Jesus and His Disciples - On the Way to the Cross

On previous Sundays we have heard Jesus and His disciples journeying on the way from Galilee to Jerusalem to celebrate the feast of the Jewish Passover. This has been more than a journey from north to south, this journey has also been an inner journey.

Jesus has been teaching His disciples the meaning of discipleship. And as we have seen, the disciples have been very slow learners. To make the point that the disciples are slow to see, Mark's Gospel uses two miracle stories to frame their journey to Jerusalem. Both these miracle stories are about Jesus healing a person who is blind.

This is the writer's way of saying that the story of the journey from Galilee to Jerusalem is also a story about seeing and not seeing. The disciples spectacularly fail to see what Jesus is talking about each of the three times He says that in Jerusalem He will suffer grievously, be executed, and on the third day rise again. The idea of a suffering Messiah who will be executed as a criminal is beyond the disciples comprehension.

In today's Gospel we meet Bartimaeus, who persistently yells out to Jesus twice saying, "Son of David, Jesus, have pity on me." Jesus responds with the very deep question, "What do you want me to do for you?" Bartimaeus says, "Rabbuni, help me to see again." Jesus heals to man and says, "Go, your faith has saved you."

Faith is not blind faith. Faith is not opposed to science and reason. Faith reaches beyond science and reason, but never opposes it. Faith is trust. In today's Gospel Bartimaeus trusts Jesus, and it is that trust in Jesus that saves him.

Faith is also a new way of seeing things. Bartimaeus wants to not only physically see, but he wants to see the very reason why we exist. And being healed of both his physical and spiritual blindness, Bartimaeus immediately follows Jesus on the way. The way to Jesus' cross and Resurrection, the way to true life.

CS Lewis describes beautifully the kind of sight we seek. The sight that is transformative. He says, "I believe in Christianity as I believe the sun has risen...not only because I see it, but by it I see everything else."

So, let us make our own the prayer of Bartimaeus, "Rabbuni, let me see again."

All Souls Day Mass - Our Memorial Mass (Saturday November 2 at 9am)

All Saints Day (November 1) and All Souls Day (November 2)

November 1 is marked annually in the Catholic liturgical calendar as a day to remember and venerate saints from around the world and throughout history— not only those known and canonised, but also all unknown as well.

In the 4th century, All Saints' Day traditions served to honour the great number of individuals martyred for their faith during the persecutions in the late Roman Empire. It was during the 8th century that Pope Gregory III declared that all saints be remembered on November 1.

All Saints' Day is an opportune time to consider the example saints offer us today and to reflect on how we can imitate their holiness. As Pope Benedict XVI remarked in 2011, All Saints' Day calls us "to see the Church... as Christ wanted it, that is, as the communion of saints".

All Souls' Day follows All Saints' Day on November 2, when Catholics remember, pray and offer Mass for the souls in Purgatory, that they may be purified and attain the Beatific Vision "

While no longer Holy Days of Obligation in Australia (http://cathnews.acu.edu.au/108/103.php), All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day mark two very special celebrations for Catholics.

Most parishes in the Archdiocese of Brisbane will be marking these days but if possible please check with your local parish office for the precise Mass times.

For those working or travelling into the city the Cathedral of St Stephen will be celebrating Mass at the following times:

All Saints Day: Friday 1 November 9am. All Souls Day: Saturday 2 November 9am

Bishop Tim's New Appointment -Sad News for Brisbane, Good News for Broome

POPE Francis has appointed Brisbane auxiliary Bishop Tim Norton as the third Bishop of Broome. This is indeed good news for Broome, but sad news for Brisbane, where Bishop Tim has been auxiliary Bishop being ordained by Archbishop Coleridge at St Stephen's Cathedral on February 22, 2022.

Not long after becoming our auxiliary Bishop, Bishop Tim joined us here at St Benedict's for our Rite of Election, where twelve of our catechumens were officially elected to become fully initiated in the Catholic Church. During this celebration Bishop Tim impressed us all with his humility and love, which makes him a wonderful Bishop and person.

Our Archbishop, Archbishop Mark said the appointment "is good news for Broome, even if it will be a loss for Brisbane where Bishop Tim will be much missed. The Diocese of Broome has been very troubled in recent times, and Bishop Tim has the gifts and experience to take the process of healing and renewal begun by the Apostolic Administrator, Bishop Michael Morrissey, into a new phase. Bishop Tim is a missionary by vocation, and he will be able to draw upon the resources of the Divine Word Missionaries who are already a presence in the diocese. I am deeply grateful for all that Bishop Tim has brought to the Archdiocese of Brisbane in his time among us; and I join many others in praying for him as he prepares for this new and challenging mission."

Thank you for all you have done for us Bishop Tim. You will be missed!

Good News about Our Church

Father Peter Dillon, the Vicar of Administration for the Archdiocese of Brisbane, has given us the go ahead to build our church. We have been weighing up the pros and cons of building it on the 10 000m² of land owned by the Archdiocese of Brisbane, which is where the current Kindergarten is located. There seems to be a lot more challenges than advantages in building the church in this location. So, we are trying to swap this block of land with a parcel of land located on the right of the main gates as we drive into the St Benedict's precinct.

Once we have secured this parcel of land, we will contact the Architect to undertake an initial 'feasibility' report which will cost **\$5000**. This will provide for Consultation, Concept Development, and the sketching of the concept to allow our builders to price-up the construction.

Please know that the **\$100 Raffles** that we are having will be contributing directly to the above architect fees.

Also, now that we are moving towards building a church, please contribute to our Building Fund if you are not already doing so. We have Direct Debit and Credit Card forms for the Building Fund available on the welcome desk at our Mass Centre.



Financially Supporting Our St Benedict's Parish

To everyone who actively contributes financially to the life of our St Benedict's Parish. Thank you! Without you we would not be able to operate as a parish.

We know that the only stable and recurring income that our parish receives is from the support of our Planned Giving Program. At present, we are not receiving enough income from our Planned Giving to meet the financial cost of running the parish.

There is a need to increase our collections by \$2000 a week inorder-to plug the gap when we are no longer eligible to receive the current level of subsidies from the Archdiocese, which will cease in 2024. Also, as I have said, after a church is built there will be additional operating costs such as insurance, maintenance, utility bills etc.

Please, I am asking every parishioner to commit some of your TREASURE and help make our dream become a reality. Our Parish Pledge Card is available at the Mass centre; asking everyone to commit to the Planned Giving Program. If you are already in the Planned Giving Program, we are asking you to at least continue and if possible increase your financial support. 500 people on average attend Mass each week and we have 83 families that contribute to the Parish through the Parish Planned Giving Program.

If you are not yet part of our Planned Giving Program, then please join and make a commitment to our Parish. There are three (3) options to financially contribute to the running of the parish. These are:

- 1. Direct Debit or 2. Credit Card or 3. Giving Envelopes On this Pledge Card we will have an opportunity to support both:
