Baptised in the Trinity

In this coming Sunday's Gospel, Jesus says, "Go, therefore, make disciples of all the nations; baptise them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." In other words, baptise them in the Trinity, so that they can live their lives in God with God in them. This awakens us from our sleep to realise that God is with us every second of everyday loving us and wanting the best for us. As you probably realise by now, I cannot say this enough. God loves us and wants the absolute best for us. God does this by saving us from disordered thoughts and actions that ruins lives. And God reorders these thoughts and action to be acts of selfless love, where we love and care for each other, especially those doing it tough. That's why each and every one of us, as people of faith, are called to be vessels of God's love, so others can experience God's immeasurable love (not hurt) through us.

God has breathed the Holy Spirit into us, so that we can live our lives in a deep and intimate relationship with Jesus, who dwells in the Father, and thus draws us into the loving embrace of the Father too, so that we can truly love and be loved.

So, the Holy Spirit always leads us, and gives us the power, to live our lives in Jesus, with Jesus in us. And Jesus always leads us, and gives us the power, to live our lives in the Father, with the Father in us, so that we can be vessels of God's love to others, for our own good, and for the good of the whole world.

Thus, in the words of St Paul, everyone moved by the Holy Spirit joins Christ as a beloved child of God crying out 'Abba, Father!' as children, and heirs, of God. Always thriving and inheriting the life that our incredibly loving God gives us forever.

Trinity Sunday (Elizabeth Harrington)

The Sunday after Pentecost is celebrated as the feast of the Most Holy Trinity. This timing is deliberate coming as it does after the commemorations of the life, passion and resurrection of Christ at Easter and of the gift of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

Although the term "Trinity" does not appear in scripture, many bible passages make clear the mutual relationship between the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. The Mass prayers set down for the feast strongly affirm Christian belief in the mystery of the Holy Trinity and emphasise that it is God who is three-in-one whom we adore.

The Collect (Opening Prayer) for example: "God our Father, who by sending into the world the Word of truth and the Spirit of sanctification made known to the human race your wondrous mystery, grant us, we pray, that in professing the true faith, we may acknowledge the Trinity of eternal glory and adore your Unity, powerful in majesty."

And the Preface: "For with your Only Begotten Son and the Holy Spirit you are one God, one Lord: not in the unity of a single person, but in a Trinity of one substance. For what you have revealed to us of your glory we believe equally of your Son and of the Holy Spirit, so that, in the confessing of the true and eternal Godhead, you might be adored in what is proper to each Person, their unity in substance, and their equality in majesty."

2024 Year of Prayer - Pope Francis on Prayer

"Prayer is the first strength of hope. You pray and hope grows, it moves forward. I would say that prayer opens the door to hope. There is hope but I open the door with my prayer" (General Audience, May 20, 2020).

"Jesus' prayer is the place where we perceive that everything comes from God and returns to him. Sometimes we human beings believe that we are the masters of everything, or on the contrary, we lose all self-esteem, we go from one side to the other. Prayer helps us to find the right dimension in our relationship with God, our Father, and with all creation" (General Audience, November 4, 2020).

"Jesus not only wants us to pray as he prays, but assures us that, even if our attempts at prayer are completely vain and ineffective, we can always count on his prayer. We must be aware of this: Jesus prays for me" (General Audience, June 2, 2021).

Year of Prayer

Pope Francis has invited the whole Church to celebrate a year of prayer to prepare for next year's Jubilee. We are being called by the successor of Peter to go deeper into the experience of listening to God, speaking to God, being with God in silence prayer.

Prayer is like breathing - it is as necessary for our spiritual life, as breathing is for our physical life. Christian prayer begins with listening to the God, who never ceases to communicate with

The Corpus Christi Procession on Sunday June 2

On the **Feast of Corpus Christi**, the Catholic Church honours the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, "For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink" (John 6:55). Processing with the Blessed Sacrament through the streets is a tradition that is embraced all over the world and continues today.

In the Archdiocese of Brisbane, we will bear witness to our faith on the 2nd of June 2024, as we gather with over 5000 Catholics to walk with Jesus through the streets of Brisbane City, as we pray, sing, praise, and honour Him in the Blessed Sacrament.

The Corpus Christi Procession, presided by **Archbishop Mark Coleridge** will start at 2pm from the Cathedral of St Stephen, walk through the city streets and finish with Benediction at the Cathedral.

In addition to the procession, an exhibition of Eucharistic Miracles around the world will be on display in the Hanly Room, Francis Rush Centre, from Saturday the 1^{st} of June until Sunday the 2^{nd} of June. There will also be a vigil of Adoration in St Stephen's Chapel overnight from 7pm Saturday the 1^{st} to Sunday the 2^{nd} of June.
