Not a Hair on Your Head will be Lost (Luke 21:19)

Since the 13th Sunday of Ordinary Time (20 weeks ago), we have been journeying with Jesus on the road to Jerusalem. While on this journey, Jesus has given us many insightful and lifegiving lessons in discipleship. In this coming Sunday's Gospel, Jesus has now reached the end of his journey and is in Jerusalem, within its magnificent Temple.

This is a very important Gospel for us, for Jesus teaches us that life can be extremely tough whether we are Christian or not. All of us are exposed to pain, suffering, death, and the consequences of poor human behaviour. Faith in Jesus doesn't take us out of the world. We are part of a struggling humanity.

In life there will be hardship and struggle; these are not incompatible with Christian faith and are not to be taken as signs that God is absent. Endurance is required from us at times as we life our lives. Our faith was never meant to be an easy escape from really living. A strong faith will engage the world and wrestle with the questions life poses. But in all this, faith in Jesus makes a difference. And this wonderful life-giving relationship we have with Jesus fills us with the beautiful hope that Jesus guarantees us in this coming Sunday's Gospel. That no matter what challenges we are faced with in this world, or what life throws at us, "not a hair on our heads will be lost, for our endurance will win us our lives" (Luke 21:19).

You will find in this weeks newsletter (ref. pg3), we have included a statement from the Queensland Bishops concerning the reception of Holy Communion in Queensland. The statement is allowing parishioners to receive Holy Communion by mouth. This does distress me, given that Covid-19 has not been eliminated, and we still have very vulnerable people in our community. The bishops strongly advise that those who wish to receive Holy Communion by mouth, come to receive Holy Communion after the rest of the community.

To be considerate to our community and care for the vulnerable parishioners, I will be asking all those wishing to receive Holy Communion by mouth to wait until the end of Holy Communion. I am asking them to receive Holy Communion from me only (not the other Communion Minister/s). I will be announcing this at Communion time at all Masses at St Benedict's.

In the light of the Queensland government's recent easing of COVID-19 restrictions, the Bishops of Queensland have been asked to consider a modification to the policy for the reception of Holy Communion.

Given that the COVID virus is still highly active and the pandemic is not over, the Bishops would prefer that the faithful continue to receive Holy Communion in the hand.

However, for those who wish to receive Holy Communion on the tongue, this is now permitted with appropriate precautions with regard to hygiene, especially by those distributing Holy Communion.

The Bishops would prefer that those wishing to receive Holy Communion on the tongue come forward after the rest of the faithful in the Communion procession.
