"Jesus give Himself Totally to Us!"

One of the most renowned Spiritual Writers of the last Century, Thomas Mertens, wrote, "When we give ourselves to God, we come to realise that God gives God's self (sic) totally to us." As Christians, we receive grace in its fullest, through embracing the person of Jesus in our lives. This is why we strive to get to know Jesus more and more. To contemplate the face of Jesus. To gaze into His eyes. Or as Archbishop John Bathersby use to say time and time again, "to fall in love with Jesus, and to love every second of our lives with Jesus as we develop a deep and intimate life-giving friendship with Jesus. Fully loving Jesus, who fully loves us." When we do this, we will receive grace upon grace, guaranteed.

Through this incredible grace, that is, through Jesus, we get to eat from the tree of life. Receiving, as this coming Sunday's Second Reading tells us, the eternal inheritance promised to us. That is, getting to taste and eat the goodness of the Lord. Eating the fruit of all fruits, that will fully nourish us, so that we in turn, can be vessels of God's love, and thus, fully nourish others with the fruit of salvation, that is, the fruit of God's love.

Archbishop Mark, our chief shepherd in Brisbane, often says, "Jesus, the Good Shepherd, comes looking for us. When He finds us, He puts us on His shoulders and carries us up the mountain where we can enjoy restful waters, and the fresh green pastures of the feast." In other words, Jesus will always carry us to the mountain of the Lord, where the delicious food is plentiful, and our cups are overflowing.

So, let us open the door of our heart to Jesus. Let us always call on Jesus' name. For Jesus will always, without fail, be knocking at our door, waiting patiently for us to invite Him in, so He can lead us living full and wonderful lives. And the most intimate way of receiving Jesus into our lives is by receiving His most precious Body and Blood in Holy Communion, which is the great feast we celebrate this coming Sunday.

The most logical day to commemorate the gift of the presence of Christ's body and blood in the Eucharist would be the day on which the Eucharist was instituted - Holy Thursday - but that day is part of the Easter Triduum and its focus is not on the institution of the Eucharist but on the Passion.

The Thursday after Trinity Sunday was chosen for the celebration of the feast of Corpus Christi, as it was originally known. In countries like Australia where it is not a holy day of obligation, the feast is celebrated on the Sunday after Trinity.

The second of the two Prefaces set down for the feast gives us an insight into its real meaning: "Nourishing your faithful by this sacred mystery, you make them holy, so that the human race, bounded by one world, may be enlightened by one faith and united by one bond of charity."

When we eat and drink the Body and Blood of Christ, we ourselves are transformed more perfectly into the presence of the risen Christ. This is Christ's gift to us, but it is also a challenge, because it calls us in turn to give our own body and blood to others so that they too might be nourished.

Our sacramental families will are now journeying with us for our Masses. This is a great opportunity attract people to a deeper relationship with Jesus. All you need to do is continue to show the incredible joy that Jesus gives us as we celebrate Mass. Continuing to be a beautiful welcoming and caring community.

2024 Year of Prayer – Pope Francis on Prayer

"Prayer is the first strength of hope. You pray and hope grows, it moves forward. I would say that prayer opens the door to hope. There is hope but I open the door with my prayer" (General Audience, May 20, 2020).

"Jesus' prayer is the place where we perceive that everything comes from God and returns to him. Sometimes we human beings believe that we are the masters of everything, or on the contrary, we lose all self-esteem, we go from one side to the other. Prayer helps us to find the right dimension in our relationship with God, our Father, and with all creation" (General Audience, November 4, 2020).

"Jesus not only wants us to pray as he prays, but assures us that, even if our attempts at prayer are completely vain and ineffective, we can always count on his prayer. We must be aware of this: Jesus prays for me" (General Audience, June 2, 2021).

Pope Francis has invited the whole Church to celebrate a year of prayer to prepare for next year's Jubilee. We are being called by the successor of Peter to go deeper into the experience of listening to God, speaking to God, being with God in silence prayer.

The Corpus Christi Procession on Sunday June 2
