Salvation through Utter Dependence on God

A very good friend of mine, who suffers from mental illness, takes medication that enables him to be well. When he first started taking this medication, however, he thought it was actually curing his illness. After a couple of months, he thought he was fully cured, so he stopped taking the medication. Unfortunately, he wasn't cured. He got sicker than ever, and nearly died from attempting to take his own life.

This experience made my friend come to realise that he was DEPENDENT on the medication to be well, mentally.

In this coming Sunday's gospel, Jesus gives us an example of our dependence on God. In referring to the man detaching himself from his great wealth, Jesus said, "for men it is impossible, but not for God, because everything is possible for God" (Mark 10:27).

Just like my friend, who is dependent on his medication to keep him well, mentally, we are all utterly dependent on God to live life well. Our salvation, that is, our eternal well-being, is totally dependent on God. So, we need to include God in our lives, always and everywhere. Or as Jesus and St Paul tells us time and time again, we need to pray always.

If we pray effectively, and that is, if we listen to Jesus and do as Jesus asks us to do, then from there all our good works will flow. Like Jesus, we are called to look at each other with love, no matter who the other person is or what they have done. When we do this, when we put on Christ and love all people. unconditionally, then we will feast on the rich food and fine drink in the God's wonderful kingdom forever.

Good News about Our Church

Father Peter Dillon, the Vicar of Administration for the Archdiocese of Brisbane, has given us the go ahead to build our church. We have been weighing up the pros and cons of building it on the 10 000m² of land owned by the Archdiocese of Brisbane, which is where the current Kindergarten is located. There seems to be a lot more challenges than advantages in building the church in this location. So, we are trying to swap this block of land with a parcel of land located on the right of the main gates as we drive into the St Benedict's precinct.

Once we have secured this parcel of land, we will contact the Architect to undertake an initial 'feasibility' report which will cost **\$5000**. This will provide for Consultation, Concept Development, and the sketching of the concept to allow our builders to price-up the construction.

Please know that the **\$100 Raffles** that we are having will be contributing directly to the above architect fees.

Also, now that we are moving towards building a church, please contribute to our Building Fund if you are not already doing so. We have Direct Debit and Credit Card forms for the Building Fund available on the welcome desk at our Mass Centre.

SYNOD24: I Am Making All Things New

Synod24 is a gathering of 150 people who represent the broad diversity of the Brisbane Archdiocese and will take place over two sessions, one in September and one in October. Synod Membership will include parish representatives from each Deanery, laity who work with social justice organisations, young people, leaders and members of multicultural communities, representatives from church agencies and organisations, religious and Clergy. A full list of Synod Members will be published in the lead up to SYNOD24.

This gathering (synod) is a little different to an ordinary meeting or conference, as it pays particular attention to the movement of the Holy Spirit. Often when a group of people come together only some voices are heard. This is often due to many things such as time constraints, confidence, some people having lots of things to say and some people preferring to focus on listening rather than responding. In SYNOD24, discussions will take place around a round table and designed to give **equal time** to each group member to speak **without** interruption. Time is then given for each member of the group to share what they heard others say. This gives the Holy Spirit the opportunity to speak through each person at the table. It means that space is provided for many different stories, perspectives, experiences, ideas, questions, and challenges to be heard. Most importantly, it requires each person to actively listen with an open heart, so that they are able to reflect back what they

Integral Ecology and Conversion for the Sake of Our Common Home.

A Synod is a gathering of God's people. So, it can be a gathering that includes bishops and pastors and people who run parish groups and people who just sit in the pews. Caboolture Neighbourhood Centre:- will once again host a **Car Maintenance Workshop** held on Saturday 19th October from 10am to 12pm in the St Benedict's Primary School Hall and car park. With only 5 cars available, please contact Luisa (CNHC) to book on 54324220 or email <u>cams@caboolturenhc.com.au</u>. More than one person per car is allowed, so think about getting together a group of several people for your car.

Unfortunately, the concept of a **Neighbourhood Centre (NHC) for Mango Hill, North Lakes and Griffin,** was not supported, instead communication saying that we have the ability to obtain services from the existing Kallangur NHC.
