# North Lakes, Mango Hill & Griffin

#### Salvation has Arrived!

It is by no accident that the author of Mark starts his account of the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God, with a quote attributed to Isaiah. For through the prophet Isaiah, God communicated that God will come into the world to save it! (Isaiah 40-55).

Many of us have perhaps wrongly thought that John the Baptist is the main character in this coming Sunday's gospel, but no, Isaiah is the main character. For Isaiah prophesied that God would come into the world to save the world. The appearance of John the Baptist points to this long-awaited arrival of the Divine entering the world to build us up, to raise us up from our human flaws and weaknesses, enabling us to live to our full potential as human beings.

Now that we know that God is entering the world through the person of Jesus, to save us, it is very important to reflect on John the Baptist, where he appears, and his urgent calling for us all.

We know John the Baptist was born into a faith-filled family. His mother Elizabeth was Our Heavenly Mother Mary's cousin, and there is that beautiful encounter they have in Luke's gospel where they are both praising God for the conception of their children, and the positive impact these children will make on the world. John the Baptist's father, Zachariah, was a priest who devoted his life to serving God in the temple. Elizabeth and Zachariah clearly brought their son up in a deep and intimate relationship with God, for John was clearly a man of strong faith, a man of integrity.

John the Baptist is also depicted in this coming Sunday's gospel as a man of great humility. Rightly acknowledging that Jesus, who is God, is much greater than he is. Also, he dressed and ate in a very understated way.

John the Baptist appears in the wilderness/desert. The wilderness symbolises detachment and journey. Detachment from the things of the world that distract us from living our lives in relationship with God. Journeying with God, who gives us life in abundance through the outpouring of ourselves totally to God, who gets us to pour ourselves out completely for each other.

John the Baptist's urgent message is to "Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight." (Mark 1:3). Here John is identifying Jesus as God (Kyrios), urging us to prepare ourselves to receive God fully into our lives. He then goes on to call us to turn around our lives (repent) and be washed clean of the behaviours that block God out of our lives (sin). For Jesus is coming to immerse (baptise) us in into the life of God.

May we pay heed to John the Baptist, a great witness to the faith, and his words, which urge us to embrace God fully in our lives for our own good, and for the good of the world (salvation).

#### Second Rite of Reconciliation - Tuesday 12th December 7pm.


We will be having a **Second Rite of Reconciliation** this Advent. The celebration of this sacrament will take place on **Tuesday December 12 at 7pm in our worship space.** This will be a very good opportunity for us to eliminate any barriers in our lives that are preventing us from receiving Jesus more fully into our lives. Like all our celebrations, everyone is most welcome!

#### Anointing (Healing) Mass – Friday December 8

Tomorrow, on Friday December 8, we will be celebrating an Anointing (Healing) Mass at 9am. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, like all our sacraments, was instituted by Jesus and proclaimed by St James. It is administered by anointing with blessed oil accompanied by prayer.

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick can be received by any baptised person who has reached the age of reason and is in need of physical, mental or spiritual healing. This rite is one way in which the Church continues the healing ministry of Jesus. The healing offered by this anointing is forgiveness of sins, hope and inner peace, sometimes physical healing, and an assurance of God's steadfast love and care. All are welcome!

#### Advent



In Advent the Church's attention is on the three comings of Christ: in the past at his birth at Bethlehem, in the present, and at his Second Coming in the future.

The season features three key figures – the prophet Isaiah, John the Baptist, the Virgin Mary.

#### Advent has three distinct stages:

- \* the first focuses on the end of time when Christ will come again in glory
- \* the second focuses on John the Baptist heralding Jesus' public ministry
- \* the last focuses on Jesus' birth and the role of Mary in salvation history.

The word 'advent' means 'waiting' and the season of Advent is a time of waiting. But how do we wait for God? We wait with patience. Patience does not mean passivity. Waiting patiently is not like waiting for the bus to come, the rain to stop, or the doctor to see us. It is an active waiting in which we live the present moment to the full in order to find there the signs of the


