Jesus is in Our Hearts!

I visited the Preppies at St Benedict's the other day, which is always a treat. Ellen Locke, the APRE, asked me to explain what it means to have "Jesus in our hearts," which is prayed by all the students at St Bennies in their school prayer. So, I started to tackle this task by asking the children the question: "What do we do with our hearts?" One little boy answered by saying, "Our hearts keep us alive!" The next boy said, "Our hearts pump blood throughout our bodies to keep us alive." (Clearly a doctor in the making). I then asked one of the little girls, who had her hand up (they all had their hands up)

who said, "We love with our hearts!" To which I responded with great enthusiasm saying, "Yes! We love with our hearts!! And we have Jesus in our hearts because Jesus helps us to love!!"

In this coming Sunday's Gospel, Jesus is very direct in naming our human weaknesses that prevent us from loving in healthy ways. Jesus pulls no punches in saying, "For it is from within, from the human heart, that evil intentions come: fornication, theft, murder; adultery,

avarice, wickedness, deceit, licentiousness, envy, slander; pride, folly. All these evil things come from within and they defile a person." (Mark 7:22-23). And I might add, these things also destroy relationships.

This is the exact reason why we need Jesus in our hearts. Jesus purifies our thoughts and gives us strength, so that we can overcome the above human weaknesses, and live life abundantly. We need to turn to Jesus constantly so that He can purify our thoughts and hearts so that we can love one another as Jesus loves us (John 15:12). Wholeheartedly!!

Gestures when receiving Communion (Elizabeth Harrington)

Paragraph 160 of the official *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* explains that the sign of reverence for the sacred elements is a bow that is made as communicants approach the ministers distributing Communion: "When approaching to receive Holy Communion, the faithful bow in reverence of the Mystery that they are to receive". Communicants are to make a simple bow of the head when they step forward to receive the consecrated elements from the minister. Such a bow can be done simply, without disrupting the flow of the Communion.

The aim of introducing the instruction about bowing before receiving Communion was to stop people genuflecting and making the sign of the cross. We all do the same thing at Communion, because Communion makes us One Body in Christ and we are all the same in the eyes of God. We should do nothing that sets us apart from others.

Some people make the sign of the cross on themselves after receiving Communion but after receiving Communion, hands that have touched the Body of Christ should instead be clasped together reverently.

Good News about Our Church

Father Peter Dillon, the Vicar of Administration for the Archdiocese of Brisbane, has given us the go ahead to build our church. We have been weighing up the pros and cons of building it on the 10 000m² of land owned by the Archdiocese of Brisbane, which is where the current Kindergarten is located. There seems to be a lot more challenges than advantages in building the church in this location. So, we are trying to swap this block of land with a parcel of land located on the right of the main gates as we drive into the St Benedict's precinct.

Once we have secured this parcel of land, we will contact the Architect to undertake an initial 'feasibility' report which will cost **\$5000**. This will provide for Consultation, Concept Development, and the sketching of the concept to allow our builders to price-up the construction.

Please know that the **\$100 Raffles** that we are having will be contributing directly to the above architect fees.

Also, now that we are moving towards building a church, please contribute to our Building Fund if you are not already doing so. We have Direct Debit and Credit Card forms for the Building Fund available on the welcome desk at our Mass Centre.



SYNOD24: I Am Making All Things New

Synod24 is a gathering of 150 people who represent the broad diversity of the Brisbane Archdiocese and will take place over two sessions, one in September and one in October. Synod Membership will include parish representatives from each Deanery, laity who work with social justice organisations, young people, leaders and members of multicultural communities, representatives from church agencies and organisations, religious and Clergy. A full list of Synod Members will be published in the lead up to SYNOD24.

This gathering (synod) is a little different to an ordinary meeting or conference, as it pays particular attention to the movement of the Holy Spirit. Often when a group of

people come together only some voices are heard. This is often due to many things such as time constraints, confidence, some people having lots of things to say and some people preferring to focus on listening rather than responding. In SYNOD24, discussions will take place around a round table and designed to give **equal time** to each group member to speak **without** interruption. Time is then given for each member of the group to share what they heard others say. This gives the Holy Spirit the opportunity to speak through each person at the table. It means that space is provided for many different stories, perspectives, experiences, ideas, questions, and challenges to be heard. Most importantly, it requires each person to actively listen with an open heart, so that they are able to reflect back what they heard the Holy Spirit say through other people.

It is from this place of openness to the perspectives of others, and to the Holy Spirit, that the Synod Members are able to genuinely discuss, debate and then vote on actions related to eight areas of church faith, life and mission. These areas, that have come out of the Australian Plenary Council, are called "Decrees", and focus on the following topics: <u>Reconciliation Healing Wounds Receiving Gifts.</u>

Choosing Repentance Seeking Healing

Called by Christ Sent Forth As Missionary Disciples

Witnessing to the Equal Dignity of Women and Men

Communion in Grace Sacrament to the World

Formation and Leadership for Mission and Ministry

At the Service of Communion, Participation and Mission: Governance

Integral Ecology and Conversion for the Sake of Our Common Home.

A Synod is a gathering of God's people. So, it can be a gathering that includes bishops and pastors and people who run parish groups and people who just sit in the pews. FIFTH PLENARY COUNCIL OF AUSTRALIA CALLED BY CHRIST – SENT FORTH AS MISSIONARY DISCIPLES DECREE

The Plenary Council decrees:

Article 1 That those responsible for Catholic schooling and early childhood education, in consultation with representatives of Catholic parents' groups and parish-based organisation, led by the National Catholic Education Commission and drawing upon the document, A Framework for Formation for Mission in Catholic Education (2017), establish a national forum, which will seek to:

a. identify and respond to the needs of the diverse and distinct circumstances of Catholic schools in Australia;

b. build partnerships which enhance the vision of Catholic education as an instrument of evangelisation and an essential dimension of the contemporary mission of the Church;

c. offer a process for critical reflection and discernment of the vocation of Catholic education today;

d. support formation opportunities for catechesis, faith formation, leadership development and religious education pedagogy; and

e. to assist parish engagement with schools and young people.

Article 2 That the Bishops Commission for Social Justice, Mission and Service establish a triennial National Forum of Catholic social service, health and aged care, disability, prison ministry, refugee and asylum-seeker, and justice, ecology and peace organisations and representatives of those served by these organisations; and that the purpose of this forum include:

a. providing opportunities for dialogue that will contribute to the ability of the Church in Australia to attend to "examining the signs of the times and interpreting them in the light of the Gospel";

b. identifying and exploring priorities for evangelisation through outreach, service provision, advocacy and formation;

c. addressing gaps;

d. seeking opportunities for collaboration; and

e. informing the development of local social teachings to be issued by the Australian Bishops.

Article 3

a. That each diocese and eparchy identify ways of promoting ecumenical and interfaith relationships (e.g., an Ecumenical and Interfaith Officer) that are practical and appropriate for the diocese or eparchy. **b.** That the Bishops Commission for Christian Unity and Inter-religious Dialogue – in collaboration with Catholic tertiary institutions and theological associations – provide guidance, advice and resources to dioceses and eparchies for ecumenical and interfaith dialogue and relationships, and formation for those responsible for ecumenical and interreligious relations.
