'Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up.'

We hear Jesus say these very important words in this coming Sunday's gospel. The gospel makes it clear that Jesus is referring to Himself when He says this statement.

Jesus being destroyed and raised is the core of our faith. It is what we call the Paschal Mystery. Throughout this liturgical year I have emphasised, time and time again, that by far the most important message in Mark's Gospel is the Paschal Mystery – the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus. This is the core of who Jesus is and what He did. This is the core of our faith. It is so important to us that we devote forty days of Lent every year in preparing for it, and fifty days every year celebrating it in the Easter Season.

The Suffering, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus is the core of our faith. Through it, we experience the incredible love that God has for us, where God pours God's Self out totally for us. Through the Paschal Mystery, we come to realise that it is only when we die to ourselves that we could truly live for God, pouring ourselves out in love for others, and thus live life abundantly for all eternity.

It is Jesus' Suffering, Death and Resurrection that get us to humbly love and serve all people in our relationship with the Risen Jesus, who suffered and died for us, and who gives us a life of perfect harmony, well-being, and peace, which we call salvation. Our Lenten Journey

Lent is a time where we prepare ourselves for the celebration of the Paschal Mystery at Easter. The Paschal Mystery being the Suffering, Death and Resurrection of Jesus, which is the foundation of our faith.

Lent began on Ash Wednesday and will conclude before the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. During this time neither the Gloria nor the Alleluia are sung or said.

Purple is the liturgical colour for Lent and has a twofold significance. Purple is widely recognised as the colour of mourning, alluding to the impending suffering of Jesus' crucifixion, yet it is also associated with royalty and heralds Christ resurrection and sovereignty.

During Lent we make a concerted effort to deepen our relationship with Jesus. We do this through Prayer, Fasting and Acts of Charity.

Below is what we are doing as a parish as we journey together during Lent to the Paschal celebrations at Easter.

Our 2024 Lenten Prayer Group

Archbishop Mark Coleridge (Archbishop of Brisbane) writes: *A Resurrected Life will invite you to believe in the extraordinary hope that the Gospel bears – a hope grounded in a God who transfigures our wounds, which become fountains of healing and life for those around s and for the world.*

I read through the whole resource and have become much richer in faith and spiritually from doing so. So, I too strongly recommend our Lenten resource for 2024. Shane Dwyer, the author, is a very well qualified spiritual writer, educated in the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome, and who has the gift of being able to speak to and enhance the faith of all people at different levels on their faith journey.

We will be gathering **each Wednesday during Lent at 7pm on zoom** to pray for the following Sunday's gospel and reflection from the resource. The link for this prayer group is:

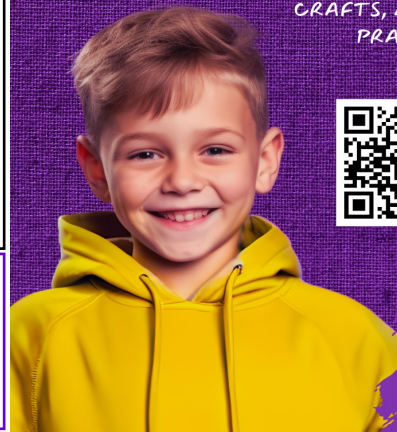

Financially Supporting Our St Benedict's Parish

To everyone who actively contributes financially to the life of our St Benedict's Parish. Thank you! Without you we would not be able to operate as a parish.

We know that the only stable and recurring income that our parish receives is from the **support of our Planned Giving Program**. At present, we are not receiving enough income from our Planned Giving to meet the financial cost of running the parish.

There is a need to increase our collections by \$2000 a week in order to plug the gap when we are no longer eligible to receive the current level of subsidies from the Archdiocese, which will cease in 2024. Also, as I have said, after a church is built there will be additional operating costs such as insurance, maintenance, utility bills etc.

Please, I am asking every parishioner to commit some of your **TREASURE** and help make our dream become a reality. Our Parish Pledge Card is available at the Mass centre; asking everyone to **commit to the Planned Giving Program**. If you are already in the Planned Giving Program, we are asking you to at least continue and if possible increase your financial support. 500 people on average attend Mass each week and we have 83 families that contribute to the Parish through the Parish Planned Giving Program.

If you are not yet part of our Planned Giving Program, then please join and make a commitment to our Parish. There are three (3) options to financially contribute to the running of the parish. These are:

- 3. Giving Envelopes**

On this Pledge Card we will have an opportunity to support both:

- * **The Parish (Running) Collection**, which supports the expenses incurred for the day-to-day, efficient and effective running of the parish. (Leases, Wages, Supplies)
- * **The Building (Church) Donation**, which supports our purchasing/building of assets, which include our future church, offices, and an adult faith formation/gathering space.

If we want the Archdiocese to contribute significantly to the building of our church, then we need to show that we are financially viable as a parish. Archdiocesan priests continue to be a target for spammers. The messages are generated as an SMS or sent from a gobbledygook email address from bigpond, yahoo or gmail (e.g. churchcare0147@gmail.com), but always spouting a similar urgent message.

The follow up messages attempt to persuade you that the priests' urgent need can only be solved by the purchase of Gift cards or similar. *Hitting the delete button is the best way to deal with these pests and scam artists.* Should you be concerned, or should you receive this type of message, please contact your Parish Office.
