Who do people say Jesus is?

This is the question Jesus puts to the disciples in this coming Sunday's Gospel. Now, remembering the Gospel of two Sunday's ago, where Jesus walks on the turbulent waters of the sea, and then calms the sea when He gets into the boat. The disciples respond by saying, "truly, you are the Son of God!" (Matthew 14:22-33). This week Peter adds "the Christ" to Jesus' identity. Saying in answer to the above question asked by Jesus, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God" (Matthew 16:16).

Christ, meaning the Anointed One, was the long-awaited Messiah, who was to come and save the Jewish people from foreign occupation. It turns out that Jesus, who Peter rightly declared to be the long-awaited Messiah, was much more than the people expected. Rather than freeing the Jewish people from Roman occupation, Jesus, the Son of the living God, frees all people, not just the Jewish people, from something much greater. Jesus frees us from sin and death! I will have more to say about this in future weeks.

Anointing Mass – Friday September 1, 2023

On Friday September 1 we will be having an Anointing Mass at 9am. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, like all of our sacraments, is a true sacrament instituted by Christ and proclaimed by St James. It is administered by anointing with blessed oil accompanied by prayer. Only a priest can validly administer it. It can be received by any baptised person who has reached the age of reason and need physical, mental, or spiritual healing. Its effect is the strengthening of the soul, often of the body as well, and, in the necessary conditions, the remission of sins. This rite is one way in which the Church continues the healing ministry of Jesus. The healing offered by this anointing is forgiveness of sins, hope and inner peace, sometimes physical healing, and an assurance of God's steadfast love and care. All are welcome!

The Sacrament of Confirmation

We have now had half of our children receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. Congratulations to these children! Please keep these children and their families in your prayers.

This coming Sunday, at both our 8:30am and 5:30pm Masses, the rest of our children will be receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation. As I have said over the last two weeks, these will be Confirmation Masses, with Confirmation readings. Please pray for these children as they take their next step towards being fully initiated into the Catholic Church, being strengthened by the Holy Spirit so that they Transform the world with God's love.

The Annual Catholic Campaign this Weekend

The Annual Catholic Campaign is the one time every year that all of the parishes in the Archdiocese come together to help vital works of our church and the local community, which include supporting the training of our future priests, caring for our elderly, and supporting families impacted by domestic violence, to name a few.

The above quote comes from a Second Vatican Council document Sacrosanctum Concilium, which is the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy (to view this excellent document on the liturgy pleased click **Sacrosanctum** Concilium (vatican.va)).

This week Elizabeth Harrington is explaining the Concluding Rites.

THE CONCLUDING RITES

The Concluding Rites is the shortest and simplest part of the Mass. It consists of: brief **announcements**, the priest's greeting and **blessing** and the **dismissal** of the people.

The **announcements** keep people informed about the various activities and groups operating in the parish and invite them to participate.

Three options are given for the **blessing**: Simple Blessing, where the priest blesses the assembly in the name of Father, Son and Spirit; Solemn Blessing that includes three invocations after each of which the people answer *Amen*; Prayer over the People, which consists of a collect to which the assembly responds *Amen*. These last two are always concluded with a Simple Blessing.

The **dismissal** is not just a way to end the celebration and say farewell to those who have gathered, although both of these are included. It is a commissioning. We who have united ourselves to Christ's sacrifice in the Eucharist are sent out into the world to live the mystery we have just celebrated, to be the Body of Christ in our homes, communities and work places.

Although a hymn is not included among the elements of the Concluding Rites, in most parishes Mass concludes with the singing of a recessional hymn.

Archbishop Mark Coleridge Committed to an Indigenous Voice (from the Catholic Leader 15 February, 2023)

BRISBANE Archbishop Mark Coleridge has spoken out in support of creating an Indigenous Voice to parliament, ahead of an Australian referendum on the subject later this year.

"I'm strongly committed to the Voice. I've listened to important and convincing indigenous voices on this topic," Archbishop Coleridge said.

In September 2021, Archbishop Coleridge publicly endorsed the Uluru Statement From the Heart and made an historic commitment on behalf of the Catholic Church to back indigenous leaders demanding a constitutional voice.

His endorsement was founded on Scripture and a history of dispossession of First Nation peoples.

"God is going to take out of us that heart of stone and give us a heart of flesh – the heart of Jesus... that recognises the other as a human being," Archbishop Coleridge said, standing on Quandamooka country at the Santa Teresa Spirituality Centre in Ormiston, east of Brisbane.

"What has been done to the indigenous peoples of this land could only have been done by denying that they were in fact human – they were at best perhaps subhuman.

"A heart of flesh says no to that, absolutely no."

Australia's first Catholic mission was established in 1843 on Stradbroke Island, not far away, and on Quandamooka Country.


If you are not yet part of our Planned Giving Program, then please join and make a commitment to our Parish. There are three (3) options to financially contribute to the running of the parish. These are:
