St Benedict of Norcia - Transforming the World with God's Love

I remember a young Swedish man being interviewed three months into the Covid-19 pandemic. He was as fit as can be, it looked like he spent most of his life in a gym pumping iron. In the interview he was complaining about the lockdown. When asked what he thought of the thousands upon thousands of elderly people losing their lives to Covid, he chillingly said, "Tough luck!"

Benedict of Norcia was born four years after the collapse of Rome in 480 AD. The foreign powers who took over Europe were very much opposed to Christianity. Particularly, with respect to caring for the poor and the vulnerable.

Under the leadership of this time, the elderly, the poor, the sick, and other vulnerable people were considered expendable. Very much like the attitude of the young Swedish man above. Also, sexual depravity was rife during Benedict's formative years, reaching a crisis point while Benedict was studying at university in Rome.

Being a young man of deep faith in Europe at this time, Benedict became disillusioned. Being overwhelmed with the state of the world, Benedict departed from Rome to seek refuge and solace as a hermit in a cave in Subiaco. During this time as a hermit, people would bring Benedict food in exchange for spiritual direction.

Benedict's reputation as a great Spiritual Director grew rapidly. He was asked to lead a monastery. During this time, Benedict wrote The Rule of St Benedict as a guide for the monastic life. It was not long before this Rule became the gold standard for monastic life in Western Monasticism, and it is still the gold standard today.

During his lifetime, Benedict founded many monasteries. The most famous being the Monastery of Monte Cassino, which lies on the hilltop between Rome and Naples. These Benedictine monasteries spread rapidly throughout the whole of Europe and were spiritual centres for the people who lived in these areas. These Benedictine Monasteries nourished and influenced the European people to live their lives in Christ, leading to a renewed Christian society, who loved and cared for all people, particularly the poor and the vulnerable.

St Benedict is a shining example for us all. Devoting his life to drawing more and more people into God's loving embrace, so that more and more people can love like Jesus, transforming the world with His love.

Good News about Our Church

Father Peter Dillon (the Vicar of Administration for the Archdiocese of Brisbane) has given us the go ahead to build our church. We will be building it on the 10 000m² of land owned by the Archdiocese of Brisbane, which is where the current Kindergarten is located.

Father Peter is supporting us in building a 500-seat church, which will include office and meeting spaces, a Columbarium, a space for the kindergarten, and a hospitality area. The Pastoral Council members and I are in the process of forming a Church Steering Committee. I will let you know who is on this committee once it is finalised.

Patrick Lane-Mullins (the Director for Land and Property for the Archdiocese of Brisbane) has contacted Macksey Rush Architects (who designed the St Benedict's School, College, and Kindergarten). They will undertake an initial 'feasibility' report their fee for this is \$5000. This provides for Consultation, Concept Development, and the sketching of the concept to allow our builders to price-up the construction.

Synod24

At all Masses on the weekend of June 15-16, we shared a video at the homily time to inform everyone of our upcoming Archdiocesan Synod. The Synod, which is branded as Synod24, is taking place in September and October of this year. Below is a recap of what we saw presented by Archbishop Mark Coleridge, Bishop Tim Norton, and Steph Unger. You can access the full video at: https://vimeo.com/957389678

Archbishop Mark Coleridge

Since 2018, the Church in Australia has been walking the journey of the Plenary Council. Through listening, dialogue, and discernment we have been seeking to hear what the Holy Spirit is asking of us at this time.

Through the two assemblies of the Plenary Council, and under the influence of the Holy Spirit, ten Plenary Council Decrees have been agreed upon...I have decided to convene a follow-up Synod, for the Archdiocese of Brisbane, to discern and decide upon practical ways in which the decrees can be implemented locally. The Synod will involve two brief assemblies in September and October of this year.

Bishop Tim Norton

A Synod is a gathering of God's people. So, it can be a gathering that includes bishops and pastors and people who run parish groups and people who just sit in the pews. But it is actually all of God's people or representatives of all of God's people, who can gather and talk about the church and the mission.

I know a lot of people want to be involved. We go back and say that there has already been this consultation process prior to the Plenary Council. But, with only one hundred and fifty people participating in the Synod 24 assemblies, many people are asking; What about us?

Fr Bryan

I have the answer to this question put forward by Bishop Tim. Everyone in our St Benedict's Parish has the opportunity to participate in our Archdiocesan Synod. Gary Smyth (Chair of our Pastoral Council) and I are invited to participate in the Synod assemblies in September and October. So, each week in the newsletter I will be sharing a Decree from the Plenary Council. I invite all parishioners to read the decree, pray about it, and offer Gary and I suggestions that come to light. FIFTH PLENARY COUNCIL OF AUSTRALIA RECONCILIATION: HEALING WOUNDS, RECEIVING GIFTS

All Australians have much to learn from the cultures, spirituality, and knowledge of country of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. However, our society is yet to recognise fully Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples as the traditional owners and custodians of the lands and waters now known as Australia, or to achieve right relationships with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and communities.

The Catholic Church in Australia has been caught up in this history of dispossession, Stolen Generations, racism, and the undermining of language and culture. Dioceses, eparchies, and religious institutes have made sincere efforts to share faith, education, and pastoral services with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. However, much suffering has been inflicted by the historically misguided attempts of those who were ignorant of the cultural richness of these peoples.

We know that we will not be 'fully the Church that Jesus wants' us to be until Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people have made their contribution to the life of the Church and "until that contribution has been joyfully received by others" within the Church.

The Plenary Council joyfully receives the following recommendations of the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council (NATSICC), which were submitted "in the hope that the Catholic Church in Australia will more resemble the Church that Jesus Christ wants her to be in relation to Australia's First Peoples" (John Paul II, Address to the Aborigines and Torres Strait Islanders, 29 November 1986):

- a. Developing the cross-cultural competency of clergy, religious, lay workers and volunteers in the Catholic Church to enable more effective and appropriate ministry with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.
- b. NATSICC calls upon the Catholic Church to support Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholics to undertake formation and training. Further, the Church is encouraged to ensure that existing retreats and courses are culturally appropriate.
- c. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander spirituality contains symbols and rituals that, when used appropriately in Catholic liturgical contexts, enrich our celebrations, and facilitate a welcoming environment for Indigenous Peoples.
- d. NATSICC recommends that the traditional custodians of the land on which the Church, school, parish, or organisation stands be acknowledged in a prominent and appropriate manner. Verbal acknowledgement prior to meetings and Mass is also encouraged.
- e. NATSICC calls upon the Catholic Church to unearth and discover the genius and gifts that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people possess through inclusion on committees, boards, and decision-making bodies.

The Fifth Plenary Council:

- a. says sorry to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people in and beyond the Church for the part played by the Church in the harms they have suffered:
- b. commits to walk with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people in continuing to work towards recognition, reconciliation and justice;
- c. joyfully receives and accepts the recommendations contained in the NATSICC position paper "Embracing Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders in the Life of the Catholic Church";
- d. endorses the Uluru Statement from the Heart and encourages engagement with processes for implementing the statement, including local, regional, and national truth-telling efforts.

FIFTH PLENARY COUNCIL OF AUSTRALIA RECONCILIATION: HEALING WOUNDS, RECEIVING GIFTS DECREE

The Fifth Plenary Council of Australia decrees:

Article 1

That each Catholic school, parish, diocese, eparchy or organisation will respond to the recommendations contained in the NATSICC position paper, "Embracing Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders in the Life of the Catholic Church" in the following ways:

- a. acknowledges in a prominent and appropriate manner the Traditional Custodians of the land upon which their buildings stand;
- b. includes the online Cultural Competency in a Catholic Context course developed by NATSICC and approved by the Bishops Commission for Relations with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples in the orientation and/or ongoing formation of staff and volunteers to enable more effective and appropriate ministry;
- c. ensures that any retreats and other formation activities offered are culturally appropriate;
- d. works actively to include Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people on its committees, boards and decision-making bodies.

Article 2

That the advisory councils of the Bishops' Commission for Liturgy, in partnership with NATSICC, will develop options for the liturgically and culturally appropriate use of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander symbols and rituals in Catholic liturgical contexts, with respect for the diversity of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures. The Eastern Catholic Churches in Australia will interpret the decrees of the Fifth Plenary Council of Australia in accordance with the Code of Canons of the Eastern Churches and the traditions of each church sui iuris. In accordance with canon 446 of the Code of Canon Law, this decree is not to be promulgated until it has been reviewed by the Apostolic See. It will be promulgated in Australasian Catholic Record and the website of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference in accordance with its usual practice. The decrees will oblige six months after promulgation

Financially Supporting Our St Benedict's Parish

We know that the only stable and recurring income that our parish receives is from the support of our Planned Giving Program. At present, we are not receiving enough income from our Planned Giving to meet the financial cost of running the parish.

There is a need to increase our collections by \$2000 a week inorder-to plug the gap when we are no longer eligible to receive the current level of subsidies from the Archdiocese, which will cease in 2024. Also, as I have said, after a church is built there will be additional operating costs such as insurance, maintenance, utility bills etc.

Please, I am asking every parishioner to commit some of your TREASURE and help make our dream become a reality. Our Parish Pledge Card is available at the Mass centre; asking everyone to commit to the Planned Giving Program. If you are already in the Planned Giving Program, we are asking you to at least continue and if possible increase your financial support. 500 people on average attend Mass each week and we have 83 families that contribute to the Parish through the Parish Planned Giving Program.
