True Freedom in Christ

It is important to be aware that Israel's Exodus story is always hovering in the background of Matthew's Gospel. Matthew portrays Jesus as the One who leads us on a new and greater exodus. Israel's exodus is the Israelites journey out of slavery in Egypt. In Matthew Jesus leads us out of slavery to sin and death giving us true freedom.

Both exodus stories have a character named Joseph, who God communicates with through dreams. Both stories also have: a journey down to Egypt, a tyrant (Pharoah and King Herod), the slaughter of baby boys, a return from Egypt, a king seeks to use a foreign magus, freedom through water (Red Sea and Baptism), the desert as a place of testing, the miraculous feeding of the multitude in the wilderness (manna and quail, loaves and fish), and both stories have a revelation on a mountain, which brings us to this coming Sunday's gospel, the Transfiguration of Jesus (Matthew 17:1-9).

In the story of the Transfiguration, after six days, Jesus leads Peter, James, and John up a high mountain...suddenly a bright cloud covered them in a shadow, and suddenly from the cloud there came a voice which said... (Matthew 17:1,5). Now, in the Book of Exodus, God calls Moses up a high mountain, together with Aaron, Nadab, and Abihu. They were covered with a cloud for six days, and then on the seventh day God speaks to Moses (Exodus 24: 1-16). Once again, we have similarities between these two stories. Both stories have: Moses and Jesus taking three people up a high mountain, a covering of cloud, and God speaks on the seventh day.

God's voice coming from the cloud says of Jesus, "This is my son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour. Listen to him (Matthew 17:5). This alludes to the promise that Moses makes to the people in the Book of Deuteronomy, "From among yourselves, the Lord your God will raise up a prophet like me; you shall listen to him" (Deuteronomy 18:14-15).

Jesus is indeed a prophet. But He is much more than a prophet, He is God! The One who is with us always, leading us all on a new and greater exodus!!

The Building of our Church


My apologies to all. I was told that plans would go ahead with our 300-seat church that will be joined to a 2000-seat auditorium. But the Director of Building and Property for the Archdiocese of Brisbane, Patrick Lane-Mullins, informed us last Thursday that we cannot precede until the College have made their plans for the building of their 2000-seat auditorium.

Other information gleaned from Patrick last week, is that once we get to start the building process, it usually takes approximately two years from initial design to final build.

I do have a major concern though. My concern is how are we going to be able to financially sustain the building of a church. At the moment we are dependent on \$55 000 per year financial support from the Archdiocese of Brisbane to break even. The cost of the church will be at least \$5 million. At the moment, the Archdiocese will pay half of this, and we will need a \$2.5 million loan for the remaining. The expectation will be for us to pay interest only for the first ten years of this loan. That is, conservatively at 4 percent interest, \$100 000 per year. Also, we will have to pay at least \$25 000 per year insurance, and \$20 000 per year for utilities and maintenance (all these figures are conservative). With our current annual financial position, this will give us an annual debt of \$200 000. I am going to push hard for the Archdiocese to contribute more towards the building of the church, but we will need to at come up with at least an extra \$100 000 per year to be sustainable. If you have suggestions as to how we can come up with this \$100 000 each year, they will be much appreciated.

Please don't be disheartened, for the church "the people" in our parish is thriving. If we continue to grow spiritually and with more people joining us, our leaders will most certainly have to support us more. Please keep this very important matter in your prayers.

Seeking a better future for her family, Tereesa joined Baabayn Aboriginal Corporation's Young Mums and Bubs Group, supported by Caritas Aus.




Baabayn helped Tereesa access housing and psychological support. Today, Tereesa is studying a certificate in Community Services so that she can strengthen her skills and give back to her community.
