martha complains to Jesus about Mary not helping her out, but Jesus responds by making it clear that in order to serve God well, we need to constantly sit at the feet of Jesus, listening to Him, who will always direct us to serve God well.

Then last Sunday Jesus taught us to pray the "Our Father." Then Jesus made it clear that God is at our beck and call, all we need to do is ask God to come into our lives, and God will. And if we do not invite Jesus into our lives, then life is a lot tougher for us.

The lesson in discipleship for this coming Sunday's Gospel is to not be greedy, and to share our gifts with others. We are not to store up treasure for ourselves, but we are called to make ourselves rich in the sight of God (Luke 12: 21).

The Plenary Council

We continue to look at the decrees from Australia's Fifth Plenary Council, which will be sent to Pope Francis for approval for us to implement as our way of being Church in Australia.

The Second Decree: CHOOSING REPENTANCE - SEEKING HEALING

As the Plenary Council of the Church in Australia, we express our profound sorrow that children and young people and vulnerable adults have been abused by clergy, religious and lay workers of the Catholic Church. To the victims and survivors of abuse, their families, and communities, we offer our unreserved apology. We commit to doing whatever we can to promote healing for those so gravely harmed and to make the Church a truly safe place for everyone.

The Church has taken significant steps in recent decades to respond to those who have suffered the trauma of abuse. Dioceses and other Church organisations have introduced policies and procedures to ensure that good practice in professional standards and safeguarding is observed by all who exercise ministry in the Church.

As a Plenary Council, we recommit the Catholic Church in Australia to responding transparently, with justice and compassion, to those who have been abused, whether they approach the Church directly or through the government's National Redress Scheme or through civil litigation. Dioceses and other Church organisations should provide sensitive and appropriate

processes for the pastoral care of those who have been abused.

For the safeguarding of children and adults at risk, and for the prevention of abuse, we recommit the Catholic Church in Australia to implementing the National Catholic Safeguarding Standards. We affirm the practice of an annual Day of Prayer (currently called "Safeguarding Sunday") on which Church communities throughout Australia pray for God's healing for those who have suffered abuse and dedicate themselves to care for children and all those who are vulnerable, following the example of Christ.

The Fifth Plenary Council of Australia decrees: Article 1 That to express more fully the aims of the annual "Safeguarding Sunday", in consultation with those who have been harmed by abuse: a. a new name will be adopted for "Safeguarding Sunday", and b. the Bishops Commission for Liturgy will develop appropriate rituals and liturgical resources to be offered to parishes for use on the day.

Justice and Peace - A major thrust from the Pope that affects all of us

Seven years ago, Pope Francis gave us his Encyclical Letter, Laudato Si' - On Care for Our Common Home. It has taken seven years for the message to be interpreted and spread through the Church, and in the last few weeks the Archdiocese of Brisbane has been the first Archdiocese in the world to launch its Action Plan.

Last Sunday, Bishop Tim travelled to Minjerribah (Stradbroke Island) to celebrate that launch with Mass and a workshop hosted by the First Nation people from that area.

This IS something that affects and involves us all. It specifically notes the urgent calls from Torres Strait Islanders and people across the Pacific to save them from climate change, to protect their lands and seas, from Aboriginal people seeking support to ward off threats to their traditional culture and lands, and the plight of all people affected by bushfires, floods, and epidemics.

The Church has a unique role in turning things around.

Those present felt the concern from the Quandamooka people at the Mass, and with the stewardship of Parishes through Justice and Peace groups, we can make changes.

Over the next few weeks we will be explaining this in more detail through the Newsletter.


