# Readings for this week - 14th May 2023,

Sixth Sunday of Easter.

1st Reading - Acts of the Apostles

#### Come Holy Spirit, Come!

Time and time again, I have said in my preaching that we are commissioned by Jesus to continue His mission in the world. Then I say, "but we cannot do this on our own, we need the Risen Jesus, God, to help us to be missionary disciples." This coming Sunday's First Reading and Gospel also makes it very clear that we cannot continue Jesus' mission in the world without the help of the Holy Spirit.

In the First Reading Peter and John go to Samaria and performs, what looks like, the Sacrament of Confirmation on all the Samaritans, who have been converted to Christianity. We hear, "they sent Peter and John to them,...and they prayed for the Samaritans to receive the Holy Spirit...Then they laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit." (Acts 8:16-17). Like we hear earlier in the Acts of the Apostles, where the Holy Spirit enables the Apostles in the upper room to go out to all the world and spread the Good News of Jesus Christ (Act 2:1-11), we too receive the Holy Spirit to enable us to spread the Good News of Jesus to the world today.

This Paraclete, the Holy Spirit, is mentioned by Jesus in this coming Sunday's Gospel, where He says, "I shall ask the Father, and He will give you another Paraclete to be with you for ever, the Spirit of truth...you know Him, because He is with you, He is in you. (John 14:15-17). John's Gospel makes it very clear that the Holy Spirit enables us to continue Jesus' mission in the world through using the following parallels:

The Father gives His only begotten Son (3:16). The Father gives the Paraclete (14:16).

Jesus bears witness (3:22, 8:13-18). The Paraclete bears witness (15:26).

Jesus abides with the disciples (14:25). The Paraclete will abide with the disciples (14:16).

Jesus is the Truth (14:6). The Paraclete is the Spirit of Truth (14:17).

Jesus teaches (7:14). The Paraclete teaches (14:26).

These are just a few of the examples of John paralleling Jesus and the Paraclete. Like I said above, he does this to emphasise that the Holy Spirit gives us the power to continue Jesus' mission in the world.

The world at Jesus' time was very different to the world of today. We are confronted with issues unimaginable in 1<sup>st</sup> Century Palestine, however, the Paraclete, the Spirit of Truth, will guide us as we seek the Truth in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century. Jesus foresaw this when He said to His disciples, "I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. However, when the Spirit of Truth comes, He will guide you in all Truth. He will take what is mine and reveal it to you." (John 16:12-13).

Come Holy Spirit, come!

# Archbishop Mark's Seven Apostolic Priorities

In today's first reading, Philip goes down to the city of Samaria to proclaim the Messiah to them. The result is "great joy in that city." If the Gospel is not good news, then the Gospel has not been preached. If the acceptance of the Gospel does not result in great joy, then the Gospel has not been received. Sadly, throughout history, the preaching of the Gospel has often been mixed up with political power. The good news that would set the captives free came with a new political power that would create a new kind of captivity. This tension can be recognised in Australian history and is addressed by Archbishop Mark's Fifth Apostolic Priority: engaging anew with First Nations Peoples.

#### The Lords Day



When the COVID pandemic struck, I joined other bishops in deciding for a dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass. Now that the pandemic seems to be receding, it is good for us to reflect not only upon the Sunday obligation but upon the meaning of Sunday itself. To call the first day of the week Sunday recalls the Roman name, but from the first Christians always called it

the Lord's Day, in honour of the Risen Christ who is the true light of the world and the source of life. The Lord's Day was the weekly Easter and the weekly Pentecost, because on the first day Jesus Christ rose from the dead and breathed the Holy Spirit into the Church. It was the day that looked back to the first day of creation and forward to the last day of the Lord's return in glory. Even in times of persecution, Christians remained faithful unto death to the assembly of the Lord's Day. The spontaneous practice of the early days eventually became Church law. Yet it is not law that draws us to Mass but the Lord's desire to eat the Passover with us (cf Luke 22:15). The deepest reason we go to Mass on Sunday is not because we have decided or because the Church's requires it but because we are drawn there by his desire for us. In coming to Mass, we surrender to the Lord's love and let ourselves be drawn by him who wants to speak to our heart and share his feast with us. Therefore, in the Archdiocese of Brisbane from Pentecost Sunday of this year (28 May) the pandemic dispensation will be withdrawn and the Sunday obligation will be restored, so that all of us, responding to the Risen Lord's call, may say with one heart and voice, "This is the day which the Lord has made: let us rejoice and be glad" (Psalm 118:24).

**Financially Supporting Our St Benedict's Parish** 

To everyone who actively contributes financially to the life of our St Benedict's Parish. Thank you! Without you we would not be able to operate as a parish.

We know that the only stable and recurring income that our parish receives is from the support of our Planned Giving Program. At present, we are not receiving enough income from our Planned Giving to meet the financial cost of running the parish.

There is a need to increase our collections by \$2000 a week in-order-to plug the gap when we are no longer eligible to receive the current level of subsidies from the Archdiocese, which will cease in 2024. Also, as I have said, after a church is built there will be additional operating costs such as insurance, maintenance, utility bills etc.

Please, I am asking every parishioner to commit some of your TREASURE and help make our dream become a reality. Our Parish Pledge Card is available at the Mass centre; asking everyone to commit to the Planned Giving Program. If you are already in the Planned Giving Program, we are asking you to at least continue and if possible increase your financial support. 500 people on average attend Mass each week and we have 83 families that contribute to the Parish through the Parish Planned Giving Program.

If you are not yet part of our Planned Giving Program, then please join and make a commitment to our Parish. There are three (3) options to financially contribute to the running of the parish. These are:

- 1. Direct Debit or 2. Credit Card or 3. Giving Envelopes On this Pledge Card we will have an opportunity to support both:
- \* The Parish (Running) Collection, which supports the expenses incurred for the day-to-day, efficient and effective running of the parish. (Leases, Wages, Supplies)
- \* The Building (Church) Donation, which supports our purchasing/building of assets, which include our future church, offices, and an adult faith formation/gathering
