#### The Harvest is Rich, but the Labourers are Few (Matthew 9:37)

In his book, *Patience with God: The Story of Zacchaeus Continuing in Us,* Father Tomas Halik believes that there are a great number of "seekers" in the world today. These "seekers", who like Zacchaeus (in Luke 19:1-10), yearn for fulfillment and meaning, but are not sure where to find it. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, we know that Jesus gives us fulfilment and meaning, and in this coming Sunday's Gospel we are encouraged by Jesus to step-up and share the Good News of Jesus with others.

In Sunday's Gospel, Jesus appoints the twelve apostles, and sends them out to "proclaim that the kingdom of heaven is close at hand" (Matthew 10:7). As members of the Body of Christ, we are called to be apostles too. Our primary call is to "proclaim that the kingdom of Heaven is close at hand." Jesus is the Kingdom of Heaven, who is indeed very close to us. All we need to do in order to receive Jesus more and more deeply into our lives is to open our hearts and minds to Him. When we do this, through the grace of God, we find complete fulfilment and meaning in our lives. Then we do all we can to share this Good News of Jesus with others. So that the great multitude of "seekers", which Father Halik refers to, opens their hearts and minds to Jesus too, for Jesus will always satisfy our deepest yearning, and gives us life in abundance.

#### **Update on the Church**

As mentioned in previous weeks, significant members of the Archdiocese, BCE and I are regularly meeting to discuss our church. We have decided to move closer to having a church. We joined together again last Thursday (25/05), to discuss and plan for the next steps to be taken.

The next steps that are to be taken will be to have a new Master Plan drawn up for the future of the St Benedict's Primary, College and Parish and the use and development of the block of land across from the Primary School hall. Along with this Master Plan will be a feasibility exercise as to whether a New Build, a Pre-Fabricated or Re-establishing/relocating an existing church building onto the land would be accessible and most affordable.

In the meantime, I am organising a Parish Church Futures Group to assist in progressing towards building our church, and to develop a strategy looking at how our parish will fund it.

Sacramental Preparation, to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, takes place throughout the months of July and August, with the Sacrament being received in August.



## Financially Supporting Our St Benedict's Parish

To everyone who actively contributes financially to the life of our St Benedict's Parish. Thank you! Without you we would not be able to operate as a parish.

We know that the only stable and recurring income that our parish receives is from the **support of our Planned Giving Program**. At present, we are not receiving enough income from our Planned Giving to meet the financial cost of running the parish.

There is a need to increase our collections by \$2000 a week in-order-to plug the gap when we are no longer eligible to receive the current level of subsidies from the Archdiocese, which will cease in 2024. Also, as I have said, after a church is built there will be additional operating costs such as insurance, maintenance, utility bills etc.

Please, I am asking every parishioner to commit some of your TREASURE and help make our dream become a reality. Our Parish Pledge Card is available at the Mass centre; asking everyone to commit to the Planned Giving Program. If you are already in the Planned Giving Program, we are asking you to at least continue and if possible increase your financial support. 500 people on average attend Mass each week and we have 83 families that contribute to the Parish through the Parish Planned Giving Program.

If you are not yet part of our Planned Giving Program, then please join and make a commitment to our Parish. There are three (3) options to financially contribute to the running of the parish. These are:

- 1. Direct Debit or2. Credit Card or3. Giving EnvelopesOn this Pledge Card we will have an opportunity to support both:
- \* The Parish (Running) Collection, which supports the expenses incurred for the day-to-day, efficient and effective running of the parish. (Leases, Wages, Supplies)
- \* The Building (Church) Donation, which supports our purchasing/building of assets, which include our future church, offices, and an adult faith formation/gathering space.

If we want the Archdiocese to contribute significantly to the building of our church, then we need to show that we are financially viable as a parish.
