#### St Peter Goes from Hero to Zero!

This coming Sunday's Gospel follows on from last week's Gospel. Last week Jesus praised Peter for identifying Jesus as "the Christ, the Son of the living God" (Matthew 16:16). This week Jesus rebukes Peter saying, "get behind me Satan" (Matthew 16:23). Therefore, Peter goes from being hero to zero is a matter of seconds.

Why the fall from grace for Peter? It is because Peter, like many of his temporaries, misunderstood the role of the Christ. As I wrote last week, the Jewish people of Jesus' time expected the Christ to come and save the Jewish people from foreign occupation. It turns out that Jesus was much more than the people expected. Rather than freeing the Jewish people from Roman occupation, Jesus, the Son of the living God, frees all people, not just the Jewish people, from something much greater. Jesus frees us from sin and death!

How does Jesus free us from sin and death? The Paschal Mystery! That is, the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Immediately before Jesus rebukes Peter, "Jesus began to make it clear to his disciples that he was destined to go to Jerusalem and suffer grievously at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes, to be put to death and to be raised up on the third day" (Matthew 16:21-22). Peter responds to Jesus by saying, "Heaven preserve you, Lord, This must not happen to you'" (Matthew 16:23) Then Peter gets firmly rebuked.

Why does Peter get rebuked by Jesus so firmly? Firstly, Peter goes against what Jesus says (not a good idea). Secondly, Peter fails to understand the Paschal Mystery. Jesus then reaffirms the vital importance of the Paschal Mystery by saying, "If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it" (Matthew 16:25) By surrendering ourselves completely to Jesus, as Jesus did to the Father, Jesus frees us from sin (helps us to conquer sin) and gives us eternal life.

#### The Season of Creation (September 1 – October 4)

The Season of Creation from 1<sup>st</sup> September to 4<sup>th</sup> October, the feast of St Francis of Assisi, calls the planet's 2.2 billion Christians to pray and care for God's creation. It's a time to reflect on our relationship with the environment and how our lifestyles and decisions as a society can endanger both the natural world and those inhabiting it, both human and other creatures.

According to Pope Francis, "The Season of Creation offers individual believers and the community a precious opportunity to renew our personal participation in the care of creation, raising to God our thanks for the marvelous works he has entrusted to our care, invoking God's help for the protection of creation and his mercy for the sins committed against the world in which we live."

In his 2015 encyclical *Laudato Si': On Care for Our Common Home,* Pope Francis called the Church and the world to acknowledge the urgency of our environmental challenges and to join him in embarking on a new path. The title of the encyclical comes from its opening words, "Laudato si', mi Signora" or "Praise be to you, my Lord". In the words of this beautiful canticle, Saint Francis of Assisi reminds us that our common home is like a sister with whom we share our life and a beautiful mother who opens her arms to embrace us. While Laudato Si' is the first encyclical to focus on the environment and its destruction in such a comprehensive way, its foundation rests in a long history of Catholic Church teaching on creation.

## The Liturgy is the Source and Summit of the Christian Life (SC 10)

The above quote comes from a Second Vatican Council document Sacrosanctum Concilium, which is the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy (to view this excellent document on the liturgy pleased click <u>Sacrosanctum Concilium (vatican.va)</u>.

This week Elizabeth Harrington explains the Jewish roots of the Eucharist.

#### The Jewish Roots of the Eucharist

To understand how the elements and pattern of the Mass we celebrate today came about, it is helpful to remember that Jesus and his first disciples were all Jews. Unlike their fellow Jews, however, they believed that Jesus was the Christ, the Messiah.

After Pentecost, the Jewish Christians continued to go to the temple to pray. If they were outside of Jerusalem, they would go to the synagogue on the Sabbath and then on Sunday they would gather for a meal, in obedience to Jesus' words to them at the Last Supper "Do this in memory of me".

Because they kept claiming that Jesus was the Messiah, the Jewish Christians were eventually banned from the synagogue, so they started meeting on the Sabbath for their own synagogue service. Like their fellow Jews, they would read from the Jewish Scriptures, hear a sermon, say prayers and sing psalms. But they added to this stories about Jesus, which became the Gospels, and letters from Christian leaders like Paul, what we call the Epistles.

After a while, the need for holding two gatherings on different days was questioned and so they were combined into one which took place on the first day of the week, the day of Christ's resurrection. The pattern of worship the early Jewish Christians followed is the same as that of the Eucharist today - an adapted synagogue service consisting of prayers, readings from scripture, preaching and singing followed by a meal modelled on the last Passover celebrated by Jesus.

#### Catholic Bishops Social Justice Statement 2023-2024

Listen, Learn, Love: A New Engagement with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples Australia's Catholic bishops have called on the nation to seek "a new engagement" with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples in their annual Social Justice Statement being launched today. Since the 1940s, the bishops have published annual statements that urge the Catholic community to reflect and act on social, economic and ecological issues. The statements are published as a focal point for Social Justice Sunday, which will be marked on August 27 this year. This year's statement, Listen, Learn, Love: A New Engagement with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples, will be launched in Western Sydney on Thursday morning by Bishop Vincent Long OFM Conv, chair of the Bishops Commission for Social Justice, Mission and Service. "One of the objectives of this statement is that we want Catholics to understand that Catholic social teaching and Catholic social action are not simply theoretical and academic exercises," he will say. "We hear what God is saying to us about justice by being with our sisters and brothers on the peripheries of society." While the Social Justice Statement is a teaching document of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference, a large part of this year's statement was written by members of the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council. It is part of the message's exhortation to "listen". "Listening is hard. Hearing about young people taking their lives, about so many people ending up in jail, of children still being taken away from their parents and grandparents and about the ongoing racism is tough," Bishop Long will say. "It must be so much more difficult for these people to tell us about their painful experiences. We are deeply grateful to those who shared their stories of pain with us." The theme for this year's statement was chosen in May 2022, well before the Voice to Parliament referendum was mooted and before the timing of a vote was proposed. While the bishops don't suggest how people should vote, Bishop Long says "whatever the outcome of this year's referendum, we ask the Church in Australia to make efforts to lead the way for our fellow Australians" in pursuing reconciliation. "Our attitudes and actions towards First Nations Peoples need to be grounded in justice, love and humility," he will say. "We need to listen with deep respect and learn from them about what needs to be done to improve their situations. We need to walk with them, day by day, and work with them to bring about change for the better - for their people and for all of us. "Strengthening our relationship with our First Peoples is integral and indeed critical to the strengthening of the whole nation." Access the statement at: https://socialjustice.catholic.org.au

" Dear XXXX


Can you set aside a minute? I'm trapped in a meeting and need you to perform a task for me. Cannot speak, need to meet now, so just write back here. Sincerely,
