The Greatest Commandment is to Love

In Mark's Gospel, the day after Jesus enters Jerusalem riding on a donkey, He purges (cleanses) the Jewish Temple. Understandably, this does not go down well with the Jewish religious authorities. So, four controversies (debates/arguments) between Jesus and the Jewish religious authorities ensue. With the fourth and final controversy being this coming Sunday's Gospel.

The relatively friendly controversy we hear in the Gospel is between Jesus and a Scribe discussing the greatest commandment. Jesus makes it very clear that the greatest commandment is "to love God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength" (Mark 29-30). Here, Jesus is quoting a prayer know as the Shema (this Hebrew for "listen"). This is a direct quote from the Book of Deuteronomy 6:4b-5, which is recited morning and evening by observant Jews then and now.

Jesus then names a second commandment, this time quoting the Book of Leviticus, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Lev 19:18). It is very important to note that loving God is first. If we love God, then we will know that God fully loves and values us, and, as such, will have a healthy love for ourselves and others.

Good questions to ask are "How do I like to be loved? And what do I really want from another person?" Perhaps we want understanding, tolerance, loyalty, compassion, and to be treated with dignity. Essentially, what is being required when we place the second commandment alongside the first is that God's love, which we have received as a free gift, be returned not only to God, but to all others.

Meeting for the Building of Our Church

Renae and I met on Tuesday afternoon on the St Benedict's site with Father Peter Dillon, the Vicar of Administration for the Archdiocese of Brisbane, and Patrick Lane-Mullins, the Director of Building and Property for the Archdiocese of Brisbane, to discuss the building of our church. There are two immediate actions which need to be taken after this meeting.

Firstly, Father Peter and Patrick will meet within the next three weeks with a representative from Brisbane Catholic Education seeking to swap the 10 000m² block of land owned by the Archdiocese of Brisbane, where the current Kindergarten and lower College Carpark are located, with a 7 $000m^2$ parcel of land located on the right of the main gates as we drive into the St Benedict's precinct. I will certainly be informing you of the outcome of this meeting.

Secondly, Father Peter has asked me to meet with our Finance Council to see to size of the loan we can borrow to contribute towards the building of our church. Given that there are many growth areas in the Archdiocese of Brisbane, many churches will need to be built. The Archdiocese of Brisbane cannot fund these churches, so as the community we need to contribute, and then look at how we could source the remaining funds needed for the building of the church. Once I meet with the Finance Council, we will communicate with you the requirements needed to pay off the loan we will be acquiring for the church. This will require increased regular Direct Debits and Credit Card Payments into our Building Fund.

So please contribute to our Building Fund if you are not already doing so. We have Direct Debit and Credit Card forms for the Building Fund available on the welcome desk at our Mass Centre, or please contact the Parish Office for any details you may require.

All Souls Day Mass – Our Memorial Mass (Saturday November 2 at 9am)

All are invited to celebrate our Memorial Mass remembering the souls of our loved ones on Saturday November 2 at 9am. We especially invite those who have lost a loved one this year to participate in this Mass. This will unequivocally help with healing.

All Saints Day (November 1) and All Souls Day (November 2)

November 1 is marked annually in the Catholic liturgical calendar as a day to remember and venerate saints from around the world and throughout history- not only those known and canonised, but also all unknown as well.

In the 4th century, All Saints' Day traditions served to honour the great number of individuals martyred for their faith during the persecutions in the late Roman Empire. It was during the 8th century that Pope Gregory III declared that all saints be remembered on November 1.

All Saints' Day is an opportune time to consider the example saints offer us today and to reflect on how we can imitate their holiness. As Pope Benedict XVI remarked in 2011, All Saints' Day calls us "to see the Church... as Christ wanted it, that is, as the communion of saints"

All Souls' Day follows All Saints' Day on November 2, when Catholics remember, pray and offer Mass for the souls in Purgatory, that they may be purified and attain the Beatific Vision."

Sad News for Brisbane, Good News for Broome

POPE Francis has appointed Brisbane auxiliary Bishop Tim Norton as the third Bishop of Broome. This is indeed good news for Broome, but sad news for Brisbane, where Bishop Tim has been auxiliary Bishop being ordained by Archbishop Coleridge at St Stephen's Cathedral on February 22, 2022.

Not long after becoming our auxiliary Bishop, Bishop Tim joined us here at St Benedict's for our Rite of Election, where twelve of our catechumens were officially elected to become fully initiated in the Catholic Church. During this celebration Bishop Tim impressed us all with his humility and love, which makes him a wonderful Bishop and person.

Our Archbishop, Archbishop Mark said the appointment "is good news for Broome, even if it will be a loss for Brisbane where Bishop Tim will be much missed. The Diocese of Broome has been very troubled in recent times, and Bishop Tim has the gifts and experience to take the process of healing and renewal begun by the Apostolic Administrator, Bishop Michael Morrissey, into a new phase. Bishop Tim is a missionary by vocation, and he will be able to draw upon the resources of the Divine Word Missionaries who are already a presence in the diocese. I am deeply grateful for all that Bishop Tim has brought to the Archdiocese of Brisbane in his time among us; and I join many others in praying for him as he prepares for this new and challenging mission."




Enrolments for Sacramental Programs 2024 are now Closed.
