#### Prepare the Way of the Lord

John the Baptist features prominently at the beginning of all four Gospels. In the Gospel of Luke we have a masterpiece of writing that communicates Jesus' mission of saving all people as the completion of all of God's previous saving missions.

In Luke's Gospel for this coming Sunday, John the Baptist is the fulfilment of Isaiah 40:3-5. This quote from Isaiah predicts God saving the people of Judah from Babylonian rule, which eventually comes fruition, and is seen as one of the greatest rescue missions of all time in Jewish history.

According to Luke, in referring to John the Baptist as forerunner of Jesus, "a voice cries in the wilderness: Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight. Every valley will be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, winding ways will be straightened and rough roads made smooth. And all flesh shall see the salvation of God." (Luke 3:4-6).

Luke is masterful in seamlessly joining the story of Jesus into Israel's story. Luke assures all readers that Israel's story has come to its true consummation in the death and resurrection of Jesus, and in the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the community of Jesus' followers.

According to Luke, John the Baptist is the curtain raiser to the rescue mission of Jesus the Anointed One, against the backdrop of one of the greatest rescue missions in Jewish history, the return from Babylon. God is once again decisively entering human history in this time and place, but now for the greatest rescue mission of all – the salvation of the world.

#### The Second Rite of Reconciliation - Wednesday December 18 at 7pm

Jesus has given us a beautiful sacrament to assist us in preparing the way of the Lord and making His paths straight through the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

We will be having a **Second Rite of Reconciliation** on **Wednesday December 18 at 7pm in our worship space.** This will be a very good opportunity for us to eliminate any blockages in our lives that are preventing us from receiving Jesus more fully into our lives. Like all our celebrations, especially Sacraments, everyone is encouraged and welcome to participate in this healing sacrament.

#### Anointing (Healing) Mass – Friday December 13

On Friday December 13, we will be celebrating an Anointing (Healing) Mass at 9am. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, like all our sacraments, was instituted by Jesus and proclaimed by St James. It is administered by anointing with blessed oil accompanied by prayer.

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick can be received by any baptised person who has reached the age of reason and is in need of physical, mental or spiritual healing. This rite is one way in which the Church continues the healing ministry of Jesus. The healing offered by this anointing is forgiveness of sins, hope and inner peace, sometimes physical healing, and an assurance of God's steadfast love and care. All are welcome!

#### The Season of Advent - Preparing for the Coming of the Lord

This coming Sunday is the Second Sunday of Advent, which marks the start of our new liturgical year. Advent is not about parties, shopping, Santa, decorations, cards and stressing out. It is more about preparing ourselves to receive Jesus into our lives more deeply. The St Benedict's Parish Office will be closed for a Christmas and New Year break from 12pm Tuesday 24th December 2024 & reopen on Monday 3rd February 2025 at 8.30am.

To mark this special season, we are making two changes to our Sunday Masses during Advent. Firstly, each week we are going to sing the hymn "Come, Emmanuel" as the Processional hymn, with the refrain being sung again after the Penitential Act. Then secondly, music will be played continuously while the Prayers of the Faithful are read, and after each prayer, there will be a sung call and a sung response. This is a beautiful way of reminding us that we are in the Advent season preparing ourselves to joyfully receive the One we love more deeply into our hearts when He comes.

#### Advent Prayer Group - Sunday Mornings During Advent

The Nativity of our Lord is one of our most important feasts. To enhance our Christmas experience as people of faith, our Prayer Network will be facilitating an **Advent Prayer Group** on the Sundays of Advent. Our Advent resource is **HOPE Reigns**, which is available at our weekend Masses for \$6. The sessions will not go any longer than one hour, and you are more than welcome to come and join in any of these sessions in the lead up to Christmas. The session times are *held in person after the 8.30am Mass on the following Sunday's:*

#### The Children's Rosary

#### The Children's Choir – Leading our Christmas Carols and Christmas Vigil Mass

We are calling all children in our St Benedict's Parish to join the Children's Choir, who will come together for rehearsals after our Sunday 8:30am Mass on the Third and Fourth Sundays of Advent (December 15 and 22).

Our Children's Choir will be leading our Christmas Carols at 5:30pm on Christmas Eve (December 24). They will then continue to lead us in the Christmas hymns sung during our Christmas Vigil Mass at 6pm,

All children in the parish are very welcome, and encourage, to join this beautiful choir.

#### Meeting for the Building of Our Church

As I have mentioned previously I met with Father Peter Dillon, the Vicar of Administration for the Archdiocese of Brisbane, and Patrick Lane-Mullins, the Director of Building and Property for the Archdiocese of Brisbane, to discuss the building of our church. There are two immediate actions which need to be taken after this meeting.

Firstly, Father Peter and Patrick will meet with a representative from BCE seeking to swap the 10 000m<sup>2</sup> block of land owned by the Archdiocese of Brisbane, where the current Kindy and lower College Carpark are located, with a 7 000m<sup>2</sup> parcel of land located on the right of the main gates as we drive into the St Benedict's precinct.

Secondly, the Parish needs to contribute towards the cost of building, and then look at how we could source the remaining funds needed for the building of the church. This will require an immediate increase in regular Giving contributions into our Building Fund.

So please contribute to our Building Fund if you are not already doing so. We have Direct Debit and Credit Card forms available at our Mass Centre, or please contact the Parish Office for any details you may require.

#### **Financially Supporting Our St Benedict's Parish**

To everyone who actively contributes financially to the life of our St Benedict's Parish. Thank you! Without you we would not be able to operate as a parish.

We know that the only stable and recurring income that our parish receives is from the support of our Planned Giving Program. At present, we are not receiving enough income from our Planned Giving to meet the financial cost of running the parish.

There is a need to increase our collections by \$2000 a week inorder-to plug the gap when we are no longer eligible to receive the current level of subsidies from the Archdiocese, which will cease in 2024. Also, as I have said, after a church is built there will be additional operating costs such as insurance, maintenance, utility bills etc.

Please, I am asking every parishioner to commit some of your TREASURE and help make our dream become a reality. Our Parish Pledge Card is available at the Mass centre; asking everyone to commit to the Planned Giving Program. If you are already in the Planned Giving Program, we are asking you to at least continue and if possible increase your financial support. 500 people on average attend Mass each week and we have 83 families that contribute to the Parish through the Parish Planned Giving Program.

If you are not yet part of our Planned Giving Program, then please join and make a commitment to our Parish. There are three (3) options to financially contribute to the running of the parish. These are:

- 1. Direct Debit or 2. Credit Card or 3. Giving Envelopes On this Pledge Card we will have an opportunity to support both:
- The Parish (Running) Collection, which supports the expenses incurred for the day-to-day, efficient and effective running of the parish. (Leases, Wages, Supplies)
- \* The Building (Church) Donation, which supports our purchasing/building of assets, which include our future church, offices, and an adult faith formation/gathering space.

If we want the Archdiocese to contribute significantly to the building of our church, then we need to show that we are financially viable as a parish.
