Holy Week!

The Easter Triduum (Three Days)

The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Easter Triduum. The word Triduum comes from the Latin word meaning "three days." It begins the evening of Holy Thursday and ends at Evening Prayer on Easter Sunday. Therefore, the Triduum consists of three full 24-hour days which begin and end in the evening. The Triduum technically is not part of Lent (at least liturgically), but Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday are still reckoned as part of the traditional forty-day Lenten fast.

The Triduum celebrates the heart of Christian faith - salvation and redemption: the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Hence, the Triduum commemorates the Institution of the Eucharist (the "sacrament of sacraments"), the passion, crucifixion, death of the Lord, his descent to the dead, and finally his glorious resurrection on Easter Sunday. Along with the Ascension, these important events make up the *Paschal Mystery*.

So even though the liturgical year begins chronologically at Advent, it reaches its culmination during the Easter Triduum, particularly at Easter, the "solemnity of solemnities," the "Great Feast." The Catholic Catechism describes the importance of the Triduum:

Beginning with the Easter Triduum as its source of light, the new age of the Resurrection fills the whole liturgical year with its brilliance. Gradually, on either side of this source, the year is transfigured by the liturgy. It really is a "year of the Lord's favor." The economy of salvation is at work within the framework of time, but since its fulfillment in the Passover of Jesus and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, the culmination of history is anticipated "as a foretaste," and the kingdom of God enters into our time (1168).

Our Easter Triduum Celebration

To celebrate the Easter Triduum well, we will be celebrating "three" liturgical celebrations as "one" continuous celebration. This one continuous celebration will be mark by special silences.

Starting on Holy **Thursday evening at 7pm** we will gather to celebrate **the Mass of the Lord's Supper.** At the end of this Mass we process to the back of the hall to the Altar of Repose to spend up to an hour with Jesus where we then leave in silence. **On Good Friday** the Triduum continues with **the Lord's Passion at 3pm.** Here, we gather in silence, and we begin by kneeling as the priest lies prostrate in front of the altar (which symbolises Jesus) for several seconds. We then continue with the Passion of Jesus, which concludes with us all leaving in silence yet again. Then we gather again for the third part of our Easter Triduum celebration with **the Easter Vigil Mass at 7pm Saturday** evening by gathering in silence at the bonfire with which we will light the Easter candle and then celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus with great joy!

Holy Week begins today with Palm Sunday, which is also known as Passion Sunday. During the Palm Sunday Mass we commemorate Jesus' Triumphal entry into Jerusalem, one of the few events described in all four Gospels. As we will hear, Jesus' entry into Jerusalem was noted by the crowds present who shouted praises and waived palm branches.

In non-Covid times, we usually bless the palms outside and process into the hall. At all Palm Sunday Masses this year, we will be commemorating Jesus' entry into Jerusalem in the hall. All parishioners will be asked to collect a palm on their way into our Mass centre, and I will bless these palms at the beginning of Mass.

The Paschal Mystery – The Heart of Our Faith - The Easter Triduum

As I mentioned last week, we are celebrating the Easter Triduum liturgically (The Mass of the Lord's Supper, The Passion of Jesus, and the Easter Vigil) as **one continual celebration** marked by special silences.

Holy Thursday – The Mass of the Lord's Supper

Starting on Holy Thursday evening at 7:00pm, we will gather to celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper. This Mass inaugurates the Easter Triduum, and commemorates the institution of the Eucharist, the institution of the priesthood, and the commandment of loving service that Jesus gave after washing the feet of his disciples. At the end of this Mass we will process to the back of our Mass Centre with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament to the Altar of Repose to spend time with Jesus, where we then leave in silence.

Good Friday – The Passion of the Lord

On Good Friday the Triduum continues with the Lord's Passion at 3pm. Here, we gather in silence, and we begin by kneeling as the priest lies prostrate in front of the altar for several seconds. We then continue with the Passion of Jesus, the veneration of the Cross (priest only), and receiving Holy Communion. After receiving Holy Communion, people will be invited to come forward and venerate Jesus' Cross. **Due to Covid, we venerate Jesus' cross this year by reverently bowing or genuflecting** before leaving in silence once again.

Thank you to everyone who filled in the pledge cards over the last two weeks and are now actively contributing financially to the life of our St Benedict's Parish. Thank you! Whilst sadly the response is not what was hoped for I am very grateful to those who are contributing. As previously mentioned this puts us in a relatively weak position in asking the Archdiocese to build us a church. Also, I am not sure what we are going to do when the Archdiocesan funding reduces next year, 2024.

Once again, a huge thankyou to the parishioners who do contribute to the financial well-being of the parish. Without you we would not be able to operate as a parish.

We know that the only stable and recurring income that our parish receives is from the **support of our Planned Giving Program**. At present, we are not receiving enough income from our Planned Giving to meet the financial cost of running the parish.

There is a need to increase our collections by \$2000 a week in-order-to plug the gap when we are no longer eligible to receive the current level of subsidies from the Archdiocese. Also, as I have said, after a church is built there will be additional operating costs such as insurance, maintenance, utility bills etc.

Please, I am asking every parishioner to commit some of your **TREASURE** and help make our dream become a reality. Our Parish Pledge Card is available at the Mass centre, asking everyone to **commit to the Planned Giving Program.** If you are already in the Planned Giving Program, we are asking you to at least continue and if possible increase your financial support. 500 people on average attend Mass each week and we have 76 families contribute to the Parish through the Parish Planned Giving Program.

If you are not yet part of our Planned Giving Program, then please join and make a commitment. There are three (3) options to financially contribute to the running of the parish. These are:

On this Pledge Card we will have an opportunity to support both:
