Readings for this week - 11th February, Sixth Sunday in Ordinary.

1st Reading - Leviticus 13: 1-2, 44-46.

Psalm - Ps 31: 1-2, 5, 11.

Response - I turn to you, Lord, in time of trouble, and you fill me with

the joy of salvation.

2nd Reading - St Paul to the Corinthians

10: 31 - 11: 1.

Gospel - Mark 1: 40-45.

Jesus...sternly ordered him, "Mind you say nothing to anyone" (Mark 1:43)

Mark's Gospel being brilliantly structured to make by far its most significant point, and that is, Jesus has come as Saviour of the World, and we receive salvation by joining Jesus in His Suffering, Death, and Resurrection (the Paschal Mystery).

The first half of the Gospel has Jesus as the great Teacher, Healer, Miracle Worker, and Conqueror of Evil. But whenever Jesus performs one of these powerful acts, as He does in this coming Sunday's Gospel, He quickly follows it up by saying, "Don't tell anyone about what I have done." This is what scholars refer to as the "Secrecy Motif." The reason why Jesus says this is because Jesus is indeed our All-Powerful All-Loving God, but this is not the full story of Christianity. The full story of Christianity, and indeed of the Salvation of the World, is the Road to the Jerusalem, that is, the Road to the Cross, which covers the whole second half of Mark's Gospel.

The centre of Mark's Gospel has Jesus giving, not one, not two, but three Passion Predictions. Where Jesus says, "the Son of Man was destined to suffer grievously, to be rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes, and to be put to death, and after three days to rise again." This Gospel then goes on to say "and he said all this quite openly" (Mark 8:31-32). There is no secret here. The Paschal Mystery is unequivocally the core message of this Gospel, and indeed, the core message of the Christian faith. This is why we spend forty days in Lent each year preparing ourselves – through increased prayer, fasting, and acts of charity – to celebrate the Easter Triduum. Lent will be commencing next Wednesday, February 14, with the celebration of Ash Wednesday.

Our 2024 Lent Resource, A Resurrected Life—\$6 at the Mass Centre.

Archbishop Mark Coleridge (Archbishop of Brisbane) writes: A Resurrected Life will invite you to believe in the extraordinary hope that the Gospel bears – a hope grounded in a God who transfigures our wounds, which become fountains of healing and life for those around s and for the world.

I read through the whole resource and have become much richer in faith and spiritually from doing so. So, I too strongly recommend our Lenten resource for 2024. Shane Dwyer, the author, is a very well qualified spiritual writer, educated in the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome, and who has the gift of being able to speak to and enhance the faith of all people at different levels on their faith journey.

What will make this resource even more beneficial, will be our weekly gatherings on zoom throughout Lent. I will be including the link to these gatherings in next week's newsletter.

We have purchased 100 copies of *A Resurrected Life*, and we will be selling them for \$6 each at our Masses over the next two weekends. Please purchase this terrific resource, for it will undoubtedly enhance our faith as we journey together towards the Font of Life.

Ash Wednesday by Elizabeth Harrington

Wednesday 14th February is Ash Wednesday, the first day of the season of Lent. It is designated by the Church as days of fast and abstinence, as is Good Friday.

In current Catholic practice, fasting means having only one full meal a day. Smaller quantities of food may be eaten at two other meals but no food should be consumed at any other time during the day. The law of fasting applies to people from 18 to 59 years old.

Abstinence is the practice of abstaining from the use of certain kinds of food. Everyone aged 14 years and older is bound by the law of abstinence from meat.

The practice of fasting and abstinence aims at leading us to interior conversion by making us more disciplined and more charitable. We fast in order to share our time and our treasure with an attitude of love towards God and others. In addition, the practice helps us imitate the example of Jesus who fasted for 40 days in the desert.

The ashes that are marked on our foreheads on the first day of Lent are a symbol of humility, purification and sorrow and remind us of the need to repent our failings.





Financially Supporting Our St Benedict's Parish

To everyone who actively contributes financially to the life of our St Benedict's Parish. Thank you! Without you we would not be able to operate as a parish.

We know that the only stable and recurring income that our parish receives is from the support of our Planned Giving Program. At present, we are not receiving enough income from our Planned Giving to meet the financial cost of running the parish.

There is a need to increase our collections by \$2000 a week inorder-to plug the gap when we are no longer eligible to receive the current level of subsidies from the Archdiocese, which will cease in 2024. Also, as I have said, after a church is built there will be additional operating costs such as insurance, maintenance, utility bills etc.

Please, I am asking every parishioner to commit some of your TREASURE and help make our dream become a reality. Our Parish Pledge Card is available at the Mass centre; asking everyone to commit to the Planned Giving Program. If you are already in the Planned Giving Program, we are asking you to at least continue and if possible increase your financial support. 500 people on average attend Mass each week and we have 83 families that contribute to the Parish through the Parish Planned Giving Program.

If you are not yet part of our Planned Giving Program, then please join and make a commitment to our Parish. There are three (3) options to financially contribute to the running of the parish. These are:

- 1. Direct Debit or 2. Credit Card or 3. Giving Envelopes On this Pledge Card we will have an opportunity to support both:
- * The Parish (Running) Collection, which supports the expenses incurred for the day-to-day, efficient and effective running of the parish. (Leases, Wages, Supplies)
- * The Building (Church) Donation, which supports our purchasing/building of assets, which include our future church, offices, and an adult faith formation/gathering space.

If we want the Archdiocese to contribute significantly to the building of our church, then we need to show that we are financially viable as a parish.
