Life in Relationship with the Risen Jesus

Since we treasure Easter (the Resurrection of Jesus) so highly as people of the Christian faith, we celebrate it for fifty days liturgically each year right up until Pentecost Sunday (May 19). In this coming Sunday's Gospel, St Thomas, after doubting that Jesus has indeed risen, sees the risen Jesus for himself and believes! Then he goes on to profoundly identify Jesus as "My Lord and my God." Jesus responds by saying to Thomas, "You believe because you can see me, happy are those who have not seen yet believe." (John 20:19-31). Not only are we happy, but we REJOICE, for life with the risen Jesus is wonderful. Jesus is indeed our Lord and our God, who loves us infinitely, and gives us life in abundance.

Our Easter Triduum celebrations were powerful. During these three days we journeyed with Jesus as we commemorated the night before He died with the Mass of the Lord's Supper. During this night we celebrated the gift of the Eucharist that Jesus gave us that night. We also reenacted Jesus' washing of His disciples' feet, which reinforces for us that Jesus came to serve and not be served, and to give His life completely to us so that we can have life through Him. What an incredibly generous gift. Then we journeyed with Jesus, commemorating Jesus' praying in the garden just before He was arrested.

On Good Friday, our hearts were torn as we remembered Jesus' horrific suffering and death. With the Stations of the Cross and The Passion of our Lord helping us to remember and be extremely grateful for Jesus loving us so much. These celebrations were well attended, and left us hurting from the brutal and barbaric death that our beautiful Jesus underwent for us.

Then on the third day after Jesus' death "Alleluias" were proclaimed and the Gloria was sung as we celebrated the Resurrection of Jesus. Yes, Jesus has truly risen, and we celebrated this with gusto. Our Easter Vigil celebration was marvelous, as we lit the Easter Candle, sung the Easter Canticle, proclaimed our salvation through the Scriptures, and joyfully welcomed four adults into full communion with the Catholic Church. There was light, there was water, there was bread, and there was new and abundant life. On Easter Sunday we had over 500 brothers and sisters come together to celebrate our Easter Sunday Mass. The Risen Jesus was truly alive, for the love and joy at this celebration penetrated all of our souls.

The Season of Easter (Elizabeth Harrington)

Just as there is a time of preparation leading up to Easter – the 40 days of Lent, there is a period after Easter when we continue the joy of the resurrection – the 50-day season of Easter, or Easter Time. Perhaps the best way to understand the Easter season, which runs from Easter Sunday until Pentecost, is to consider it as an overflow of the Vigil and a time for unfolding the Easter mysteries. For those who were baptised at Easter, it is the period of mystagogy when the "spiritual and heavenly mysteries of the Church are explained". The continuity between the Easter Vigil and Eastertime is seen in the worship environment. Banners, hangings and other decorations for the Vigil remain in place until Pentecost. The central symbols of water and light are used throughout the fifty days. The paschal candle is placed near the ambo or altar until Pentecost and is lit during all liturgical celebrations to remind us that Christ is indeed our light. 

To everyone who actively contributes financially to the life of our St Benedict's Parish. Thank you! Without you we would not be able to operate as a parish.

We know that the only stable and recurring income that our parish receives is from the **support of our Planned Giving Program**. At present, we are not receiving enough income from our Planned Giving to meet the financial cost of running the parish.

There is a need to increase our collections by \$2000 a week inorder-to plug the gap when we are no longer eligible to receive the current level of subsidies from the Archdiocese, which will cease in 2024. Also, as I have said, after a church is built there will be additional operating costs such as insurance, maintenance, utility bills etc.

Please, I am asking every parishioner to commit some of your TREASURE and help make our dream become a reality. Our Parish Pledge Card is available at the Mass centre; asking everyone to commit to the Planned Giving Program. If you are already in the Planned Giving Program, we are asking you to at least continue and if possible increase your financial support. 500 people on average attend Mass each week and we have 83 families that contribute to the Parish through the Parish Planned Giving Program.
