# Called to be People of Justice, Mercy, and Peace

In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus quotes Hosea 6:6 twice. That is, "What I (God) want is mercy, not sacrifice" (Hosea 6:6; Matt 9:13 and 12:7). This suggests that being people of justice, mercy, and peace is very important for disciples of Jesus.

Jesus in this coming Sunday's gospel affirms this point. Interpreting Jesus' parable allegorically, the landowner is God, the vineyard is the House of Israel (as the Psalm for this Sunday makes clear), the tenants are the people of Israel (particularly the Jewish authorities), the servants, who were thrashed, killed, and stoned, are the prophets, and the son, whom they killed, is Jesus. Ironically, the Jewish authorities in debate with Jesus, say that when the owner of the vineyard comes "he will bring those wretches to a wretched end and lease the vineyard to other tenants who will deliver the produce to him when the season arrives" (Matt 21:41). This produce, or fruit, are works of justice, mercy, and peace.

The prophets were persecuted and killed for they were communicating God's message of justice, mercy, and peace, which the authorities of their day clearly did not like. Jesus was scourge and crucified for the same reason. In this coming Sunday's Gospel, Jesus calls us to be people of justice, mercy, and peace regardless of the suffering we may endure for doing so. Let us put Jesus, the Keystone, at the centre of our lives. So that we can bear abundant fruit by being people of justice, mercy, and peace.

# Elizabeth Harrington - DOING THE WORK OF LITURGY, Part 2.

This week Elizabeth Harrington is explaining and enhancing our experience of our Liturgy.

The last bulletin insert talked of the work that we all do during liturgy such as singing, praying, standing and processing. But a lot of other work happens before, during and after Mass that many people are not aware of.

Before Mass, there are the tasks of preparing homilies, choosing prayers and music, rostering readers, musicians and communion ministers, practising music and readings, decorating the church with flowers and banners. Someone has to put out the books, bread, wine, vessels, and other items that are needed, and mark the Missal and Lectionary.

During Mass, some parishioners play instruments, lead the singing, proclaim the scriptures, serve at the altar, take up collections, bring up the gifts of bread and wine, and help distribute Communion.

After Mass, books, newsletters, etc need to be collected and put away, communion plates and cups washed and dried. Church linen like purifiers and altar cloths has to be washed and ironed regularly.

These numerous tasks are often left to a few willing workers. The old saying is that many hands make light work. Here are some ways that you might consider lending a hand:

- Help give out hymn books and newsletters and greet people as they arrive for Mass.
- If you like to sing, enquire about joining the singing group at your church.
- Most importantly, show gratitude. A word of thanks to presiders, musicians, readers, sacristans, etc will be greatly appreciated as sadly the only feedback many ever get is a criticism or complaint.

Catholic community to reflect and act on social, economic and ecological issues. The statements are published as a focal point for Social Justice Sunday, which will be marked on August 27 this year. This year's statement, Listen, Learn, Love: A New Engagement with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples, will be launched in Western Sydney on Thursday morning by Bishop Vincent Long OFM Conv, chair of the Bishops Commission for Social Justice, Mission and Service. "One of the objectives of this statement is that we want Catholics to understand that Catholic social teaching and Catholic social action are not simply theoretical and academic exercises," he will say. "We hear what God is saying to us about justice by being with our sisters and brothers on the peripheries of society." While the Social Justice Statement is a teaching document of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference, a large part of this year's statement was written by members of the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council. It is part of the message's exhortation to "listen". "Listening is hard. Hearing about young people taking their lives, about so many people ending up in jail, of children still being taken away from their parents and grandparents and about the ongoing racism is tough," Bishop Long will say. "It must be so much more difficult for these people to tell us about their painful experiences. We are deeply grateful to those who shared their stories of pain with us." The theme for this year's statement was chosen in May 2022, well before the Voice to Parliament referendum was mooted and before the timing of a vote was proposed. While the bishops don't suggest how people should vote, Bishop Long says "whatever the outcome of this year's referendum, we ask the Church in Australia to make efforts to lead the way for our fellow Australians" in pursuing reconciliation. "Our attitudes and actions towards First Nations Peoples need to be grounded in justice, love and humility," he will say. "We need to listen with deep respect and learn from them about what needs to be done to improve their situations. We need to walk with them, day by day, and work with them to bring about change for the better - for their people and for all of us. "Strengthening our relationship with our First Peoples is integral and indeed critical to the strengthening of the whole nation." Access the statement at: https://socialjustice.catholic.org.au



\* If the you are required to hold or renew your Blue Card/Police Check, our Parish Office will be in contact with you directly. Thank



Can you set aside a minute? I'm trapped in a meeting and need you to perform a task for me. Cannot speak, need to meet now, so just write back here.

Sincerely.

Fr XXXX XXXX Parish Priest

The follow up messages attempt to persuade you that the priests' urgent need can only be solved by the purchase of I Tunes or Amazon cards or similar.

Please be assured that the Archbishop or any clergy operating within the Archdiocese of Brisbane would never have need to approach you in this way or be seeking monetary help via the purchase of gift or store retail cards.

Hitting the delete button is the best way to deal with these pests and scam artists. Should you be concerned, or should you receive this type of message, please contact your Parish Office.


# **Covid-19 Awareness**—Thank you for your commitment.

# **Financially Supporting Our St Benedict's Parish**

To everyone who actively contributes financially to the life of our St Benedict's Parish. Thank you! Without you we would not be able to operate as a parish.

We know that the only stable and recurring income that our parish receives is from the **support of our Planned Giving Program**. At present, we are not receiving enough income from our Planned Giving to meet the financial cost of running the parish.

There is a need to increase our collections by \$2000 a week inorder-to plug the gap when we are no longer eligible to receive the current level of subsidies from the Archdiocese, which will cease in 2024. Also, as I have said, after a church is built there will be additional operating costs such as insurance, maintenance, utility bills etc.

Please, I am asking every parishioner to commit some of your TREASURE and help make our dream become a reality. Our Parish Pledge Card is available at the Mass centre; asking everyone to commit to the Planned Giving Program. If you are already in the Planned Giving Program, we are asking you to at least continue and if possible increase your financial support. 500 people on average attend Mass each week and we have 83 families that contribute to the Parish through the Parish Planned Giving Program.

If you are not yet part of our Planned Giving Program, then please join and make a commitment to our Parish. There are three (3) options to financially contribute to the running of the parish. These are:

- **1. Direct Debit or 2. Credit Card or 3. Giving Envelopes** On this Pledge Card we will have an opportunity to support both:
- \* The Parish (Running) Collection, which supports the expenses incurred for the day-to-day, efficient and effective running of the parish. (Leases, Wages, Supplies)
- \* The Building (Church) Donation, which supports our purchasing/building of assets, which include our future church, offices, and an adult faith formation/gathering space.
