STATEMENT ON THE REFERENDUM VOTE

Now that the referendum result is known, it's time to look forward rather than look back. There will be a time for looking back, but a cooling off period may be needed if we are to see more clearly. Now is the time to ask not how we got here but where this result leaves us as a nation, where we need to go from here and how we might get there.

One thing is clear: the nation is more divided than ever and in many ways. It's ironic that a process supposed to unite the nation has done just the opposite. There's an urgent need now to create a new kind of national unity, and that can't be left to the politicians, because there's more to this than politics. The task belongs to all of us.

A second thing is still clearer and more urgent: the search for reconciliation based on truth and justice must continue, even if the referendum process and result have made that more difficult. This too is something that can't be left to the politicians, because again there's more to it than politics.

After this result at Federal level, the focus will have to move to the States. But it will also have to move to non-government organisations like the Churches. The Australian Catholic bishops have spoken of the need for a new engagement with Indigenous peoples, and that now becomes more pressing. In the Archdiocese of Brisbane we will commit ourselves more resolutely to our Reconciliation Action Plan and keep asking what else we can do. Fine words and symbolic gestures are not enough.

The process leading to this vote has been a highly politicised slog that has changed Australia, and not for the better. Now the real work begins. It's up to all of us to ensure that what we do from here serves national unity and racial justice, because we'll never have the first unless we have the second.

We Belong to God - Who loves Us Infinitely

In this coming Sunday's Gospel, Jesus reinforces our call to give ourselves up totally to God, if we want to live our lives well. Jesus says, "give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar, and to God, what belongs to God."

What belongs to God? Well, we all do. A very clear key theme in the Scriptures is the covenantal promise, which we read time and time again in the Old Testament, "I will be your God, and you will be my people." And the Lord says to us through the prophet Isaiah, "I love you, and you are mine" (Isaiah 43:1-7). Also, through our baptism in Christ, God tells us that we are God's beloved sons and daughters in whom God delights (Mark 1:9-11).

So, we belong to God, and Jesus tells us in today's Gospel to give to God, what belongs to God. Calling us to give ourselves up totally to God. This is what Jesus did, leading us to everlasting life in God. And now the Risen Jesus is our companion, helping us to give ourselves totally to God. For life lived in the Lord, is life lived to the full. This is strongly emphasised in this coming Sunday's first reading where God very clearly assures us, "that apart from Me (God), all is nothing!" (Isaiah 45:6).

Day of Prayer for Peace and Reconciliation - Tuesday October 24, 2023.

The leaders of the Catholic Church in the Middle East have pleaded for our prayers. They say, "The pain and dismay at what is happening is great. Once again, we find ourselves in the midst of a political and military crisis. We have suddenly been catapulted into a sea of unprecedented violence. The hatred, which we have unfortunately already been experiencing for too long, will increase even more, and the ensuing spiral of violence will create more destruction. Everything seems to speak of death.

Yet, in this time of sorry and dismay, we do not want to remain helpless. We cannot let death and its sting be the only word we hear ((1 Cor 15:55). That is why we feel the need to pray, to turn our hearts to God. Only in this way we can draw the strength and serenity needed to endure these hard times, by turning to God, in prayer and intercession, to implore and cry out to God amidst this anguish." (Letter from the Ordinaries of the Holy Land).

In solidarity with our sisters and brothers in the Holy Land, let us designate **Tuesday October** 24 as a day of fasting, abstinence, and prayer for peace and reconciliation in the Middle East and Ukraine. As a parish, we will be having Eucharistic Adoration, the Rosary, and Benediction from 6pm-7pm in our worship space. All are invited to join us to pray for our sisters and brothers, who are in desperate need of our prayers at this time. Please extend your invitation to anyone you know affected by this terrible crisis in the Middle East.

This year's Advent resource invites us to explore more deeply what it means to allow God to come to birth in us. The spiritual nourishment God seeks to give us now will come to birth in us through the entire year if we can open our hearts in response to it.


To receive the Sacraments of:-




October, the Month of the Holy Rosary.

We know that the only stable and recurring income that our parish receives is from the support of our Planned Giving Program. At present, we are not receiving enough income from our Planned Giving to meet the financial cost of running the parish.

There is a need to increase our collections by \$2000 a week inorder-to plug the gap when we are no longer eligible to receive the current level of subsidies from the Archdiocese, which will cease in 2024. Also, as I have said, after a church is built there will be additional operating costs such as insurance, maintenance, utility bills etc.

Please, I am asking every parishioner to commit some of your **TREASURE** and help make our dream become a reality. Our Parish Pledge Card is available at the Mass centre; asking everyone to commit to the Planned Giving Program. If you are already in the Planned Giving Program, we are asking you to at least continue and if possible increase your financial support. 500 people on average attend Mass each week and we have 83 families that contribute to the Parish through the Parish Planned Giving Program.
