Jesus is Always Available for Us

The Parable of the Sower in this coming Sunday's Gospel reaffirms the image painted in the Book of Revelation, where Jesus says, "I stand at your door and knock, waiting for you to invite me in. And when you do invite me in, I will eat with you, and you with me" (Rev 3:20). Revealing to us that Jesus is always available for each of us.

In the Parable of the Sower, the Sower (God) spreads his Seed (the Word, that is, Jesus) generously. The growth of this Seed depends on how we receive it. If we receive it whole-heartedly, always opening the door to Jesus in our lives, then we will be rich soil producing a bumper harvest (Matt 13:8), transforming the world with Jesus' love.

Bishop Tim Norton – Mass and Talk on Sunday July 30 at 8:30am

How blessed are we? We hosted Archbishop Mark last Sunday, and on Sunday 30 July we will have our Auxiliary Bishop, Bishop Tim Norton, joining us for another major event. This will start with a multi-cultural Mass at 8:30am to celebrate our Parish's diversity, and a short morning tea followed by a presentation by Bishop Tim on understanding and implementing practical measures to live the Christian life guided by Pope Francis' encyclical, "Laudato Si' (On the care for our common home).

Please join us for Mass and morning tea with Bishop Tim, and then stay to hear Bishop Tim explain this new direction. The presentation should start at 10.15am and conclude at 11:30. It will be most rewarding as Bishop Tim is a compelling, yet down-to-earth speaker.

The Liturgy is the Source and Summit of the Christian Life (SC 10)

The above quote comes from a Second Vatican Council document Sacrosanctum Concilium, which is the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy (to view this excellent document on the liturgy pleased click <u>Sacrosanctum Concilium (vatican.va)</u>).

We are blessed to have Elizabeth Harrington continuing to educate us this week, as we learn more about the Eucharist.

THE EUCHARIST: DOING WHAT JESUS DID

The Liturgy of the Eucharist at Mass is based on what Jesus did at the Last Supper. The Gospel accounts tell us that Christ **took** the bread and the cup of wine and **gave thanks** to God for them; he **broke** the bread and **shared** the bread and wine with his disciples.

The Liturgy of the Eucharist begins with the Preparation of the Gifts when the bread and wine are **taken** forward, placed on the altar and prayed over. Along with the bread and wine we offer ourselves to God and as the bread and wine are blessed, we too are blessed by God.

In the Eucharistic Prayer, which is the centre and high point of the celebration of the Mass, we **give thanks** to God for the gifts of bread and wine and for the whole work of salvation.

After the sign of peace, the celebrant **breaks** the bread. Early Christians considered that this part of the ritual was so important that they called their Sunday gathering "the breaking of the bread". The breaking of the bread into many pieces signifies that we are made one when we receive Communion from the one loaf. The Lamb of God litany accompanies the action of the breaking of the bread.

In the communion procession we walk and sing together as we go to the altar to **share** in the paschal meal. By taking and eating the Body of Christ, the faithful become the Body of Christ, united in service to the world and in working for the Kingdom of justice, love, and peace.

Sharing and Endorsing the Uluru Statement from the Heart

The leaders of our Church in Australia has asked us to share and endorse the Uluru Statement from the Heart. It is an excellent statement.

ULURU STATEMENT FROM THE HEART

We, gathered here at the 2017 National Constitutional Convention, coming from all points of the southern sky, make this statement from the heart:

Our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander tribes were the first sovereign Nations of the Australian continent and its adjacent islands, and possessed it under our own laws and customs. This our ancestors did, according to the reckoning of our culture, from the Creation, according to the common law from 'time immemorial', and according to science more than 60,000 years ago.

This sovereignty is a spiritual notion: the ancestral tie between the land or 'mother nature', and the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples who were born therefrom, remain attached thereto, and must one day return thither to be united with our ancestors. This link is the basis of the ownership of the soil, or better, of sovereignty. It has never been ceded or extinguished, and co-exists with the sovereignty of the Crown.

How could it be otherwise? That peoples possessed a land for sixty millennia and this sacred link disappears from world history in merely the last two hundred years?

With substantive constitutional change and structural reform, we believe this ancient sovereignty can shine through as a fuller expression of Australia's nationhood.

Proportionally, we are the most incarcerated people on the planet. We are not an innately criminal people. Our children are aliened from their families at unprecedented rates. This cannot be because we have no love for them. And our youth languish in detention in obscene numbers. They should be our hope for the future.

These dimensions of our crisis tell plainly the structural nature of our problem. This is the torment of our powerlessness.

We seek constitutional reforms to empower our people and take a rightful place in our own country. When we have power over our destiny our children will flourish. They will walk in two worlds and their culture will be a gift to their country.

We call for the establishment of a First Nations Voice enshrined in the Constitution.

Makarrata is the culmination of our agenda: the coming together after a struggle. It captures our aspirations for a fair and truthful relationship with the people of Australia and a better future for our children based on justice and self-determination.

We seek a Makarrata Commission to supervise a process of agreement-making between governments and First Nations and truth-telling about our history.

In 1967 we were counted, in 2017 we seek to be heard. We leave base camp and start our trek across this vast country, and we invite you to walk with us in a movement of the Australian people for a better future.

Receiving from the Chalice.

We are now allowed to receive Holy Communion from the Chalice at our Masses. However, we need volunteers to be Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion of the Chalice specifically. This role will involve:

- * distributing the Chalice at our Masses,
- * consuming the Blood of Christ remaining, and
- * purifying the vessels.

We have volunteers at our 4pm Mass, but we are still waiting for volunteers at both of our Sunday Masses. If you would like to volunteer as an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion of the Chalice, please contact our parish office.

<u>Confirmation</u> - children in Grade 3 and above having received the Sacrament of Baptism are eligible.


Enrolments for Confirmation in 2023 are now closed.



Financially Supporting Our St Benedict's Parish

We know that the only stable and recurring income that our parish receives is from the support of our Planned Giving Program. At present, we are not receiving enough income from our Planned Giving to meet the financial cost of running the parish.

There is a need to increase our collections by \$2000 a week in-order-to plug the gap when we are no longer eligible to receive the current level of subsidies from the Archdiocese, which will cease in 2024. Also, as I have said, after a church is built there will be additional operating costs such as insurance, maintenance, utility bills etc.

Please, I am asking every parishioner to commit some of your TREASURE and help make our dream become a reality. Our Parish Pledge Card is available at the Mass centre; asking everyone to commit to the Planned Giving Program. If you are already in the Planned Giving Program, we are asking you to at least continue and if possible increase your financial support. 500 people on average attend Mass each week and we have 83 families that contribute to the Parish through the Parish Planned Giving Program.

If you are not yet part of our Planned Giving Program, then please join and make a commitment to our Parish. There are three (3) options to financially contribute to the running of the parish. These are:

- 1. Direct Debit or 2. Credit Card or 3. Giving Envelopes On this Pledge Card we will have an opportunity to support both:
- * The Parish (Running) Collection, which supports the expenses incurred for the day-to-day, efficient and effective running of the parish. (Leases, Wages, Supplies)
- * The Building (Church) Donation, which supports our purchasing/building of assets, which include our future church, offices, and an adult faith formation/gathering

If we want the Archdiocese to contribute significantly to the building of our church, then we need to show that we are financially viable as a parish. So please join our Planned Giving program to help secure our financial future and to give us funds to answer God's call for us to spread the Good News of Jesus through our words, our deeds, and by being vessels of God's hope, love, and peace.
