God's Infinite Mercy and Love

God's love for us is infinite and eternal. It is infinite in the sense that it is greater than we can imagine, and God's love is eternal for it is always and forever.

This coming Sunday's Gospel confirms this great love that God has for us all. In the lost and found parables that we will hear: we are the lost sheep; we are the lost coin; and we are the lost sons. What does God do when we are found? God exuberantly rejoices!

With the parable of the lost sheep, once we are found, the Good Shepherd energetically puts us on His shoulders, and runs us home to the Father, where there is great rejoicing.

In the parable of the lost coin, God searches thoroughly to find us. When we are found, God and all the angels rejoice. Now, what happens in the third parable, when the prodigal son returns? The Father gives him a big lavish welcome and throws a huge party. He explains the reason for this party when he tells his older son, "It is only right we should celebrate and rejoice, because your brother here was dead and has come to life; he was lost and is found." Jesus is saying here that the prodigal son was dead because he had separated himself from the love of the Father. He was lost because he chose to pull himself away from his loving Father and go it alone.

God, who loves us infinitely and eternally, doesn't want us to go it alone. For according to Jesus in this Gospel, life without God is death. Jesus makes it very clear that God does not want us to die, God wants us to live abundantly. This is shown by God's great rejoicing when we return, when we are found, when we live in a beautiful relationship with Jesus.

Each year from **September 1 to October 4**, the Christian family unites for the **Season of Creation**, a worldwide celebration of prayer and action to protect our common home. Our wellbeing is interwoven with the wellbeing of the Earth and we rejoice in this opportunity to safeguard our common home and all who share it.

This year, the theme for the season is **Listen to the Voice of Creation.** We continue to listen to Pope Francis' <u>message</u> for the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation. This is week 2 of the Season of Creation, and here is the second key point from Pope Francis' message:

Sweet song and bitter cry

Listening to creation, Francis mentions that there is a "kind of dissonance": "On the one hand, we can hear a sweet song in praise of our beloved Creator; on the other, an anguished plea, lamenting our mistreatment of this our common home".

In this regard, the Executive Director of <u>Laudato Si' Movement</u>, Tomás Insua, mentioned: "The sweet song of creation is mixed with its bitter cry, as evidenced by the intense heat wave that is experienced in much of the northern hemisphere and that has already killed, only in Spain and Portugal, more than 1000 people or has left 5 million people without water in

Pope Francis encourages people to stop consumerism, change lifestyles and harmful systems. All scientific reports prove it and the Pope reaffirms it: "We are reaching 'a breaking point'" and we must act now. "The crisis is no longer a hypothesis of a distant future but a tangible reality that is costing human lives," added Tomás.

The Plenary Council - Decree 8 of The Plenary Council of the Fifth Plenary Council of Australia is titled:

INTEGRAL ECOLOGY & CONVERSION FOR THE SAKE OF OUR COMMON HOME

The Fifth Plenary Council decrees:

Article 1

That, witnessing to their communal ecological conversion and the urgent need for action, by 2024, each Catholic parish, diocese, eparchy, educational institution or organisation commits to joining the Laudato Si' Platform; and by 2030 either develops its own or participates in an established Laudato Si' Action Plan which includes the following elements:

a. a public commitment;

b. a governance model, processes and procedures;

c. a mechanism for listening to the ecological wisdom of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples, developed in partnership with Aboriginal Catholic Ministry and diocesan justice, ecology and peace bodies where these exist;

 ${\bf d.}$ regular reporting on progress towards and accountability for defined goals and objectives; and

e. co-construction of those goals and objectives with the people they are meant to support and serve.

Thank you so much for your ongoing commitment to keeping each other safe.


