Christ the King

On the last Sunday of the liturgical year (26th November this year) the Church celebrates the solemnity of Christ the King, or "Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe", as it is now called in the Roman calendar. The feast was instituted by Pius IX in 1925 as a way of countering the increasing atheism and secularisation of society. It was an assertion of Christ's sovereignty over all human societies and institutions.

Some people might have problems with the language and imagery used in the texts for this celebration, believing that words like 'king' and 'kingdom' carry patriarchal and authoritarian connotations that are incompatible with Christianity and would prefer an image that speaks less of power and authority.

The kingship of Christ is not about the power or splendor often associated with royalty. The Preface for the Feast describes Christ's Kingdom as "a kingdom of truth and life, a kingdom of holiness and grace, a kingdom of justice, love and peace".

With so much conflict across the world at present, the Prayer over the Offerings is very appropriate: "As we offer you, O Lord, the sacrifice by which the human race is reconciled to you, we humbly pray that your Son himself may bestow on all nations the gifts of unity and peace".

In the Prayer after Communion we look forward to eternal life with Christ our King: "Having received the food of immortality, we ask, O Lord, that we may live with him eternally in his heavenly Kingdom." (Elizabeth Harrington).

Our Last Sunday with the Gospel of Matthew

Year A of the Liturgical Year comes to an end this coming Sunday, which also means that we hear from Matthew's Gospel for the last time for a while. So, this is a good time to reflect on the spiritual nourishment we received from Matthew's Gospel this year to enhance our relationship with God.

In introducing the Penitential Rite at many of our Masses this year, I would say, "To prepare ourselves to celebrate the sacred mysteries, let us turn to our wonderful God, who is a God of mercy, a God who saves." The God of mercy, the God who saves, is very much the God of Matthew's Gospel. It is only in Matthew's gospel that we hear Jesus gently invite us with the words, "Come to me all you who labor and are overburdened..." (Matthew 11:28-30).

In Matthew's gospel, as disciples of Jesus, we are clearly called by Jesus to join Jesus in these works of mercy and salvation for the world. Jesus' Great Commission at the end of Matthew's Gospel calls us to go out to the whole world and spread the Good News of Jesus to others, while at the same time Jesus assures us that He is with us, helping us to live the gospel and spread it!

Now to live the gospel, according to Jesus in Matthew's Gospel, we need to be people of mercy. Jesus quotes Hosea 6:6 twice in Matthew's Gospel, "What I want is mercy not sacrifice." (Matthew 9:13; 12:7). Then, in this coming Sunday's Gospel, Jesus goes as far as to identify Himself with the hungry, the thirsty, the stranger, the naked, the sick, and those in prison. And calls us to do all we can to help these people in communion with Him, that is, to live the gospel.

On Sunday December 3, the First Sunday of Advent Year B, we will begin to be nourished by Mark's Gospel. I have a Clergy In-Service on Mark's Gospel this coming Friday, so I look forward to setting the scene for Mark's Gospel next week.

Our Advent Resource - With Expectant Hearts

I have read this year's Advent resource, With Expectant Hearts, and it is excellent!

The book covers personal prayer for the four weeks of Advent. Week 1 starting on Sunday December 3, and Week 4 finishing on Sunday December 24.

It is very important for us to come together every now and again to support each other in the faith. Our St Benedict's Prayer Network is always providing us with opportunities to this. This Advent they have organised an Advent Group to gather at 7pm for the four weeks of Advent on Wednesday evenings on zoom.

In preparation for our Advent Group gatherings, we need to read and reflect on the Advent resource for the upcoming Sunday. Then we will gather for an Opening Prayer, to read the whole Gospel for the coming Sunday, and read the reflection. Then we will discuss insights or questions that the respective readings raise. And we conclude with a Closing Prayer and blessing.



Financially Supporting Our St Benedict's Parish

To everyone who actively contributes financially to the life of our St Benedict's Parish. Thank you! Without you we would not be able to operate as a parish.

We know that the only stable and recurring income that our parish receives is from the **support of our Planned Giving Program**. At present, we are not receiving enough income from our Planned Giving to meet the financial cost of running the parish.

There is a need to increase our collections by \$2000 a week inorder-to plug the gap when we are no longer eligible to receive the current level of subsidies from the Archdiocese, which will cease in 2024. Also, as I have said, after a church is built there will be additional operating costs such as insurance, maintenance, utility bills etc.

Please, I am asking every parishioner to commit some of your TREASURE and help make our dream become a reality. Our Parish Pledge Card is available at the Mass centre; asking everyone to commit to the Planned Giving Program. If you are already in the Planned Giving Program, we are asking you to at least continue and if possible increase your financial support. 500 people on average attend Mass each week and we have 83 families that contribute to the Parish through the Parish Planned Giving Program.

If you are not yet part of our Planned Giving Program, then please join and make a commitment to our Parish. There are three (3) options to financially contribute to the running of the parish. These are:
