## God has Done Great Things for Us! (Psalm 126)

We have prepared for forty days during Lent for this most significant moment – the celebration of Jesus' Passion, Death, and Resurrection (The Paschal Mystery). The core of our faith.

Even though the Passion of Jesus fully exposes our human weakness, especially the ironic tendency to want to eliminate God from our lives, the whole of Matthew's Gospel is not about what we do to God, but it is definitively about what God is doing for us.

In the first and last chapters of Matthew's Gospel we have the appearance of an Angel. In chapter one an Angel appears to Joseph in a dream assuring him that the child that Mary has conceived is from the Holy Spirit (Matthew 1:20). In this coming Sunday's Gospel we hear from the final chapter of Matthew's Gospel where we have an Angel appearing to Mary of Magdala and the other Mary telling them that Jesus has been raised (Matthew 28:1-12). So, in both stories there is an Angel. And both stories have the same angelic exhortation "do not be afraid!"

The story in chapter one is about the divine placing in the womb. The child conceived in Mary's womb is from the Holy Spirit. The story in the final chapter is about the divine raising from the tomb. Jesus has been raised as he said He would. Matthew's Gospel begins with the divine placing in the womb, and concludes with the divine raising from the tomb. Matthew's Gospel tells us what God is doing for us in the person of His Son. This brings us to another bookend in Matthew's Gospel.

In chapter one, Matthew tells us that the divine conception of Jesus fulfils what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet, "look the Virgin is with child, and will give birth to a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel" (Matthew 1:22). Matthew then explains that the name Emmanuel means "God is with us". In the final chapter of Matthew's Gospel, the Risen Lord assures his disciples, "I am with you always, yes to the end of time." (Matthew 28:20). So, Matthew is telling us that his gospel is the story of God with us. This ending of Matthew's Gospel reverberates the whole of the Old Testament, assuring us that in the person of Jesus, god loves us infinitely and is with us until the end of time. We, as human beings, have a tendency to reject the One who loves us infinitely and wants us to live life abundantly. May we all open our hearts and minds to Jesus this Holy Week, so that we can be filled with the love, joy, hope, and peace of Christ, now and forever!!

and the commandment of loving service that Jesus gave after washing the feet of his disciples. At the end of this Mass we will process to the back of our Mass Centre with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament to the Altar of Repose to spend time with Jesus, where we then leave in silence.

## Good Friday – The Passion of the Lord

On Good Friday the Triduum continues with the Lord's Passion at 3pm. Here, we gather in silence, and we begin by kneeling as the priest lies prostrate in front of the altar for several seconds. We then continue with the Passion of Jesus, the veneration of the Cross (priest only), and receiving Holy Communion. After receiving Holy Communion, people will be invited to come forward and venerate Jesus' Cross. Due to Covid, we venerate Jesus' cross this year by reverently **bowing or genuflecting** before leaving in silence once again.

## Easter Vigil – The Resurrection of the Lord

Then we gather again for the third part of our Easter Triduum celebration by gathering in silence at the bonfire in which we will light the Easter candle and then celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus with great exuberant joy! For the Lord has done great things for us, holy is His name." (Psalm 126).

## Candles for the Easter Vigil


The candle ceremony is an important part of the Easter Vigil celebration on Saturday evening. During this ceremony we light the Easter candle which symbolises Christ Risen! Once again, due to Covid, this will be done by the priest and servers only. Parishioners are invited to purchase a battery operated candle (\$2.00 each) as they enter the hall. Once you have your candle, please proceed to your seats, and once the Paschal Candle is lit, please switch on your candles. The Risen Christ truly is the Light of the world.
