There is a New Ruler in Town - Jesus!

The Sunday Gospel for the next two weeks, I believe, describe the two main themes in Mark's Gospel. This coming Sunday's Gospel describes the theme that a new Ruler has come into the world, by the name of Jesus, who will conquer the previous ruler – the Devil! Then the Gospel for Sunday September 8 makes it perfectly clear that Jesus has come into the world to save us through His suffering, death, and resurrection – the Paschal Mystery.

The first part of Mark's Gospel has Jesus performing many exorcisms of demons. Add to that, it is only the demons who seem to know that Jesus is God. These exorcisms, together with the demons identifying Jesus as God, is a key theme of the whole Gospel. That is, there is a new Ruler (Jesus) in town (the world), and the old Ruler's (the Devil's) days are numbered. Jesus conquers demons (or unclean spirits) at least fourteen times in Mark's Gospel. These demons are frightened of Jesus, and Jesus has total power over them. So, if one is frightened of evil spirits, then Mark's Gospel makes it very clear that if one turns to Jesus when threatened by an evil spirit, they will be one hundred percent safe.

By the way, it is helpful to know that the Greek word for the Devil in the Gospels is "Diabolos". Diabolos literally means to "throw apart". This is exactly what the Devil tries to do, seeking to throw apart our relationships and our integrity. Jesus, on the other hand, seeks to do the opposite. Jesus seeks to make us whole – to make our relationships with others to thrive, and for us to be people of integrity.

In this coming Sunday's Gospel Jesus performs His second miracle in Gentile (non-Jewish) territory. Both this miracle and the preceding miracle in Mark's Gospel, in which Jesus liberates the daughter of a Syrophoenician woman who was possessed by a demon, are exor-

The exorcism in this Sunday is more subtle than Jesus freeing the Syrophoenician woman's daughter from the grips of a demon. When Jesus heals the deaf and mute man in this coming Sunday's Gospel, the Gospel tells us, Jesus put "his fingers into the man's ears and touched his tongue with spittle. Then looking up to heaven he sighed; and he said to him, 'Ephphatha,' that is, 'Be opened.' And his ears were opened, and the ligament of his tongue was loosened and he spoke clearly." (Mark 7:33-35). The loosening of the man's tongue implies the loosening of the man from the grip of the Devil.

Jesus, through his touch and word, brings the man into the hearing and speaking world, which would unequivocally enable to thrive more in his relationships with others. From a spiritual perspective, the man may well represent all believers. Apart from God, we are 'deaf' to the Word of life spoken to us by God. By opening our ears, Jesus gives us the capacity to be transformed by His life-giving word, and by loosening our tongue, enables us to join the community of faith in proclaiming that Jesus "has done all things well!" (Mark 7:37).

Good News about Our Church


Father Peter Dillon, the Vicar of Administration for the Archdiocese of Brisbane, has given us the go ahead to build our church. We have been weighing up the pros and cons of building it on the 10 000m² of land owned by the Archdiocese of Brisbane, which is where the current Kindergarten is located. There seems to be a lot more challenges than advantages in building the church in this location. So, we are trying to swap this block of land with a parcel of land located on the right of the main gates as we drive into the St Benedict's precinct.

Once we have secured this parcel of land, we will contact the Architect to undertake an initial 'feasibility' report which will cost **\$5000**. This will provide for Consultation, Concept Development, and the sketching of the concept to allow our builders to price-up the construction.

Please know that the \$100 Raffles that we are having will be contributing directly to the above architect fees.

Also, now that we are moving towards building a church, please contribute to our Building Fund if you are not already doing so. We have Direct Debit and Credit Card forms for the Building Fund available on the welcome desk at our Mass Centre.

SYNOD24: I Am Making All Things New



Synod24 is a gathering of 150 people who represent the broad diversity of the Brisbane Archdiocese and will take place over two sessions, one in September and one in October. Synod Membership will include parish representatives from each Deanery, laity who work with social justice organisations, young people, leaders and members of multicultural communities, representatives from church agencies and organisations, religious and Clergy. A full list of Synod Members will be published in the lead up to SYNOD24.

This gathering (synod) is a little different to an ordinary meeting or conference, as it pays particular attention to the movement of the Holy Spirit. Often when a group of people come together only some voices are heard.

This is often due to many things such as time constraints, confidence, some people having lots of things to say and some people preferring to focus on listening rather than responding. In SYNOD24, discussions will take place around a round table and designed to give **equal time** to each group member to speak **without** interruption. Time is then given for each member of the group to share what they heard others say. This gives the Holy Spirit the opportunity to speak through each person at the table. It means that space is provided for many different stories, perspectives, experiences, ideas, questions, and challenges to be heard. Most importantly, it requires each person to actively listen with an open heart, so that they are able to reflect back what they heard the Holy Spirit say through other people.

It is from this place of openness to the perspectives of others, and to the Holy Spirit, that the Synod Members are able to genuinely discuss, debate and then vote on actions related to eight areas of church faith, life and mission. These areas, that have come out of the Australian Plenary Council, are called "Decrees", and focus on the following topics:

Reconciliation Healing Wounds Receiving Gifts.

Choosing Repentance Seeking Healing

<u>Called by Christ Sent Forth As Missionary Disciples</u> <u>Witnessing to the Equal Dignity of Women and Men</u>

Communion in Grace Sacrament to the World

Formation and Leadership for Mission and Ministry

At the Service of Communion, Participation and Mission: Governance Integral Ecology and Conversion for the Sake of Our Common Home.

A Synod is a gathering of God's people. So, it can be a gathering that includes bishops and pastors and people who run parish groups and people who just sit in the pews. Financially Supporting Our St Benedict's Parish

To everyone who actively contributes financially to the life of our St Benedict's Parish. Thank you! Without you we would not be able to operate as a parish.

We know that the only stable and recurring income that our parish receives is from the support of our Planned Giving Program. At present, we are not receiving enough income from our Planned Giving to meet the financial cost of running the parish.

There is a need to increase our collections by \$2000 a week inorder-to plug the gap when we are no longer eligible to receive the current level of subsidies from the Archdiocese, which will cease in 2024. Also, as I have said, after a church is built there will be additional operating costs such as insurance, maintenance, utility bills etc.

Please, I am asking every parishioner to commit some of your TREASURE and help make our dream become a reality. Our Parish Pledge Card is available at the Mass centre; asking everyone to commit to the Planned Giving Program. If you are already in the Planned Giving Program, we are asking you to at least continue and if possible increase your financial support. 500 people on average attend Mass each week and we have 83 families that contribute to the Parish through the Parish Planned Giving Program.

If you are not yet part of our Planned Giving Program, then please join and make a commitment to our Parish. There are three (3) options to financially contribute to the running of the parish. These are:
