The Power of Forgiveness!

In the first reading for this coming Sunday, the Wisdom of God says, "Resentment and anger, these are foul things...Forgive your neighbour the hurt he does you...Stop hating...do not bear your neighbour ill-will...and overlook the offence." (Sirach 27:30-28:7) Nelson Mandella, a man of faith, who bravely spoke out against Apartheid in his beloved South Africa, lived out this wisdom of God brilliantly.

Apartheid was a system of institutionalised racial segregation that existed in South Africa from 1948 to the early 1990s. Apartheid was characterised by an authoritarian political culture, which ensured that South Africa was dominated politically, socially, and economically by the nation's dominant minority white population. According to this system, white citizens had much higher status than Black Africans. In fact, the Black Africans were treated terribly.

Nelson Mandela bravely spoke out against this grossly racist system of government and, as is often the case when people dissent against an authoritarian government, was banished to a very cruel and uncomfortable prison for many years. Eventually international pressure dismantled the Apartheid system of government in South Africa, and Mandela was released from prison and continued to be a great leader.

I can remember watching Nelson Mandela in a press conference not long after he was released from prison (it seems like yesterday). A journalist asked him, "How do you feel about the people who unjustly put you in that miserable prison for so any years?" To which Mandela serenely replied, "I forgive them." The journalist then asked, "How can you forgive the people who treated you and your people so terribly for so many years?" Mandela calmly answered the journalist again by saying, "If I don't forgive them, then I would still be in prison."

Mandela was clearly referring to the prison of resentment and anger, the prison of hatred, the prison of ill-will towards one's neighbour, the terrible prison that depletes us of life and peace, and in which the power of forgiveness frees us.

We welcome once again at our Masses this weekend Fr Joe Duffy, who is a wonderful gift to our St Benedict's Parish. Thank you Father Joe for supporting and connecting so beautifully with our Parish.

The Season of Creation (September 1 – October 4)

The Season of Creation from 1st September to 4th October, the feast of St Francis of Assisi, calls the planet's 2.2 billion Christians to pray and care for God's creation. It's a time to reflect on our relationship with the environment and how our lifestyles and decisions as a society can endanger both the natural world and those inhabiting it, both human and other creatures.

This year's Season of Creation theme is: "Let Justice and Peace Flow." And the symbol is a river. God says through the Prophet Isaiah, "Listen carefully, I am about to do a new thing, now it will spring forth; will you not be aware of it? I will even put a road in the wilderness, rivers in the desert." (Isaiah 43:19)

According to the Season of Creation website:

Biodiversity is being lost at a rate not seen since the last mass extinction. The futures of young people are threatened by the cascading impacts of the loss of biodiversity and changing climate.

The urgency grows and we must make visible peace with Earth and on Earth, at the same time that justice calls us to metanoia and a change of attitude and actions. As we join the river of justice and peace with others then hope is created instead of despair.

Catholic Bishops Social Justice Statement 2023-2024

Listen, Learn, Love: A New Engagement with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples

Australia's Catholic bishops have called on the nation to seek "a new engagement" with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples in their annual Social Justice Statement being launched today. Since the 1940s, the bishops have published annual statements that urge the Catholic community to reflect and act on social, economic and ecological issues. The statements are published as a focal point for Social Justice Sunday, which will be marked on August 27 this year. This year's statement, Listen, Learn, Love: A New Engagement with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples, will be launched in Western Sydney on Thursday morning by Bishop Vincent Long OFM Conv, chair of the Bishops Commission for Social Justice, Mission and Service. "One of the objectives of this statement is that we want Catholics to understand that Catholic social teaching and Catholic social action are not simply theoretical and academic exercises," he will say. "We hear what God is saying to us about justice by being with our sisters and brothers on the peripheries of society." While the Social Justice Statement is a teaching document of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference, a large part of this year's statement was written by members of the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council. It is part of the message's exhortation to "listen". "Listening is hard. Hearing about young people taking their lives, about so many people ending up in jail, of children still being taken away from their parents and grandparents and about the ongoing racism is tough," Bishop Long will say. "It must be so much more difficult for these people to tell us about their painful experiences. We are deeply grateful to those who shared their stories of pain with us." The theme for this year's statement was chosen in May 2022, well before the Voice to Parliament referendum was mooted and before the timing of a vote was proposed. While the bishops don't suggest how people should vote, Bishop Long says "whatever the outcome of this year's referendum, we ask the Church in Australia to make efforts to lead the way for our fellow Australians" in pursuing reconciliation. "Our attitudes and actions towards First Nations Peoples need to be grounded in justice, love and humility," he will say. "We need to listen with deep respect and learn from them about what needs to be done to improve their situations. We need to walk with them, day by day, and work with them to bring about change for the better - for their people and for all of us. "Strengthening our relationship with our First Peoples is integral and indeed critical to the strengthening of the whole nation." Access the statement at: https://socialjustice.catholic.org.au



There is a need to increase our collections by \$2000 a week in-order-to plug the gap when we are no longer eligible to receive the current level of subsidies from the Archdiocese, which will cease in 2024. 
If you are not yet part of our Planned Giving Program, then please join and make a commitment to our Parish. There are three (3) options to financially contribute to the running of the parish. These are:
