Jesus Teaches us Using Parables

As I said in my homily last weekend, Jesus will be teaching us about the "Kingdom of Heaven" over these three Sundays using parables. Last Sunday we had the Parable of the Sower. This coming Sunday Jesus teaches us using three more parables. Then the following Sunday we will hear another three parables. It is very important, therefore, for us to know what a parable is, and how we deepen our faith by listening and reflecting on them.

Our English word "parable" comes from the Greek word "parabole". "Para" meaning "next to or alongside" (as in parallel lines), and "bole" meaning "to throw". So etymologically, our English word "parable" means "to throw next to or alongside." What does that mean?

Parables seek to give us an insight into something we know little or nothing about. The parables for the next two Sundays want to give us an insight into the "Kingdom of Heaven." So Jesus in this coming Sunday's Gospel compares "Darnel amongst Wheat", "the growth of a mustard seed", and "a woman baking bread" to the "Kingdom of Heaven." These parables seek to illuminate "the Kingdom of Heaven" by appealing to something better known.

I also said in my homily last weekend, a parable makes one main point. For example, Jesus' main point in the Parable of the Sower is to receive Jesus into our lives whole-heartedly, for Jesus is always offering Himself up for us, and when we do receive Jesus whole-hearted we will produce an abundant harvest. In other words, live life abundantly. The one point for the three parables this coming Sunday will be revealed in my homily. These parables will help us to see that the "Kingdom of Heaven" is not a place, but rather a way of being. Where God reigns in our hearts and minds so that we and the whole of Creation will flourish.

Bishop Tim Norton – Mass and Talk on Sunday July 30 at 8:30am

How blessed are we? Recently, we hosted Archbishop Mark, and on Sunday 30 July we will have our Auxiliary Bishop, Bishop Tim Norton, joining us for another major event. This will start with a multi-cultural Mass at 8:30am to celebrate our Parish's diversity, and a short morning tea followed by a presentation by Bishop Tim on understanding and implementing practical measures to live the Christian life guided by Pope Francis' encyclical, "Laudato Si'" (On the care for our common home).

Please join us for Mass and morning tea with Bishop Tim, and then stay to hear Bishop Tim explain this new direction. The presentation should start at 10.15am and conclude at 11:30. It will be most rewarding as Bishop Tim is a compelling, yet down-to-earth speaker.

The Liturgy is the Source and Summit of the Christian Life (SC 10)

We are blessed to have Elizabeth Harrington continuing to educate us this week, as we learn more about the preparation of the gifts.

PREPARATION OF THE GIFTS

The Liturgy of the Word at Mass is followed by what is called the 'Preparation of the Gifts'. In the Preparation of the Gifts, the bread and wine for the Eucharist are brought forward, placed on the altar and a prayer said over them. The procession with the gifts by members of the assembly represents our participation in the eucharistic action as we offer ourselves along with the gifts of bread and wine.

The Missal's *General Instruction* mentions only bread, wine and money (or other gifts for the poor and the Church) in the procession. It is a procession of *gifts*: you can't take them back again afterwards!

In the early years of Christianity, the faithful brought bread and wine with them to church to be used in the celebration of the Eucharist. What wasn't used at the Mass was given to the poor and needy. Later, people started bringing other gifts of food or money which were offered for the work of the Church. In most parishes today a collection of money that will be used in the mission of the Church is taken up during the Preparation of Gifts.

Visitors to a Catholic Church are often surprised (and sometimes embarrassed!) when the collection plate comes around a second time at Mass. Having two collections is a way of separating donations for the support of the clergy from contributions to the cost of the parish services and operations.

ULURU STATEMENT FROM THE HEART

We, gathered here at the 2017 National Constitutional Convention, coming from all points of the southern sky, make this statement from the heart:

Our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander tribes were the first sovereign Nations of the Australian continent and its adjacent islands, and possessed it under our own laws and customs. This our ancestors did, according to the reckoning of our culture, from the Creation, according to the common law from 'time immemorial', and according to science more than 60,000 years ago.

This sovereignty is a spiritual notion: the ancestral tie between the land or 'mother nature', and the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples who were born therefrom, remain attached thereto, and must one day return thither to be united with our ancestors. This link is the basis of the ownership of the soil, or better, of sovereignty. It has never been ceded or extinguished, and co-exists with the sovereignty of the Crown.

How could it be otherwise? That peoples possessed a land for sixty millennia and this sacred link disappears from world history in merely the last two hundred years?

With substantive constitutional change and structural reform, we believe this ancient sovereignty can shine through as a fuller expression of Australia's nationhood.

Proportionally, we are the most incarcerated people on the planet. We are not an innately criminal people. Our children are alienated from their families at unprecedented rates. This cannot be because we have no love for them. And our youth languish in detention in obscene numbers. They should be our hope for the future.

These dimensions of our crisis tell plainly the structural nature of our problem. This is the torment of our powerlessness.

We seek constitutional reforms to empower our people and take a rightful place in our own country. When we have power over our destiny our children will flourish. They will walk in two worlds and their culture will be a gift to their country.

We call for the establishment of a First Nations Voice enshrined in the Constitution.

Makarrata is the culmination of our agenda: the coming together after a struggle. It captures our aspirations for a fair and truthful relationship with the people of Australia and a better future for our children based on justice and self-determination.

We seek a Makarrata Commission to supervise a process of agreement-making between governments and First Nations and truth-telling about our history.

In 1967 we were counted, in 2017 we seek to be heard. We leave base camp and start our trek across this vast country, and we invite you to walk with us in a movement of the Australian people for a better future.

Receiving from the Chalice.

We are now allowed to receive Holy Communion from the Chalice at our Masses. However, we need volunteers to be Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion of the Chalice specifically. This role will involve:

- * distributing the Chalice at our Masses,
- * consuming the Blood of Christ remaining, and
- * purifying the vessels.

We have volunteers at our 4pm Mass, but we are still waiting for volunteers at both of our Sunday Masses. If you would like to volunteer as an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion of the Chalice, please contact our parish office.

Financially Supporting Our St Benedict's Parish

To everyone who actively contributes financially to the life of our St Benedict's Parish. Thank you! Without you we would not be able to operate as a parish.

We know that the only stable and recurring income that our parish receives is from the **support of our Planned Giving Program**. At present, we are not receiving enough income from our Planned Giving to meet the financial cost of running the parish.

There is a need to increase our collections by \$2000 a week in-order-to plug the gap when we are no longer eligible to receive the current level of subsidies from the Archdiocese, which will cease in 2024. Also, as I have said, after a church is built there will be additional operating costs such as insurance, maintenance, utility bills etc.

Please, I am asking every parishioner to commit some of your **TREASURE** and help make our dream become a reality. Our Parish Pledge Card is available at the Mass centre; asking everyone to **commit to the Planned Giving Program**. If you are already in the Planned Giving Program, we are asking you to at least continue and if possible increase your financial support. 500 people on average attend Mass each week and we have 83 families that contribute to the Parish through the Parish Planned Giving Program.
