A Wise Steward

In this coming Sunday's Gospel we hear Jesus share with us what seems to be a very confusing parable. Now having said that, the parables Jesus told were meant to be puzzling, meant to tease us into thinking and even to turn our perspective upside down. This coming Sunday's parable certainly does this.

The steward in the Gospel story is about to be fired and so he re-writes the bills for his master cutting them down considerably in the hope that by doing this he could seek employment when he is fired. This action earns his master's praise for its astuteness! Why would Jesus present this character as an example for disciples?

Well, the master recognises the wisdom (astuteness) of the steward in the way he uses money with an eye to the future. It is possible that the steward is not losing money for his master but simply writing off his personal cut from the money owing to his master, and so is not doing anything dishonest, just forgoing his own commission. He is going without a present profit in the hope of a future gain — employment from his master's debtors. The master in the parable recognises the shrewdness of this behaviour.

It is this attitude that Jesus commends to us, his disciples. Encouraging us to use all the gifts with an eye to the future. Letting the perspective of God's Kingdom determine how we live now. From God's perspective, it may be wiser to forgo some of our current luxuries in order to help and care for others. Such outrageous behaviour may earn us the commendable title of 'a wise steward'.

Each year from **September 1 to October 4**, the Christian family unites for the **Season of Creation**, a worldwide celebration of prayer and action to protect our common home. Our wellbeing is interwoven with the wellbeing of the Earth and we rejoice in this opportunity to safeguard our common home and all who share it.

This year, the theme for the season is **Listen to the Voice of Creation.** We continue to listen to Pope Francis' <u>message</u> for the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation. This is week 3 of the Season of Creation, and here is the third key point of Pope Francis' message:

A warning message ahead of the Conference of Parties (COP)

Ahead COP 27 on climate (Egypt, November 2022) and COP 15 on biodiversity (Canada, December 2022) Francis recalls in his message the importance of "promoting the effective implementation of the Paris Agreement", as <u>recently ratified by the Holy See.</u>

"Each passing moment is an opportunity for everyone, especially world leaders, to reverse the biodiversity and climate crises. Let COP 27 bring forth ambitious commitments to prevent carbon emissions from fossil fuels and support for clean energy transition as well as efficient relief for our brothers and sisters already within the climate crisis. Let COP 15 bring forth a firm commitment to end any more biodiversity collapse", said Lindlyn Moma, Advocacy Director of the Laudato Si' Movement.

The Plenary Council

Decree 9 of the Fifth Plenary Council of Australia is titled:

THE IMPLEMENTATION PHASE OF THE FIFTH PLENARY COUNCIL

Article 1

That the Plenary Council adopt the following steps for ensuring the effectiveness and accountability of the Implementation phase, to take place over a period of five years:

- **a**. the Bishops Commission for the Plenary Council will be responsible for establishing terms of review for the Plenary Council's implementation;
- **b.** a roundtable body such as that proposed in Decree 7, Article 2, will be responsible for co-ordinating the review;
- c. interim reports will be published in 2023 and 2025; and
- **d.** the final review report will be published five years after the Second Assembly, in 2027.


