The Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist

This coming Sunday we hear the Gospel for the fourth of five consecutive Sundays from John chapter 6, commonly referred to as the "Bread of Life" discourse. Jesus being the "Bread of Life."

This is an important chapter of the Bible for Catholics, for it supports us in saying that the Eucharist is not simple a sign or a symbol, but in the Eucharist Jesus is really, truly and substantially present under the eucharistic signs of bread and wine.

This strikes a lot of people as being odd, when we say we receive the Body and Blood of Jesus every time we come to Mass, even from our fellow Christians from different denominations. But in the 6th chapter of John's gospel, we have this breathtaking discourse of Jesus speaking to thousands of people, and to us. The people had come because of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes. They were fascinated by Jesus, and Jesus says to them, "don't search for bread that perishes, but look for the bread that lasts unto eternal life" (John 6:27). Jesus then specifies, "I myself am the living bread come down from heaven. Eat my flesh and drink my blood" (John 6:54).

At this point the crowd becomes restless, saying, "Woe! What is going on here?" What Jesus is saying here is very controversial for a 1st Century Jewish audience. Throughout the Old Testament are all sorts of prohibitions against the eating of animal flesh with its blood, because blood was seen as life. It belonged to God. So, it was strictly forbidden for a Jew to eat flesh with blood.

In chapter 6 of John's Gospel we have Jesus speaking to a Jewish audience and suggesting not just eating animal flesh with its blood, but His own human flesh with blood. This is why we hear John's Gospel tell us that the crowd quarreled, and said "how could he possibly give us his flesh to eat?" (John 6:52).

Jesus does not respond by saying, "Sorry, I was speaking figuratively." No! Jesus responds by doubling down, saying, "I tell you most solemnly, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of man and drink his blood you have no life within you. My flesh is real food, my blood is real drink" (John 6:53-55). So, when the people are disturbed by Jesus saying that He will give them His flesh and blood to eat, Jesus intensifies His language saying, "unless you munch on the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood you have no life within you" (John 6:53).

This is the biblical ground to our ancient Catholic belief that Christ is really, truly, and substantially present under the forms of bread and wine in the Eucharist. This is why as Catholics, when we receive Jesus in Holy Communion at Mass, we are filled with joy and reverence, for we are receiving Jesus, who is our Lord, our God, and our everything!

Journeying with our Children Receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation

Last Sunday our first group of children received the Sacrament of Confirmation at our 11am Mass. This was a wonderful celebration, where the children did extremely well in participating in the Mass and in receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation. The celebration was Spirit-filled with a great sense of joy.

The children's sacramental journey at St Benedict's goes extremely well thanks to the team of parishioners who help me out considerably each year. Renae, our Parish Secretary, does a lot of work both behind the scenes and in person. Renae reaches out to all the schools in our area to encourage children and families to join the Sacramental Program. Renae also organises all the resources to help educate the children on their sacramental journey. Renae is a great communicator, constantly touching base with the families and me so the journey to receiving the sacraments is fruitful and goes smoothly. Renae also does a great job organising all the paperwork from the families, doing up lists to assist the sacramental team and I in connecting with the families, welcoming and checking-in the children when they arrive at the Mass centre, doing up the children's certificates, officially recording that the children have received the sacraments in respective registers and on the database, organising the morning tea for the retreat, buying the cupcakes for their Confirmation and First Holy Communion days, organising the photography, and many other tasks that benefit the children and their families greatly throughout their sacramental journey. So, thank you Renae for all this work that you do each year. It is a great effort and very much appreciated.

Good News about Our Church

Father Peter Dillon, the Vicar of Administration for the Archdiocese of Brisbane, has given us the go ahead to build our church. We have been weighing up the pros and cons of building it on the 10 000m² of land owned by the Archdiocese of Brisbane, which is where the current Kindergarten is located. There seems to be a lot more challenges than advantages in building the church in this location. So, we are trying to swap this block of land with a parcel of land located on the right of the main gates as we drive into the St Benedict's precinct.

Once we have secured this parcel of land, we will contact the Architect to undertake an initial 'feasibility' report which will cost \$5000. This will provide for Consultation. Concept Development, and the sketching of the concept to allow our builders to price-up the construction.

Please know that the \$100 Raffles that we are having will be contributing directly to the above architect fees.

Synod24

At all Masses on the weekend of June 15-16, we shared a video at the homily time to inform everyone of our upcoming Archdiocesan Synod. The Synod, which is branded as Synod24, is taking place in September and October of this year. Archbishop Mark Coleridge

Since 2018, the Church in Australia has been walking the journey of the Plenary Council. Through listening, dialogue, and discernment we have been seeking to hear what the Holy Spirit is asking of us at this time.

Through the two assemblies of the Plenary Council, and under the influence of the Holy Spirit, ten Plenary Council Decrees have been agreed upon...I have decided to convene a follow-up Synod, for the Archdiocese of Brisbane, to discern and decide upon practical ways in which the decrees can be implemented locally. The Synod will involve two brief assemblies in September and October of this year.

I know a lot of people want to be involved. We go back and say that there has already been this consultation process prior to the Plenary Council. But, with only one hundred and fifty people participating in the Synod 24 assemblies, many people are asking; What about us?

I have the answer to this question put forward by Bishop Tim. Everyone in our St Benedict's Parish has the opportunity to participate in our Archdiocesan Synod. Gary Smyth (Chair of our Pastoral Council) and I are invited to participate in the Synod assemblies in September and October. So, each week in the newsletter I will be sharing a Decree from the Plenary Council. I invite all parishioners to read the decree, pray about it, and offer Gary and I suggestions that come to light. FIFTH PLENARY COUNCIL OF AUSTRALIA CHOOSING REPENTANCE - SEEKING HEALING

1. As the Plenary Council of the Church in Australia, we express our profound sorrow that children and young people and vulnerable adults have been abused by clergy, religious and lay workers of the Catholic Church, and that religious leaders have failed to act sufficiently to prevent or respond to abuse. To the victims and survivors of abuse, their families, and communities, we offer our unreserved apology. We commit to doing whatever we can to

DECREE

The Fifth Plenary Council of Australia decrees:

Article 1 That to express more fully the aims of the annual "Safeguarding Sunday", in consultation with those who have been harmed by abuse:

- a. a new name will be adopted for "Safeguarding Sunday", and
- b. the Bishops Commission for Liturgy will develop appropriate rituals and liturgical resources to be offered to parishes for use on the day.

The Eastern Catholic Churches in Australia will interpret the decrees of the Fifth Plenary Council of Australia in accordance with the Code of Canons of the Eastern Churches and the traditions of each church sui iuris.



Financially Supporting Our St Benedict's Parish

To everyone who actively contributes financially to the life of our St Benedict's Parish. Thank you! Without you we would not be able to operate as a parish.

We know that the only stable and recurring income that our parish receives is from the **support of our Planned Giving Program**. At present, we are not receiving enough income from our Planned Giving to meet the financial cost of running the parish.

There is a need to increase our collections by \$2000 a week inorder-to plug the gap when we are no longer eligible to receive the current level of subsidies from the Archdiocese, which will cease in 2024. Also, as I have said, after a church is built there will be additional operating costs such as insurance, maintenance, utility bills etc.

Please, I am asking every parishioner to commit some of your TREASURE and help make our dream become a reality. Our Parish Pledge Card is available at the Mass centre; asking everyone to commit to the Planned Giving Program. If you are already in the Planned Giving Program, we are asking you to at least continue and if possible increase your financial support. 500 people on average attend Mass each week and we have 83 families that contribute to the Parish through the Parish Planned Giving Program.

If you are not yet part of our Planned Giving Program, then please join and make a commitment to our Parish. There are three (3) options to financially contribute to the running of the parish. These are:

- **1. Direct Debit or 2. Credit Card or 3. Giving Envelopes** On this Pledge Card we will have an opportunity to support both:
