Faith, Hope, and Love!

Faith, hope, and love all work together to make up the three virtues of God (Theological Virtues). In this coming Sunday's first reading from the Book of Exodus we see the importance of Faith and Hope working together in our lives.

In this reading the People of Israel are tormented by thirst in the desert - with the adults, their children, and their cattle dying of thirst. Rather than praying to God to help them, that is, rather than putting their total trust in God to help them, they complained bitterly and cursed God. So much so, that they were on the verge of stoning Moses – God's messenger – to death

By turning on God, or even deserting God, during tough times, is akin to shooting ourselves in the foot. Especially for us, who are people of the Resurrection, knowing that God will always raise us to life.

Just like God's miraculous action through Moses, eventually provided the people of Israel with water from a rock. The people of Israel were lacking faith that God was with them, loving them, and therefore were filled with self-pity, doubt and bitterness. It was this self-pity, doubt and bitterness that was destroying the people of Israel, not their lack of water.

This story from Exodus shows us the inverse relationship between faith and doubt, hope and hopelessness. That is, it shows us that the more faith we have, the less we doubt that God is with us, loving us. Being people strengthened by our hope. Conversely, the less faith we have, the more likely we are to doubt God's love for us, which leads to a life of hopelessness.

So as people of faith, hope, and love, let us put our total faith and trust in God, who promises Resurrection no matter how tough our challenges may be.

On Wednesdays during Lent at 7pm all are welcome to join our St Benedict's Parish Lenten Group, as we gather together via zoom.




