"Let it be done to me according to your word." (Luke 1:38)

The Fourth Sunday of Advent places the spotlight on Mary, for Mary obviously has a very important part to play in the birth of our Lord, which we will celebrate with great joy very soon.

In this coming Sunday's Gospel, we hear the Gospel account of the Annunciation where "the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the House of David; and the virgin's name was Mary." (Luke 1:26-27).

In this beautiful and much painted scene, the greatest miracle of all time is announced. God enters our history by becoming one of us. God becomes a person that we can embrace and be embraced by. The great divine mystery behind and beyond our world has become a human being. No other religion dares to make so bold a claim. Even as we listen to this announcement in Sunday's Gospel, it is important to realise that it was only possible to make such a claim in the light of Jesus' life, death and resurrection. It was the life of this man, culminating in the Easter events that led a group of Jewish men and women to say 'we have seen God with us'.

Jesus comes to us as the fulfillment of Israel's longings, and as the one to usher in the new reign of God. This is the importance of Christmas – that God has entered into our history, and remains with us, to be a liberating and healing power in our lives.

Archangel Gabriel's announcement in this Sunday's Gospel brings heaven and earth together in the womb of a young girl, Mary. The little village of Nazareth is suddenly filled with wondrous titles, Son of the Most High, ruler of the house of Jacob, the power of the Most High, the Holy Spirit, and the Son of God. All heaven's hopes are focused on Mary's reply. Mary's response enables the impossible to happen, "Let it be done to me according to your word." (Luke 1:38).

Advent

Advent is a period of four Sundays, not four weeks as we sometimes think, and this year Advent is as short as it can possibly be – just 22 days. On Sunday 24th December we celebrate the 4th Sunday of Advent and Christmas Vigil Masses begin that evening.

In Advent the Church's attention is on the three comings of Christ: in the past at his birth at Bethlehem, in the present, and at his Second Coming in the future.

The season features three key figures – the prophet Isaiah, John the Baptist, the Virgin Mary.

Advent has three distinct stages:

- * the first focuses on the end of time when Christ will come again in glory
- * the second focuses on John the Baptist heralding Jesus' public ministry
- * the last focuses on Jesus' birth and the role of Mary in salvation history.

The word 'advent' means 'waiting' and the season of Advent is a time of waiting. But how do we wait for God? We wait with patience. Patience does not mean passivity. Waiting patiently is not like waiting for the bus to come, the rain to stop, or the doctor to see us. It is an active waiting in which we live the present moment to the full in order to find there the signs of the One we are waiting for.

Henri Nouwen puts this brilliantly when he writes: "Waiting patiently always means paying attention to what is happening right before our eyes and seeing there the first rays of God's glorious coming." (Elizabeth Harrington),

Celebration Christmas (Elizabeth Harrington)

From the beginning, the Christian Church has understood that Christmas is more than just the commemoration of Jesus' birth on 25th December. For nearly 2000 years, Christians have celebrated Christmas from December 25 through to the Epiphany. The church calendar today extends this celebration until the feast of the Baptism of the Lord.

Christmas in fact celebrates the beginnings of the mystery of salvation – Christ's birth, his revelation to the Jewish shepherds and the Gentile magi, his baptism by John in the Jordan and his first miracle – the changing of water into wine at the wedding feast in Cana.

While it is natural to focus on Christ's nativity at Christmas time, we should not stop there. When we celebrate someone's birthday, we reflect on the life of that person in its entirety, not the day of their birth. Similarly at Christmas we remember not just Christ's birth, but his life, death, and resurrection and what it means for us.



Financially Supporting Our St Benedict's Parish

To everyone who actively contributes financially to the life of our St Benedict's Parish. Thank you! Without you we would not be able to operate as a parish.

We know that the only stable and recurring income that our parish receives is from the **support of our Planned Giving Program**. At present, we are not receiving enough income from our Planned Giving to meet the financial cost of running the parish.

There is a need to increase our collections by \$2000 a week in order to plug the gap when we are no longer eligible to receive the current level of subsidies from the Archdiocese, which will cease in 2024. Also, as I have said, after a church is built there will be additional operating costs such as insurance, maintenance, utility bills etc.

Please, I am asking every parishioner to commit some of your **TREASURE** and help make our dream become a reality. Our Parish Pledge Card is available at the Mass centre; asking everyone to **commit to the Planned Giving Program**. If you are already in the Planned Giving Program, we are asking you to at least continue and if possible increase your financial support. 500 people on average attend Mass each week and we have 83 families that contribute to the Parish through the Parish Planned Giving Program.

If you are not yet part of our Planned Giving Program, then please join and make a commitment to our Parish. There are three (3) options to financially contribute to the running of the parish. These are:

- 1. Direct Debit or**
- 2. Credit Card or**
- 3. Giving Envelopes**

On this Pledge Card we will have an opportunity to support both:

- * **The Parish (Running) Collection**, which supports the expenses incurred for the day-to-day, efficient and effective running of the parish. (Leases, Wages, Supplies)
- * **The Building (Church) Donation**, which supports our purchasing/building of assets, which include our future church, offices, and an adult faith formation/gathering space.

If we want the Archdiocese to contribute significantly to the building of our church, then we need to show that we are financially viable as a parish. Archdiocesan priests continue to be a target for spammers. The messages are generated as an SMS or sent from a gobbledygook email address from bigpond, yahoo or gmail (e.g. churchcare0147@gmail.com), but always spouting a similar urgent message.

The follow up messages attempt to persuade you that the priests' urgent need can only be solved by the purchase of Gift cards or similar. *Hitting the delete button is the best way to deal with these pests and scam artists.* Should you be concerned, or should you receive this type of message, please contact your Parish Office.
