

Our Lenten Journey Through the Sunday Gospels

Here is an overview of our Lenten journey this year through the Sunday Gospels for the five Sundays of Lent.

Last Sunday, the 1st Sunday of Lent, we joined Jesus in the desert. The Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert. He remained there for 40-days and he was tempted by Satan.

In this coming Sunday's Gospel, Jesus ascends a mountain in the company of Peter, James and John. Here, He is transfigured in their presence, and Moses and Elijah appear to them.

Next Sunday, the Third Sunday of Lent, Jesus enters the Temple where He finds people selling cattle, sheep and pigeons, and the money changers sitting at their counters. Jesus makes a whip out of some cord and drives them all out of the Temple.

On the 4th Sunday of Lent, Jesus tells Nicodemus that the Son of Man must be lifted-up, as Moses lifted-up the serpent in the desert. So that everyone who believes may have eternal life in Him.

On the 5th Sunday of Lent, Jesus says "that the hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. I tell you most solemnly, unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and dies, it remains only a single grain. But if it dies, it yields a rich harvest" (John 12:23-24).

These five Gospels prepare us beautifully for Holy Week. Giving us a deeper understanding of Jesus' suffering, death, and Resurrection, the Paschal Mystery, the core of our faith as Christians.

Our Lenten Journey

Lent is a time where we prepare ourselves for the celebration of the Paschal Mystery at Easter. The Paschal Mystery being the Suffering, Death and Resurrection of Jesus, which is the foundation of our faith.

Lent began on Ash Wednesday and will conclude before the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. During this time neither the Gloria nor the Alleluia are sung or said.

Purple is the liturgical colour for Lent and has a twofold significance. Purple is widely recognised as the colour of mourning, alluding to the impending suffering of Jesus' crucifixion, yet it is also associated with royalty and heralds Christ resurrection and sovereignty.

During Lent we make a concerted effort to deepen our relationship with Jesus. We do this through Prayer, Fasting and Acts of Charity.

Below is what we are doing as a parish as we journey together during Lent to the Paschal celebrations at Easter.

Our 2024 Lenten Prayer Group

Archbishop Mark Coleridge (Archbishop of Brisbane) writes: A Resurrected Life will invite you to believe in the extraordinary hope that the Gospel bears — a hope grounded in a God who transfigures our wounds, which become fountains of healing and life for those around s and for the world.

I read through the whole resource and have become much richer in faith and spiritually from doing so. So, I too strongly recommend our Lenten resource for 2024. Shane Dwyer, the author, is a very well qualified spiritual writer, educated in the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome, and who has the gift of being able to speak to and enhance the faith of all people at different levels on their faith journey.

We will be gathering **each Wednesday during Lent at 7pm on zoom** to pray for the following Sunday's gospel and reflection from the resource. The link for this prayer group is:

** Should you not be able to attend your Ministry Roster, please let the Sacristans know asap or please arrange to swap weeks with other Ministers. I would like to commence with a quote from St. Catherine of Siena:

"Be who God meant you to be and you will set the world on fire."

I would like to start off by thanking everyone who has contributed to the life of the St Benedict's Parish financially over the last six years. Without you we would not be able to operate as a parish.

Due to good financial stewardship, the parish has been able to repay the loan on the presbytery. This goes a long way to show that the parish is becoming financially viable, and that further support from the Archdiocese is warranted to support our mission for the construction of a church.

As we said last year, for our first five years as a parish, we have been very fortunate to receive \$120 000 support from the Archdiocese of Brisbane to assist with the running of our parish. This support, however, was reduced to \$85 000 last year, and will be further reduced this year.

The only stable and recurring income that our parish receives is from parishioners who support our Planned Giving Program. At present, we are not receiving enough income from our Planned Giving to meet the financial cost of running the parish.

This is a constant challenge for us, as costs will rise sharply once we have a church. With the income from the Archdiocese in the future certain to continue to decline, we need to step up as a parish.

Just as many families struggle to make ends meet with the rising cost of living, our parish faces similar challenges.

There is a need to increase our collections by \$2000 a week to break even as a parish. It is very important for us to show the Archbishop that we are financially viable, for we need a \$5 million loan from the Archdiocese to build a church. We need to be financially viable now, at the very least, for as I have said, expenses will increase once we have a church. After a church is built, there will be additional operating costs such as insurance, maintenance, utility bills etc.

This coming Sunday we are asking every parishioner to commit some of your TREASURE and help make our dream become a reality.

If you are already in the Planned Giving Program, we are asking you to at least continue and, if possible, increase your financial support. At the moment, around 500 people attend Mass each week and 70 families contribute to the Parish through the Parish Planned Giving Program.

If you are not yet part of our Planned Giving Program, then please join and make a commitment this coming Sunday.

If we want the Archdiocese to contribute significantly to the building of our church, then we need to show that we are financially viable as a parish.

So please join our Planned Giving program to help secure our financial future and to give us funds to answer God's call for us to spread the Good News of Jesus through our words, our deeds, and by being vessels of hope, love, and peace.

Starting after our 8:30am Mass on Sunday the 14th of April, and running for 5 consecutive Sundays, our Justice and Peace Group will be leading us in the Sign of Our Times sessions. These sessions will start with Morning Tea and run from 10-11:30am each Sunday, and they consist of the following.

Our Parish Pledge Card is available at the Mass centre; asking everyone to commit to the Planned Giving Program. If you are already in the Planned Giving Program, we are asking you to at least continue and if possible increase your financial support. 500 people on average attend Mass each week and we have 83 families that contribute to the Parish through the Parish Planned Giving Program.
