#### "Go out to the Whole World and Proclaim the Good News!" (Mark 16:15)

Since it is Year B of the Liturgical Year, this coming Sunday we hear the account of the ascension from Mark's Gospel. We hear that after the risen Jesus had commissioned the disciples to go out to the whole world and spread the good news, "He was taken up into heaven: there at the right hand of God he took his place." (Mark 16:19).

To fulfil our mission of spreading the Good News of Jesus to the world, we need to convince people that it really is "Good News!" That it is the Good News that God loves us more than anything and wants the absolute best for us. That God is with us every second of everyday, loving us, and calling us to live good fruitful lives. Calling us to selflessly love, through a deep, personal, and intimate relationship with Jesus. Jesus, the glorified One, seated at the right hand of the Father, who always stands at the door of our hearts and minds, always calling us to love, to forgive, and to care for others. Who unburdens us of worries and leads us to peace and harmony in our lives. Who always calls us to speak out against injustices, and to do all we can to correct them. Our deep and intimate relationship with Jesus is the source from which all good things flow.

Jesus, therefore, calls us to be missionary disciples. To spread the gift of our faith to all people of all nations. Our previous Pope, Pope Benedict XVI, echoed this call of Jesus, when he said that our gift of faith "is not an exclusive prerogative of those who receive it, but is a gift to be shared, a piece of good news to be passed on." He added, *"this gift commitment is entrusted not just to a few, but it is entrusted to all baptised people."* All of us are to share our gift of faith with all others. To spread our gift of faith not just through what we do and say, but how we are as human beings. By being loving, kind, and compassionate people who journey with Jesus, others will be attracted to God's loving embrace through us.

Through the power of the Holy Spirit, we are drawn into an intimate relationship with the risen and ascended Jesus, who will always and everywhere lead us to the Father, who in turn gives us life in abundance. This is the "Joy of the Gospel" as Pope Francis assures us. A life of selfless love, which is always life-giving. Not just for the people we are loving, not just for ourselves, but for the whole world. This self-giving love of God, embodied in Jesus, will lead all people to experience an incredible joy, freedom, peace, and contentment. A joy, freedom, peace, and contentment that the world cannot give. A joy, freedom, peace, and contentment that only God can give.

#### The Ascension of the Lord (Elizabeth Harrington)

Today we celebrate the Ascension of the Lord. The Ascension is not a farewell or a time of sadness at Jesus' departure from this world. Like every Christian festival, the Ascension celebrates the on-going presence of the risen Christ in our midst. The Preface and the Solemn Blessing for the Ascension both make this clear.

"Christ the mediator between God and the human race, judge of the world and Lord of all, has passed beyond our sight, not to abandon us but to be our hope. Christ is the beginning, the head of the Church; where he has gone, we hope to follow." (Preface)

"May you, who believe Christ is seated with the Father in his majesty, know with joy the fulfilment of his promise to stay with you until the end of time." (Solemn Blessing)

The first reading for the feast is from Luke's prologue to the book of Acts. Jesus travelled to Jerusalem to his passion and death; now the disciples will take the Good News of his resurrection out to the world, beginning in Jerusalem and reaching to the ends of the earth.

The account of the ascension that we hear this year from Mark occupies not even a full sentence in the gospel reading. The rest of the passage is about Jesus' final commissioning of the disciples to go out into the whole world and proclaim the Good News.

In Australia the Ascension marks the beginning of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. The theme for this year is "You shall love the Lord your God and your neighbour as yourself". (Luke 10:27). The love of Christ and neighbour is the driving force that moves us beyond our division toward acts of reconciliation.

# Mother's Day Prayer

#### Year of Prayer

Pope Francis has invited the whole Church to celebrate a year of prayer to prepare for next year's Jubilee. We are being called by the successor of Peter to go deeper into the experience of listening to God, speaking to God, being with God in silence prayer.

Prayer is like breathing - it is as necessary for our spiritual life, as breathing is for our physical life. Christian prayer begins with listening to the God, who never ceases to communicate with us. If all we do is speak, we will "babble like the pagans", as Jesus says (Matthew 6:7). But true prayer is like charging an iPhone: without it, the device simply doesn't work. Nor do we.

As a way into a deepening experience of prayer, I offer the Archdiocese a prayer that comes from my own listening to God (see the pray below). I also recommend the "Year of Pray" website, which can be accessed here: <u>http://evangelisationbrisbane.org.au/year-of-prayer</u>

Deeper prayer is the womb of more powerful mission, so there is more to this year of prayer than growth and piety. This is true for the pastors first of all, but for all the baptized as well. Since the whole Church is mission.

#### The Corpus Christi Procession on Sunday June 2

On the **Feast of Corpus Christi**, the Catholic Church honours the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, "For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink" (John 6:55). Processing with the Blessed Sacrament through the streets is a tradition that is embraced all over the world and continues today.

In the Archdiocese of Brisbane, we will bear witness to our faith on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of June 2024, as we gather with over 5000 Catholics to walk with Jesus through the streets of Brisbane City, as we pray, sing, praise, and honour Him in the Blessed Sacrament.

The Corpus Christi Procession, presided by **Archbishop Mark Coleridge** will start at 2pm from the Cathedral of St Stephen, walk through the city streets and finish with Benediction at the Cathedral.

In addition to the procession, an exhibition of Eucharistic Miracles around the world will be on display in the Hanly Room, Francis Rush Centre, from Saturday the 1<sup>st</sup> of June until Sunday the 2<sup>nd</sup> of June. There will also be a vigil of Adoration in St Stephen's Chapel overnight from 7pm Saturday the 1<sup>st</sup> to Sunday the 2<sup>nd</sup> of June.

May has traditionally been the month of Mary in the Catholic Church. The feast of the Visitation on May 31 calls us to ponder Mary as the woman who believed and obediently accepted the will of God, enabling her to play a most significant role in the saving work of Christ.

"Far from being a timidly submissive woman, Mary was a woman who did not hesitate to proclaim that God vindicates the humble and the oppressed, and removes the powerful people of this world from their positions of privilege" (Pope Paul IV).

# The Season of Easter (Elizabeth Harrington)

Just as there is a time of preparation leading up to Easter – the 40 days of Lent, there is a period after Easter when we continue the joy of the resurrection – the 50-day season of Easter, or Easter Time. Perhaps the best way to understand the Easter season, which runs from Easter Sunday until Pentecost, is to consider it as an overflow of the Vigil and a time for unfolding the Easter mysteries. For those who were baptised at Easter, it is the period of *mystagogy* when the "spiritual and heavenly mysteries of the Church are explained". The continuity between the Easter Vigil and Eastertime is seen in the worship environment. Banners, hangings and other decorations for the Vigil remain in place until Pentecost. The central symbols of water and light are used throughout the fifty days. The paschal candle is placed near the ambo or altar until Pentecost and is lit during all liturgical celebrations to remind us that Christ is indeed our light. The document on the liturgical year says that the fifty days of the Easter season are "the days for the singing of the *Alleluia*". In this "week of weeks" (Easter Time is seven weeks long) we sing our *Alleluias*, to the risen Christ and celebrate our new life in him.
