Sister Carolina - A True Missionary

Sr Carolina is a missionary Nun, who serves our sisters and brothers in Timor-Leste. As Sr Carolina walks through the streets of the village of Venilale, she is greeted by everyone that passers her by, many calling her closer to share a personal update. She knows each of their names, their families and their stories. Some, she's known since they were children, and others, she'd provided care for their parents. The love of Christ shines brightly through Sr Carolina's warmth and care. Sr Carolina is clearly glorifying God by her life.

There are Good News stories happening every left, right, and centre in this village thanks to Sr Carolina and her fellow Nuns' beautiful works. For example, families like Petrolina's, who is ever grateful for the care the Sisters provided to her daughter Vitoria after a diagnosis of tuberculosis and having nowhere to turn. Vitoria now takes her children for care at The Maria Auxiliadora Clinic as she's struggled to find better care elsewhere.

Then there is Olinda, who worked with her husband, the former chief of the village, as collaborators with the Sisters, referring local residents to the Clinic when their people presented with illness. Since government clinics were either too far away or provided limited or no follow-up services, Olinda found the Sisters' clinic invaluable.

Another Good News story concerns Santina, a grandmother whose grandson Jose had been left to her care. With Jose experiencing malnutrition, Santina turned to the Clinic to provide milk and care for him, and she still visits when needed today.

Another good story concerns Cesario who has sole care of his 7-year-old daughter after her mother passed away shortly after childbirth. Lacking nutrient rich milk for his daughter and unable to afford formula, he turned to Sr Carolina and the Clinic. Of his experience, Cesario shared, "I wish the facility could be extended to help more people."

Lines of people wait to be seen by Sr Carolina and her staff each day, many who had walked or taken a motorbike or travelled long distances. They come to the Clinic because they know that Sr Carolina and her staff know their names, their families, and their stories. And they will do whatever is in their means to do to help.

This is the heart of mission – knowing people, being with people, loving people, and extending an invitation.

We have an opportunity over the next two weekends to support World Mission Month and help Sr Carolina employ another nurse at the Clinic to assist more people, or purchase life-saving medication that families like Petrolina's need, or milk and food for babies with undernutrition like Jose.

At the 8:30am and 5:30pm Masses this coming Sunday, and at the 4pm Mass on Saturday October 21, Xavier Campbell from St Benedict's College (also a cherished parishioner) will be encouraging us to support Catholic Mission. Urging us to financially help and support many similar mission initiatives like Sr Carolina's around the world. By supporting Catholic Mission and their incredible projects, we will be answering God's call for us as Christians to bear an abundance of good fruit and glorify God by our lives. Please give generously.

Christ's Presence at Mass (Elizabeth Harrington)

A key paragraph of the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy says:

Christ is present in the sacrifice of the Mass, not only in the person of his minister, but especially under the eucharistic elements. He is present in his word, since it is he himself who speaks when the holy Scriptures are read in the Church. He is present when the Church prays and sings, for he promised: "Where two or three are gathered together in my name, there I am in the midst of them". (CSL #7)

During the Eucharistic Prayer, we pay attention to the words prayed on our behalf by the presider and join in the responses. The sacred species are handled with care and respect. Everything speaks of honour and reverence for Christ's real presence in the consecrated elements.

Because it is Christ himself who speaks when the scriptures are proclaimed at Mass, we must also give our full attention to the Liturgy of the Word. The lectionary (the book of readings) needs to be attractive and handled with reverence.

Christ is present in those with whom we worship, so we sit with others and acknowledge their presence, share the sign of peace graciously and join wholeheartedly in the responses, gestures and singing.

Actions speak louder than words. It should be clear in what we do and how we do it that we truly believe that Christ is present when we worship together, not only in the sacred elements but also in the assembly, in the word and in the priest presider.

Altar Servers Training -8am Sunday October 22, before the 8:30am Mass

We are looking at reintroducing Altar Servers at our St Benedict Parish Masses. This is a very important ministry that adds to the reverence of the Mass.

If you (or your child or your grandchild) have received their First Holy Communion and are interested in being an Altar Server, please come along to our training session at 8am on Sunday October 22. It would be great if we could get this very important ministry started again.

Receiving from the Chalice

We are encouraged to receive Holy Communion from the Chalice at our Masses. However, we need volunteers to be Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion of the Chalice specifically. This role will involve:

- distributing the Chalice at our Masses,
- consuming the Blood of Christ remaining, and
- purifying the vessels.

"With Expectant Hearts" is a new 22-day reflection resource that can be used during Advent by individuals and groups.


Its main purpose is to help us to find a few minutes each day to practice what it means to sit with God and to trust God to lead us forward.

Sincerely.

The follow up messages attempt to persuade you that the priests' urgent need can only be solved by the purchase of I Tunes or Amazon cards or similar.

Please be assured that the Archbishop or any clergy operating within the Archdiocese of Brisbane would never have need to approach you in this way or be seeking monetary help via the purchase of gift or store retail cards.

Hitting the delete button is the best way to deal with these pests and scam artists. Should you be concerned, or should you receive this type of message, please contact your Parish Office.

Financially Supporting Our St Benedict's Parish

To everyone who actively contributes financially to the life of our St Benedict's Parish. Thank you! Without you we would not be able to operate as a parish.

We know that the only stable and recurring income that our parish receives is from the support of our Planned Giving Program. At present, we are not receiving enough income from our Planned Giving to meet the financial cost of running the parish.

There is a need to increase our collections by \$2000 a week inorder-to plug the gap when we are no longer eligible to receive the current level of subsidies from the Archdiocese, which will cease in 2024. Also, as I have said, after a church is built there will be additional operating costs such as insurance, maintenance, utility bills etc.

Please, I am asking every parishioner to commit some of your TREASURE and help make our dream become a reality. Our Parish Pledge Card is available at the Mass centre; asking everyone to commit to the Planned Giving Program. If you are already in the Planned Giving Program, we are asking you to at least continue and if possible increase your financial support. 500 people on average attend Mass each week and we have 83 families that contribute to the Parish through the Parish Planned Giving Program.

If you are not yet part of our Planned Giving Program, then please join and make a commitment to our Parish. There are three (3) options to financially contribute to the running of the parish. These are:

- 1. Direct Debit or 2. Credit Card or 3. Giving Envelopes On this Pledge Card we will have an opportunity to support both:
