## **What does the Word "Kingdom" Mean?**

The word "Kingdom" occurs over 160 times in the New Testament. Suffice to say, it is a very important word. So, for the Bible to nourish our faith, it is very important for us to know what the word "Kingdom" means.

The word "Kingdom" in the bible is the translation of the Ancient Greek word "Basileia." According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC), Basileia means kingship, kingdom or reign (CCC 2816). Added to that, from a purely etymological viewpoint, the word "Basileia" is believed to have derived from the Greek word for "base" or "foundation". So, combining these two relevant pieces of information, one could say "kingdom" means God reigning in our hearts and minds, being the foundation of our lives. This makes perfect sense to me.

In this coming Sunday's Gospel, Jesus is on the attack with the chief priests and elders of the people. He uses a parable of the Two Sons. One who after an initial refusal ends up doing his father's will, while the other failed to carry out what he had initially promised. Jesus then applies this parable to the chief priests and elders, who are not accepting Jesus as the foundation of their lives (the Kingdom), negatively comparing them with people who had previously been prostitutes and tax collectors (sinners), and now except Jesus as the foundation of their lives (Kingdom people).

This confuses the chief priests and elders for they are living according to the law of Moses. Unfortunately, they do not understand the importance of allowing God to rule in their hearts and minds, not only so that they can fulfill the requirements of the law, but so they can also (and more importantly) be good people. Let us allow Jesus to reign in our hearts and minds so that we can not only do the will of God, but do it with love, joy, and peace.

## **The Season of Creation (September 1 – October 4)**

The Season of Creation from 1<sup>st</sup> September to 4<sup>th</sup> October, the feast of St Francis of Assisi, calls the planet's 2.2 billion Christians to pray and care for God's creation. It's a time to reflect on our relationship with the environment and how our lifestyles and decisions as a society can endanger both the natural world and those inhabiting it, both human and other creatures.

This year's Season of Creation theme is: "Let Justice and Peace Flow." And the symbol is a river. God says through the Prophet Isaiah, "Listen carefully, I am about to do a new thing, now it will spring forth; will you not be aware of it? I will even put a road in the wilderness, rivers in the desert." (Isaiah 43:19)

According to the Season of Creation website:

*Biodiversity is being lost at a rate not seen since the last mass extinction. The futures of young people are threatened by the cascading impacts of the loss of biodiversity and changing climate.*

*The urgency grows and we must make visible peace with Earth and on Earth, at the same time that justice calls us to metanoia and a change of attitude and actions. As we join the river of justice and peace with others then hope is created instead of despair.*

The words of the familiar hymn express it well: "Go now you are sent forth to live what you proclaim, to show the world you follow Christ in fact, not just in name".

### **Catholic Bishops Social Justice Statement 2023-2024**

**Listen, Learn, Love: A New Engagement with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples**  
Australia's Catholic bishops have called on the nation to seek "a new engagement" with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples in their annual Social Justice Statement being launched today. Since the 1940s, the bishops have published annual statements that urge the Catholic community to reflect and act on social, economic and ecological issues. The statements are published as a focal point for Social Justice Sunday, which will be marked on August 27 this year. This year's statement, Listen, Learn, Love: A New Engagement with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples, will be launched in Western Sydney on Thursday morning by Bishop Vincent Long OFM Conv, chair of the Bishops Commission for Social Justice, Mission and Service. "One of the objectives of this statement is that we want Catholics to understand that Catholic social teaching and Catholic social action are not simply theoretical and academic exercises," he will say. "We hear what God is saying to us about justice by being with our sisters and brothers on the peripheries of society." While the Social Justice Statement is a teaching document of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference, a large part of this year's statement was written by members of the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council. It is part of the message's exhortation to "listen". "Listening is hard. Hearing about young people taking their lives, about so many people ending up in jail, of children still being taken away from their parents and grandparents and about the ongoing racism is tough," Bishop Long will say. "It must be so much more difficult for these people to tell us about their painful experiences. We are deeply grateful to those who shared their stories of pain with us." The theme for this year's statement was chosen in May 2022, well before the Voice to Parliament referendum was mooted and before the timing of a vote was proposed. While the bishops don't suggest how people should vote, Bishop Long says "whatever the outcome of this year's referendum, we ask the Church in Australia to make efforts to lead the way for our fellow Australians" in pursuing reconciliation. "Our attitudes and actions towards First Nations Peoples need to be grounded in justice, love and humility," he will say. "We need to listen with deep respect and learn from them about what needs to be done to improve their situations. We need to walk with them, day by day, and work with them to bring about change for the better – for their people and for all of us. "Strengthening our relationship with our First Peoples is integral and indeed critical to the strengthening of the whole nation." Access the statement at: <https://socialjustice.catholic.org.au>

Can you set aside a minute? I'm trapped in a meeting and need you to perform a task for me. Cannot speak, need to meet now, so just write back here.

Fr XXXX XXXX Parish Priest

The follow up messages attempt to persuade you that the priests' urgent need can only be solved by the purchase of iTunes or Amazon cards or similar.

Please be assured that the Archbishop or any clergy operating within the Archdiocese of Brisbane would never have need to approach you in this way or be seeking monetary help via the purchase of gift or store retail cards.

To everyone who actively contributes financially to the life of our St Benedict's Parish. Thank you! Without you we would not be able to operate as a parish.

We know that the only stable and recurring income that our parish receives is from the **support of our Planned Giving Program**. At present, we are not receiving enough income from our Planned Giving to meet the financial cost of running the parish.

**There is a need to increase our collections by \$2000 a week** in-order-to plug the gap when we are no longer eligible to receive the current level of subsidies from the Archdiocese, which will cease in 2024. Also, as I have said, after a church is built there will be additional operating costs such as insurance, maintenance, utility bills etc.

Please, I am asking every parishioner to commit some of your **TREASURE** and help make our dream become a reality. Our Parish Pledge Card is available at the Mass centre; asking everyone to **commit to the Planned Giving Program**. If you are already in the Planned Giving Program, we are asking you to at least continue and if possible increase your financial support. 500 people on average attend Mass each week and we have 83 families that contribute to the Parish through the Parish Planned Giving Program.
